**A RESOLUTION OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE IN SUPPORT
OF AMENDMENT 1 ON THE NOVEMBER 4TH, 2014 GENERAL
ELECTION BALLOT AND ENCOURAGING SUPPORT OF THE SAME.**

WHEREAS: The Greene County Legislative Body supports the sovereignty of the People through their elected representatives to direct public policy in matters of public interest at all levels of government; and

WHEREAS: In 2000 the Supreme Court of Tennessee in its decision in Planned Parenthood v. Sundquist removed from the people of Tennessee the power to enforce common-sense regulations and laws concerning the practice of abortion in this State; and

WHEREAS: Other states, including states surrounding Tennessee, have passed laws concerning abortions and abortion facilities such as laws requiring informed consent, licensing of facilities, health inspections of facilities, and short waiting periods. These laws have not been overturned by the Federal courts; and

WHEREAS: Tennessee has been rendered unable to enforce such laws and regulations because of the case cited above and subsequent cases, Tennessee has become an abortion destination ranking third in the nation in the percentage of abortions performed for women who have traveled here from other states for that purpose; and

WHEREAS: Tennessee Constitutional Law is currently such that overturning Roe v. Wade at the Federal level would not change anything about the practice of abortion in Tennessee and is such that pro-abortion rights organizations refer to Tennessee's Constitutional Law as more favorable to their point of view than Federal Constitutional Law; and

WHEREAS: There will appear on to the November 4, 2014 General Election Ballot an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Tennessee which, if approved by the voters of Tennessee, will nullify the effect of the ruling in Planned Parenthood v. Sundquist and return the power to the people of this state, acting through their elected representatives, to regulate the abortion industry in this state within the limits set forth by Federal Constitutional Law. Amendment 1 as it will appear on the November 4th General Election Ballot reads as follows:

“Nothing in this Constitution secures or protects a right to abortion or requires the funding of an abortion. The people retain the right through their elected state representatives and state senators to enact, amend, or repeal statutes regarding abortion, including, but not limited to, circumstances or pregnancy resulting from rape or incest or when necessary to save the life of the mother.”

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 21st day of July, 2014, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative that Greene County hereby expresses its support for the proposed Constitutional Amendment 1, as appearing on the November 4, 2014 General Election Ballot and as recited herein, and encourages its passage.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING AN ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING AND REHABILITATION PILOT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Greene County has long faced issues with overcrowding at the Greene County Detention Center, and,

WHEREAS, after much investigation as well as discussions with other counties, the Jail and Workhouse Committee has determined that the adoption of an Alternative Sentencing and Rehabilitation Pilot program that allows certain qualified offenders to be supervised and monitored utilizing ankle bracelets should be established for Greene County subject to the approval of the Criminal and General Sessions Judges serving Greene County; and

WHEREAS, this pilot program would be established for six (6) months and would only be available to non-violent criminal offenders who would be permitted to participate in the program at the Judge's discretion and who would be totally responsible for any and all costs of the program during the initial pilot period; and

WHEREAS, it would appear that the implementation of the program would provide sufficient safe guards for the community by monitoring not only the location of the offender but would also monitor and identify possible drug use or abuse by individuals wearing the ankle bracelets, would reduce the cost of incarceration of convicted criminal offenders, would save tax dollars in reducing the costs to house non-violent offenders who qualify for the program, avoid paying medical expenses for individuals who are released under the program, and would provide an opportunity for non-violent criminal offenders to remain with their family, remain employed and further assist those non-violent criminal offenders in rehabilitation.

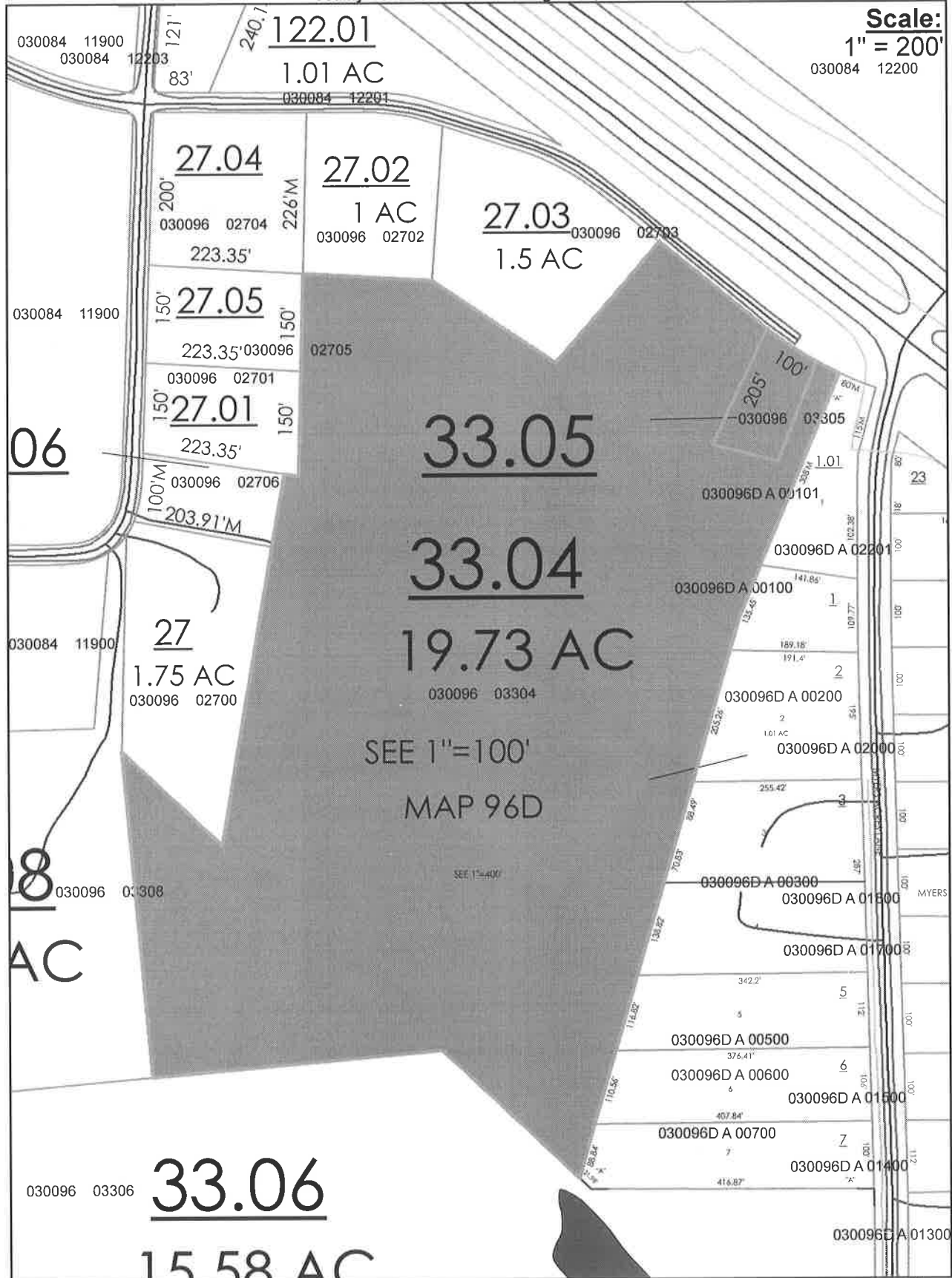

Staff Comments:

The property owner proposes to rezone 20.19 acres for development of apartments. The proposed zone of R-2 Medium Density Residential District will permit two-family and multi-family units subject to meeting the area regulations and requirements of the R-2 zoning resolution requirements. The immediate predominant land use is agricultural, residential, business and industrial. The immediate abutting zoning classifications is A-1 General Agriculture District and R-1 Low Density Residential District. An industrial use is nearby the subject property. The site is located on Baughard Hill Road that connects to Radersidetrack Road (Collector Street) that connects to W Andrew Johnson Highway (Arterial Street). Public water and sewer is available to the property. The proposed area is located in Mosheim's Urban Growth boundary. The proposed rezoning is in character with the general vicinity and immediate vicinity land uses, which are predominantly agricultural and residential in nature; therefore staff recommends approval of the rezoning request.

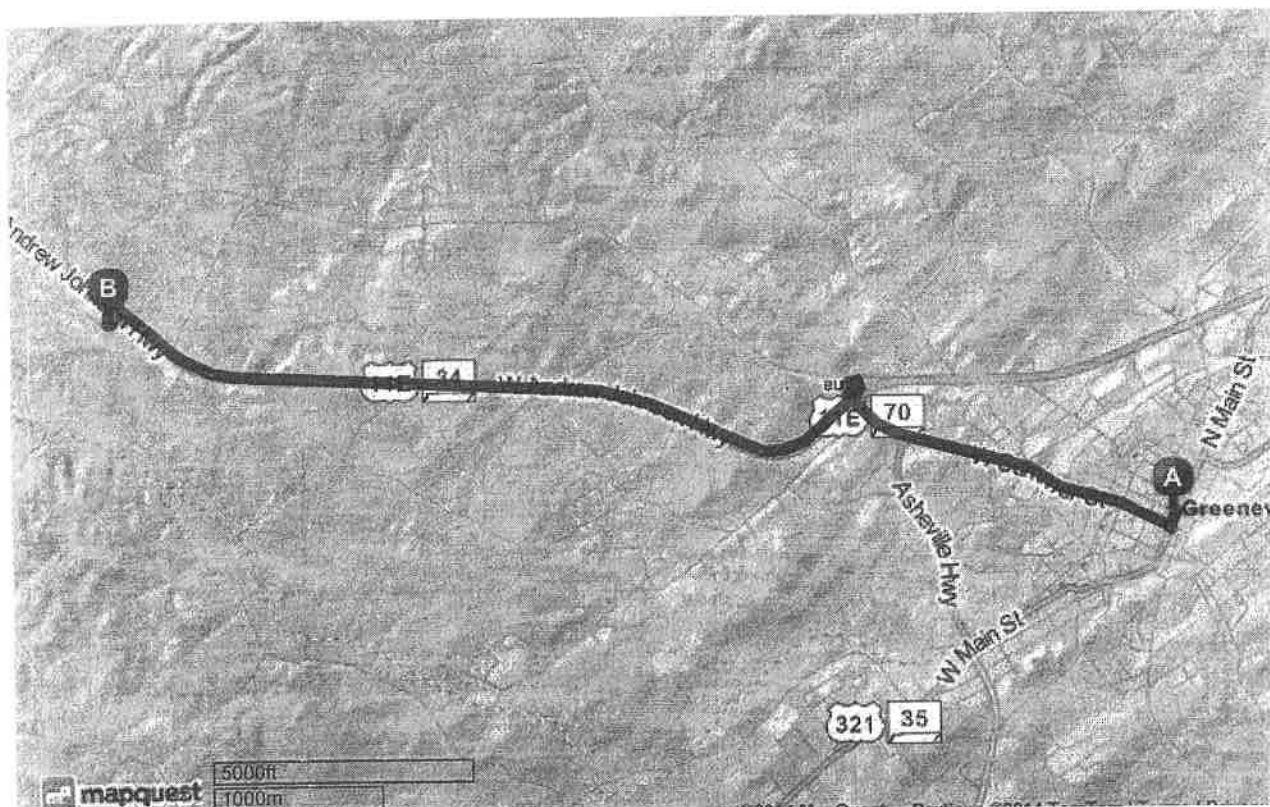

WHEREAS, after approval of the charter commission by the voters of Greene County as provided for in T.C.A. § 5-1-204, such charter commission held its organizational meeting on May 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the charter commission has met on a semi-monthly basis on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of each month since its initial meeting; and

WHEREAS, the charter commission has determined that it may take an additional nine (9) months to file their proposed charter and have requested that the Greene County Legislative Body grant them an additional nine months from the end of their original nine (9) month term of February, 2015 to prepare and file the charter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 18th day of August, 2014, a quorum being present, a majority voting in the affirmative that the charter commission be granted and additional nine (9) months to prepare and file their proposed charter extending the filing deadline from February, 2015 until November, 2015.



RESOLUTION TO ASK THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO REPEAL THE PROVISIONS OF T.C.A. § 8-24-102(d),(e), AND (g), T.C.A. 8-23-103, T.C.A. 16-15-5003, AND T.C.A. 2-12-208 (a) AS IT RELATES TO THE MINIMUM COMPENSATION AND MANDATORY SALARY ADJUSTMENTS FOR COUNTY OFFICIALS

WHEREAS, the General Assembly by enacting T.C.A. § 8-24-102(d),(e) and (g), T.C.A. §8-23-103, T.C.A. §16-15-5003, and T.A.C. §2-12-208(a) imposed minimum salaries and mandated increases in annual salaries of various county officials including assessors of property, county clerks, clerks and masters of chancery courts, clerks of probate courts, clerks of circuit courts, clerks of general sessions courts, clerks of criminal courts, juvenile court clerks, county trustees, registers of deeds, administrators of elections, sheriffs, chief administrative officers of the county highway department, county mayors, and general sessions judges.; and

WHEREAS, in view of the dismal economic conditions overall in the State of Tennessee and in particular in Greene County, the Greene County Legislative Body strongly object to the “minimum compensation” as well as the mandatory salary adjustments for county officials and county officers listed in paragraph one of this resolution and mandated by state law that compel county governments to pay its county officials compensation at the mandated minimum salary levels and require annual adjustments without any input from the County Government or consideration of the economic conditions within the County; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body’s opposition to the minimum salaries and mandatory adjustments is based not only on the practical financial concerns for this County as well as other county governments throughout the State, but also with the fundamental disagreement that the State Legislature is better able to determine a just compensation for its county officials than the county legislative body; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body further expresses its disagreement and actual bewilderment in the logic of legislation that joins together the annual salary adjustments of the county officials with the State’s average annualized general increase for state employees’ compensation and/or formula utilized by the State of Tennessee.

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NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 18th day of August, 2014, a quorum being present, a majority voting in the affirmative that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Speaker of the House, our elected State Senator and State Representatives who represent Greene County in the General Assembly, and to the State of Tennessee County Commissioner Association requesting that they each sponsor and/or support legislation that would:

(1) Repeal T.C.A. § 8-24-102 (d),(e), (g), T.C.A. §8-23-103, T.C.A. §16-15-5003, and T.C.A. §2-12-208 (a) mandating minimum salaries and required annual adjustments for county officials including assessors of property, county clerks, clerks and masters of chancery courts, clerks of probate courts, clerks of circuit courts, clerks of general sessions courts, clerks of criminal courts, juvenile court clerks, county trustees and registers of deeds, administrator of elections, chief administrative officers of the county highway department, sheriff, county mayor, and general session judge.

(2) Allow each county legislative body to determine the salaries of its county officials as well as any annual adjustments for each county official based on all the relative factors that should be utilized to determine the approximate salary for each county official.

SECTION 2. That \$102,448 be appropriated to the Volunteer Fire Departments to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 3. That \$34,200 be appropriated to the Greeneville Parks and Recreation Dept. to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 4. That \$5,000 be appropriated to Kinser Park to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 5. That \$120,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County 9-1-1 Agency to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 6. That \$4,900 be appropriated to the Greeneville Emergency & Rescue Squad to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 7. That \$167,262 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to be distributed one-half for Economic Development and one-half for Tourism to promote the public welfare of Greene County, which is comprised of the amount of Hotel/Motel tax received by the County less the Trustee's Commission.

SECTION 8. That \$10,000 be appropriated to the Niswonger Performing Arts to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 9. That \$800 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to promote maintenance of certain designated directional signs within Greene County.

SECTION 10. That \$7,500 be appropriated to the Dickson-Williams Historical to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 11. That \$7,350 be appropriated to the Nathanael Greene Museum to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 12. That \$1,960 be appropriated to the Central Ballet Theatre to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 13. That \$5,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership National Amateur Intercollegiate Association's Golf Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 14. That \$5,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership Tusculm College Soccer Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 15. That \$3,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership Landair Ladies Classic Basketball Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all appropriations enumerated above are subject to the following conditions:

1. That the nonprofit organizations to which funds are appropriated shall file with the County Clerk and the disbursing officials a copy of any annual report of its business affairs and transactions and the proposed use of the county's funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Chapter 0380-2-7. Such annual report shall be prepared and certified by the chief financial officer of such nonprofit organization in accordance with Section 5-9-109©. Tennessee Code Annotated.
2. That said funds must only be used by the named nonprofit charitable organizations in furtherance of their nonprofit charitable purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Greene County.
3. That it is the expressed interest of the county commission of Greene County in providing these funds to the above named nonprofit charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0380-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-9-109, Tennessee Code Annotated, and any and all other laws which may apply to county appropriations to nonprofit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budgets approved for separate projects within the fund by the Greene County Board of Education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, T.C.A., operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, T.C.A., provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, T.C.A. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER REOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2014-2015 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal later than June 30, 2015.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2013 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2015 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2014. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 2015.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners, which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2014. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.
