The Greene County Legislative Body met in regular session on Monday, October 21, 2013 at the Greene County Courthouse.

Mayor Broyles called the meeting to order to transact business that is to lawfully come before this Honorable Body. Commissioner Seay led the Pledge to the Flag, followed by Prayer led by Commissioner Rollins. The Commissioners signed in on their key pads and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Bird; Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Greenway, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle and White were present. There were 21 Commissioners present and 0 absent.







THEREFORE, let the General Fund budget be amended as follows:






