WHEREAS: The Tennessee County Services Association (TCSA) holds the health and safety of its teenagers and adults as a chief concern; and

WHEREAS: Through ItCanWait.com, Facebook, text-to-pledge, tweet-to-pledge and events, more than 1.5 million people have committed to never text and drive; and

WHEREAS: 98 percent of American commuters know sending a text or email while driving is not safe; and

WHEREAS: Nearly 50 percent of commuters text while behind the wheel; and

WHEREAS: More than 40 percent of commuters who text while driving reported the activity as being a habit; and

WHEREAS: A Virginia Tech study showed those who send text messages while driving are 23 times more likely to crash; and

WHEREAS: A driver that sends a text message while driving not only jeopardizes his or her safety, but also the safety of passengers, pedestrians, and other drivers.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a majority vote of the county legislative body of Greene County, Tennessee, meeting in session on this day of August 30, 2013, that Greene County, Tennessee, does hereby affirm its support of the It Can Wait National Day of Action, the nationwide no-texting-while-driving movement and the proclamation of September 19, 2013, as "No Text On Board – Pledge Day."



RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH AN UPDATED OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM PLAN, DEVISE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR A SAFETY DIRECTOR AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SUCH PROGRAM PLAN

WHEREAS, in compliance with Public Chapter 561 of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the year 1972, the Greene County Legislative Body hereby updates the Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for our employees.

WHEREAS, due to various changes in subsequent years, it has become necessary to amend the program plan to comply with more recent state requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Greene County Legislative Body meeting in a special called session on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2013 a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that the OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH PROGRAM PLAN be and is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 1.

TITLE:

This section shall be known as "The Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan" for the employees of Greene County.

PURPOSE:

The Greene County Commission in electing to update the established Program Plan will maintain an effective and comprehensive Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for its employees and shall:

- 1) Provide a safe and healthful place and condition of employment that includes:
  - a) Top Management Commitment and Employee Involvement;
  - b) Continually analyze the worksite to identify all hazards and potential hazards;
  - c) Develop and maintain methods for preventing or controlling the existing or potential hazards; and
  - d) Train managers, supervisors, and employees to understand and deal with worksite hazards.
- 2) Acquire, maintain and require the use of safety equipment, personal protective equipment and devices reasonably necessary to protect employees.
- 3) Record, keep, preserve, and make available to the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, or persons within the Department of Labor and Workforce Development to whom such responsibilities have been delegated, adequate records of all occupational accidents and illnesses and personal injuries for proper evaluation and necessary corrective action as required.
- 4) Consult with the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development with regard to the adequacy of the form and content of records.

5) Consult with the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development, as appropriate, regarding safety and health problems which are considered to be unusual or peculiar and are such that they cannot be achieved under a standard promulgated by the State.

6) Provide reasonable opportunity for the participation of employees in the effectuation of the objectives of this Program Plan, including the opportunity to make anonymous complaints concerning conditions or practices injurious to employee safety and health.

7) Provide for education and training of personnel for the fair and efficient administration of occupational safety and health standards, and provide for education and notification of all employees of the existence of this Program Plan.

#### COVERAGE:

The provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Program Plan for the employees of Greene County shall apply to all employees of each administrative department, commission, board, division, or other agency whether part-time or full-time, seasonal or permanent.

#### STANDARDS AUTHORIZED:

The Occupational Safety and Health standards adopted by the Greene County Commission are the same as, but not limited to, the State of Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Standards promulgated, or which may be promulgated, in accordance with Section 6 of the Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1972 (T.C.A. Title 50, Chapter 3).

#### VARIANCES FROM STANDARDS AUTHORIZED:

Upon written application to the Commissioner of Labor and Workforce Development of the State of Tennessee, we may request an order granting a temporary variance from any approved standards. Applications for variances shall be in accordance with Rules of Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development Occupational Safety and Health, VARIANCES FROM OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH STANDARDS, CHAPTER 0800-01-02, as authorized by T.C.A., Title 50. Prior to requesting such temporary variance, we will notify or serve notice to our employees, their designated representatives, or interested parties and present them with an opportunity for a hearing. The posting of notice on the main bulletin board shall be deemed sufficient notice to employees.

#### ADMINISTRATION:

For the purposes of this resolution, Tim Armstrong is designated as the Safety Director of Occupational Safety and Health to perform duties and to exercise powers assigned to plan, develop, and administer this Program Plan. The Safety Director shall develop a plan of operation for the Program Plan in accordance with Rules of Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development Occupational Safety and Health, SAFETY AND HEALTH PROVISIONS FOR THE PUBLIC SECTOR, CHAPTER 0800-01-05, as authorized by T.C.A., Title 50.

#### FUNDING THE PROGRAM PLAN:

Sufficient funds for administering and staffing the Program Plan pursuant to this resolution have been made available as authorized by the Greene County Commission.



SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if any section, sub-section, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this resolution is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed separate, distinct, and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect from and after the date it shall have been passed, properly signed, certified, and has met all other legal requirements, and as otherwise provided by law, the general welfare of Greene County requiring it.

A RESOLUTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY FIXING  
THE TAX LEVY IN GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE  
FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2013

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Commissioners of Greene County, Tennessee, assembled in called session on this 30<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2013, that the combined property tax rate for Greene County Tennessee for the year beginning July 1, 2013, shall be \$1.6613 (inside) and \$1.8731 (outside), on each \$100.00 of taxable property, which is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies:

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby levied a gross receipts tax as provided by law. The proceeds of the gross receipts tax herein levied shall accrue to the General Fund.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Board of Commissioners of Greene County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Wheel Tax shall be divided between General Debt Service and Highway Funds equally.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budgets approved for separate projects within the fund by the Greene County Board of Education.

**SECTION 2.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, T.C.A., operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, T.C.A., provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

**SECTION 3.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, T.C.A. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

**SECTION 4.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

**SECTION 5.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.



**SECTION 6.** BE IT FURTHER REOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2013-2014 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal later than June 30, 2014.

**SECTION 7.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2012 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2014 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2012. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

**SECTION 8.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 2014.

**SECTION 9.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners, which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

**SECTION 10.** BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2013. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS  
OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING  
JULY 1, 2013 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2014

WHEREAS, Section 5-9-109, *Tennessee Code Annotated*, authorizes the Greene County Legislative Body to make appropriations to various nonprofit organizations; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body recognizes the various nonprofit organizations located in Greene County have great need of funds to carry on their nonprofit charitable work.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Greene County, on this the 30<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2013:

SECTION 1. That \$83,622 be appropriated to the Library to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 2. That \$102,448 be appropriated to the Volunteer Fire Departments to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 3. That \$29,400 be appropriated to the Greeneville Parks and Recreation Dept. to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 4. That \$29,400 be appropriated to Kinser Park to promote the public welfare of Greene County;

SECTION 5. That \$120,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County 9-1-1 Agency to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 6. That \$4,900 be appropriated to the Greeneville Emergency & Rescue Squad to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 7. That \$167,262 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to be distributed one-half for Economic Development and one-half for Tourism to promote the public welfare of Greene County, which is comprised of the amount of Hotel/Motel tax received by the County less the Trustee's Commission.

SECTION 8. That \$10,000 be appropriated to the Niswonger Performing Arts to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 9. That \$800 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to promote maintenance of certain designated directional signs within Greene County.



SECTION 10. That \$7,500 be appropriated to the Dickson-Williams Historical to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all appropriations enumerated above are subject to the following conditions:

1. That the nonprofit organizations to which funds are appropriated shall file with the County Clerk and the disbursing officials a copy of any annual report of its business affairs and transactions and the proposed use of the county's funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Chapter 0380-2-7. Such annual report shall be prepared and certified by the chief financial officer of such nonprofit organization in accordance with Section 5-9-109©. Tennessee Code Annotated.
2. That said funds must only be used by the named nonprofit charitable organizations in furtherance of their nonprofit charitable purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Greene County.
3. That it is the expressed interest of the county commission of Greene County in providing these funds to the above named nonprofit charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0380-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-9-109, Tennessee Code Annotated, and any and all other laws which may apply to county appropriations to nonprofit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in special called session on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2013, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative do hereby approve the above stated contributions to other agencies.
