A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE GREENE COUNTY ZONING RESOLUTION REGULATING "TINY HOMES" AND "RECREATIONAL VEHICLES" AS RESIDENCES WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body has adopted a zoning resolution establishing districts within the unincorporated territory of Greene County, Tennessee, with the intent of providing for the separation and regulation of uses to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Greene County citizens; and

WHEREAS, regulations are needed to define "tiny homes", "recreational vehicles", and similar uses, and provide for their safe use;

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body realizes that any zoning resolution must be changed from time to time to provide for the continued efficient and economic development of the county.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 17th day of July, 2017 a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative to amend the Greene County Zoning Resolution as follows:

Insert, in alphabetical order, the following definitions to ARTICLE II. <u>Definitions of terms used in ordinance:</u>

<u>Fifth wheel trailer</u>. A vehicle, mounted on wheels, designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use of such size and weight as to not require a special highway movement permit and designed to be towed by a motorized vehicle that contains a towing mechanism mounted above or forward of the tow vehicle's rear axle;

Folding camping trailer. A vehicle mounted on wheels and constructed with collapsible partial side walls that fold for towing by another vehicle and unfold at the campsite to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use.

House trailer. See mobile home.

Manufactured home. Any structure, transportable in one (1) or more sections, which, in the traveling mode, is eight (8) or more body-feet in width or forty (40) or more body-feet in length, or when erected on site, is three hundred twenty (320) or more square feet, and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities, and includes the plumbing, heating, air-conditioning and electrical systems contained therein.

<u>Mobile home</u>. Any vehicle or conveyance, not self-propelled, designed for travel upon the public highways, and designed for use as a residence, office, apartment, storehouse, warehouse, or any other similar purpose.



Motor home. A motorized vehicle designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use. The vehicle must contain at least four (4) of the following permanently installed independent life support systems which meet the National Fire Protection Association Standard for Recreational Vehicles:

- 1. A cooking facility with an on-board fuel source;
- 2. A potable water supply system that includes at least a sink, faucet, and water tank with an exterior service supply connection;
- 3. A toilet with exterior evacuation;
- 4. A gas or electric refrigerator;
- 5. A heating or air conditioning system with an on-board power or fuel source separate from the vehicle engine; or
- 6. An electric power system separate from the vehicle engine.

<u>Recreational vehicle.</u> A vehicle which is either self-propelled or towed by a consumer-owned tow vehicle, and designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use that complies with all applicable federal vehicle regulations and does not require a special-movement permit to legally use the highways; and includes but is not limited to motor homes, travel trailer, fifth wheel travel trailers, and folding camping trailers.

<u>Tiny Home</u>. A structure intended for residential use that may be built on-site or transported from a manufacturing facility, that contains cooking and sanitary facilities, the latter of which may have either permanent or temporary connections to utilities.

<u>Travel trailer</u>. A vehicle, mounted on wheels, designed to provide temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use of such size and weight as to not require a special highway movement permit when towed by a motorized vehicle; and

Insert, additional language as underlined, to ARTICLE IV. <u>Application of Regulations</u>, 401. Use:

401. Use. No building, structure or land shall hereafter be used and building or part thereof shall be erected, moved, or altered unless for a use expressly permitted by and in conformity with the regulations herein specified for the district in which it is located, <u>and provided</u> structures may only be used for their intended use.

Insert, by adding new section <u>514</u>, to ARTICLE V. <u>General Provisions:</u>

- 514. Recreational Vehicles. Recreational vehicles shall not be used for permanent living quarters and are only permitted as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, or travel use, and which must also meet the following requirements:
 - A. They may be located in a recreational park or on public land where permitted; or
 - B. On property where a home intended to provide permanent living quarters is being built, for a period not to exceed one (1) year, unless an extension is approved by the Greene County Building Commissioner; or

- C. Used as a temporary accessory dwelling on private property, for a period not to exceed 90 days, provided the unit shall not be permitted in the front yard of the principal use unless a graveled or paved area is used for parking the vehicle; and
- D. The vehicle must comply with all applicable federal vehicle regulations and does not require a special-movement permit to legally use the highways.

Revise Article VI. Use Requirements by Districts, <u>601. A-1 General Agriculture District</u>, to add the following subset <u>T. Tiny Homes</u> to <u>601.1</u>:

T. Tiny homes, as defined in 256 B, provided:

- Units must meet the minimum size requirements of the International Building Code that is in place at the time of construction.
- Those units built on-site must meet the International Building Code in effect at the time of construction.
- Out-of-county on frame tiny homes must be inspected by a Tennessee state licensed structural engineer throughout the building process. The engineer must provide all inspection reports to the Greene County Building Commissioner. A full set of plans must accompany each home. Plans must be stamped by a Tennessee state licensed structural engineer. Plans must also show all anchoring information.
- Site built homes, or manufactured tiny homes which have their wheels removed, must be situated on a permanent foundation with permanent connections to water, sewer/septic, and electric utilities.
- Homes constructed in a manufacturing facility that retain their wheels shall provide underpinning, foundations and tie-downs per structural engineers requirements.

Revise Article VI. Use Requirements by Districts, <u>601.1 A-1 General Agriculture District</u>, to add the following subset <u>U. Campgrounds</u> to <u>601.1</u>:

U. Campgrounds, provided:

- They are five (5) acres or larger in size.
- Site plans are submitted and approved by the Greene County Regional Planning Commission.
- Buffers are provided as follows:
 - A buffer area of at least fifty (50) feet in width shall be provided around the periphery of the campground.
 - b. The outer twenty-five (25) of buffer area shall contain a landscape strip planted with evergreen trees, measuring a minimum of six (6) feet in height at the time of planting, and planted in a staggered pattern at a maximum distance of ten (10) feet on center.
 - b. Information on the buffer design, and the width, height, opacity, growing period to maturity, time schedule for installation, and

responsibility for perpetual maintenance of the buffer, shall be submitted to and approved by the Enforcing Officer.

c. Proposals for alternative buffering, such as solid fencing, may be submitted to the Building Commissioner for approval.

 Access roads inside campgrounds, which shall be privately constructed and maintained, shall have a minimum of a four (4) inch rock base or asphalt.

 Each site must have adequate parking, with a minimum of two (2) parking spaces per home site.

- Setbacks for campsites are: at least of fifty (50) feet from exterior property lines, twenty (20) feet from access roads, and twenty (20) feet between camp sites.
- Campgrounds cannot create excessive noise, dust, or any other type of nuisance, unless they meet the one thousand (1,000) foot setback requirement listed in Section 601.1 (H) of the Greene County Zoning Resolution.
- Sanitation facilities must be provided that are adequate to meet the needs of the campground. Porta-Potty and/or subsurface sewage disposal systems shall comply with the requirements of the State of Tennessee, Water Resources, Division of Groundwater Protection Office (TDEC).
- Safe drinking water shall be provided via a minimum of one (1) yard hydrant for every five (5) sites. If well water is used, it must be tested and approved by TDEC.
- Campgrounds cannot be designed and used for long term permanent housing. To meet the requirements of these regulations, no more than 30 days of consecutive use is permitted by the same user, and at least seven (7) days must lapse prior to re-entry.
- The owner of the campground may construct appropriate facilities for sanitation after obtaining the relevant permits from the TDEC and the Greene County Building Commissioner.
- The Building Commissioner may inspect campgrounds at any time for compliance with zoning and building code compliance.

Insert, additional language as underlined, to Article VI. <u>Use Requirements by Districts</u>, <u>602.1(A)</u> <u>A-2</u>, <u>Agricultural-Residential District</u>, and <u>603.1(A)</u> <u>Low Density Residential District</u>, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Medical Association, the Tennessee Department of Health, Law Enforcement and Drug Enforcement Agencies and others has worked for many years to combat the opioid crisis in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, It is estimated that 1,263 Tennesseans died from opioid overdose in 2014 and that number increased by 13.8% in 2015; drug overdoses now kill more Americans each year than either automobile accidents or guns; and

WHEREAS, according to data from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, the drug overdose death rate has been alarming between 2000 and 2014, with fatal overdoses increasing by 137%, according to an article in the Wall St. Journal dated June 24, 2016.

WHEREAS, the Greene County Insurance Committee met on July 5, 2017, with Tom Jessee with the firm of Thomas C. In the past few weeks alone, the attorneys general for Ohio and Missouri, along with the district attorneys for three districts in Tennessee, filed suits against the industry; and

WHEREAS, based on those above referred findings, the employment of the law firm of Tom C. Jessee, LLC by Greene County is necessary to protect citizens and possibly reduce the burden on taxpayers of Greene County resulting from this opioid epidemic in Greene County and across Tennessee and our nation; and

AUTHORITY TO REPRESENT

RE: Greene County Commission civil suit against those legally responsible for the wrongful distribution of opioids in Greene County and damages caused thereby.

The Greene County Commission is a public corporation which may sue and plead in its own name. The Greene County Commission is vested with the power all superintendence and administration of the internal police and fiscal affairs of Greene County. A county commission only has powers expressly conferred by the Tennessee Constitution and our State Legislature, or powers reasonably and necessarily implied for exercise of those expressed powers.

The Greene County Commission hereby retains Thomas Jessee, a member of the law firm of Thomas C. Jessee, LLC d/b/a Jessee & Jessee Attorneys and Crystal Jessee d/b/a Jessee Law Office to pursue <u>all</u> civil remedies against manufacturers and all entities in the chain of distribution and responsible for the opioid epidemic which is plaguing Greene County including, but not limited to, filing a claim for public nuisance to abate the damages caused thereby. Thomas C. Jessee and Crystal G. Jessee shall serve as lead counsel.

In consideration, the Greene County Commission agrees to pay one third (33 1/3%) of the total recovery (gross) as an attorney fee whether the claim is resolved by compromise, settlement, or trial and verdict (and appeal). There is no fee if there is no recovery. The Greene County Commission acknowledges that this fee is reasonable given the anticipated time and labor required, the novelty and difficulty of the questions involved, the skill requisite to perform the legal service properly, the likelihood that the acceptance of the particular employment will preclude other employment by the lawyers, and the experience, reputation, and ability of the lawyer or lawyers performing the service.

The law firms agree to advance all necessary litigation expenses necessary to prosecute these claims including any discretionary costs that may be taxed against the Client. All such litigation expenses will be deducted from any recovery after the contingent fee is calculated. There is no reimbursement of litigation expenses if there is no recovery. The division of fees, expenses and labor between the law firms will be decided by private agreement between the law firms.

The Greene County Commission authorizes Thomas C. Jessee, LLC d/b/a Jessee & Jessee Attorneys and the Jessee Law Office to retain other counsel to participate in the just prosecution of this case. In no event will the fee charged be increased by the addition of other counsel and the division of such fees shall be determined by private agreement between the law firms. If the undersigned counsel does in fact retain other counsel to participate in the prosecution of this case, this contract will be amended to reflect the names of the counsel that will be working with the undersigned in this matter.

Thomas C. Jessee, LLC d/b/a Jessee & Jessee Attorneys and the Jessee Law Office shall keep the Greene County Commission reasonably informed about the status of the matter in a manner deemed appropriate by the Client. The Client at all times shall retain the authority to decide the disposition of the case and maintain absolute control of the litigation.

Upon conclusion of this matter, Thomas C. Jessee, LLC d/b/a Jessee & Jessee Attorneys and the Jessee Law Office shall provide the Greene County Commission with a written disbursement statement stating the outcome of the matter and, if there is a recovery, showing the remittance due to the client and the method of determination of the same before any monies are disbursed from the recovery.

Nothing in this Agreement and nothing in the Attorneys' statement to the Client may be construed as a promise or guarantee about the outcome of this matter. The Attorneys make no such promises or guarantees. The Attorneys' comments about the outcome of this matter are expressions of opinion only and the Attorneys make no guarantees as to the outcome of any litigation, settlement or trial proceedings.

Client shall cooperate with the Attorneys by provided the Attorneys with access to key employees of Greene County government including the sheriff, chief jailer, and other employees for purposes of gathering sufficient information to determine the extent of the damage incurred by the existence of the public nuisance. The Client shall also cooperate in providing information on other programs in which the Client participates concerning drug addiction which would provide the Attorneys with information that would allow them to better describe the impact of the drug addiction on Greene County and the methodology that has been approached for dealing with the same that is already in place.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budgets approved for separate projects within the fund by the Greene County Board of Education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, <u>T.C.A.</u>, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, <u>T.C.A.</u>, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, <u>T.C.A</u>. One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. The aggregate expenditures for any tem of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, <u>Tennessee Code</u> Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER REOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2016-2017 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal no later than June 30, 2018.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2016 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2018 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2016. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 2017.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners, which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2017. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.
