GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY
MONDAY, MAY 20, 2013
6:00 PM

The Greene County Legislative Body met in regular session on Monday, May 20, 2013 at the Greene County Courthouse.

Mayor Broyles called the meeting to order to transact business that is to lawfully come before this Honorable Body. Commissioner Seay led the Pledge to the Flag, followed by Prayer led by Commissioner Rollins. The Commissioners signed in on their key pads and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Bird; Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle and White were present.

Commissioner Margaret Greenway was absent. There were 20 Commissioners present and 1 absent.

PROCLAMATION

Mayor Broyles, by reading proclamations, recognized five individuals who had perfect attendance all twelve years of school. These individuals are: John Parker Mitchell, Kiela Wills, Jacob Powers, Hannah Riddle, and Mason Parham.

APPROVAL OF PRIOR MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Sauceman and seconded by Commissioner Holt to approve prior minutes. Mayor Broyles called for the Commissioners to vote on their keypads on the motion. The following vote was taken: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Hensley, Holt, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle and White voted yes. Commissioners Greenway and Hopson were absent. The vote was 19 – aye, 0 – nay, 2 – absent. The Commissioners voted in favor of the motion to approve the prior minutes.

PUBLIC HEARING

During the public hearing several people spoke concerning rezoning:

- Roberto Vasquez, co-owner of property, spoke in favor of rezoning
- Tim Tweed then answered questions from Commissioners
- Jose Vasquez, of Milburton Rd, spoke in favor of rezoning
- Jim Mercer, of McAfee Rd, spoke against rezoning
- Peggy Shelton Shaw spoke against rezoning
- Shawn Collins spoke against rezoning

Commissioner Sams then called on Ashley Head, of the Greene County Health Council. She spoke about obesity and prevention programs.

Jeannie Woolsey was then called on by Commissioner Sams. She also spoke about obesity and prevention programs.

Commissioner Sauceman called on Larry Parman, of Rolling Hills Rd. He spoke about the school system budget and the newspaper article related to it.

REPORTS

There were reports from the Solid Waste Dept. and Committee minutes in the package.

OLD BUSINESS

With three presentations having been made about the Jail, Mayor Broyles stated that County Attorney Roger Woolsey said the County Commission could take action under old business without a resolution. Mayor Broyles read a letter from Beth Ashe about the jail recertification. Mayor Broyles then called on Sheriff Steve Burns. Sheriff Burns spoke about the letter and recommendation needed from the County Commission to move forward for June 5, 2013 meeting about certification. He also spoke about the need to update the plan of action, and continue to submit monthly progress reports.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sams and seconded by Commissioner Hopson to ask architect Dave Wright to evaluate each of the presentations from the three firms and make a recommendation to the County Commission as to which project will be best for Greene County. Mr. Wright stated he is willing to do that at no additional cost. The following vote was taken: Commissioners McAmis, Malone, Carter, Hopson, Hensley, Bird, Bowers, King, Rollins, Sauceman, Seay, Holt, Waddle, Moss, Dabbs, Crum, and Sams voted yes. Commissioners White, Quillen and Kiker voted no. Commissioner Greeneway was absent. The vote was 17 – aye; 3 – nay; 1 – absent. The Commissioners voted in favor to approve the motion.

The County Commission then took a 5 minute recess.

After returning from recess, a motion was made from Commissioner Quillen and seconded by Commissioner Kiker to support the health program of the Greene County Health Counsel. The following vote was taken: Commissioners McAmis, Hopson, Hensley, Bird, Quillen, Bowers, King, Rollins, Sauceman, Seay, Holt, Waddle, Moss,

Dabbs, Crum, Kiker, and Sams voted yes. Commissioner White voted no. Commissioner Malone abstained. Commissioners Carter and Greenway were absent. The vote was 17 – aye; 1 – nay; 1 – abstain; 2 – absent. The commission voted in favor to approve the motion.

A MOTION TO APPROVE NOTARIES

Mayor Broyles asked the Clerk to read a list of names requesting to be notaries to the Commission. Clerk, David Thompson, read the list. A motion was made by Commissioner Bowers and seconded by Commissioner Quillen to approve the list. Mayor Broyles called for the Commissioners to vote on their keypads. The following vote was taken: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Crum, Dabbs, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle and White voted yes. Commissioners Carter and Greenway were absent. The vote was 19 – aye; 2 – absent. The Commissioners voted in favor of the motion to approve the notaries.

THEREFORE, let the General Fund Budget be amended as follows:




