### GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 16, 2013 6:00 PM

The Greene County Legislative Body met in regular session on Monday, September 16, 2013 at the Greene County Courthouse.

Mayor Broyles called the meeting to order to transact business that is to lawfully come before this Honorable Body. Commissioner Seay led the Pledge to the Flag, followed by Prayer led by Commissioner Rollins. The Commissioners signed in on their key pads and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Greenway, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle, and White were present. There were 21 Commissioners present.

## Mayor Broyles read three proclamations:

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Larry Parman, of Rolling Hills Rd., spoke against the jail.

Commissioner Greenway then called on James Seacrest, of Gravel Woods Rd, who spoke against the jail.

Commissioner Holt called on Joe Houser, of Lonesome Pine Trail. He spoke on the laws on dogs and how they are not being enforced.

Commissioner Sauceman then called on Robert Parkins, of Virginia Drive. He spoke on property taxes.

Commissioner Bowers nominated Alan Broyles for Chairman of the County

Commission. Commissioner Bird made the second. Commissioner Sams made a motion

for nominations to cease. This motion was second by Commissioner Dabbs. A roll call

vote was taken and the results were as follows: Commissioners McAmis, Malone, Carter,

Hopson, Hensley, Bird, Quillen, Bowers, King, Rollins, Sauceman, Seay, Greenway,

Holt, Moss, Dabbs, Crum, Kiker, and Sams voted yes. Commissioner White voted no.

Commissioner Waddle abstained. The vote was 19 – aye; 1 – nay; 1 – abstain. Mayor

Broyles was elected as Chairman of the County Commission.

Commissioner Quillen nominated Commissioner David Crum for Chairman Pro-Tem of the County Commission. Commissioner Hopson nominated Robert Bird for Chairman Pro-Tem. Commissioner McAmis nominated Nathan Holt. A roll call vote was taken and the results were as follows: Commissioners Bird, Holt and Sams passed on first vote. Commissioner Crum abstained. Commissioners Bowers, Carter, Hensley, Hopson, King, Rollins, Sauceman, and Seay voted for Commissioner Bird.

Commissioners Dabbs, Kiker, Malone, Moss, Quillen, and White voted for Commissioner Crum. Commissioners Greenway, McAmis, and Waddle voted for Commissioner Holt. Commissioners Bird, Holt and Sams then changed their vote from pass to abstain. The vote was as follows: Commissioner Bird 8 votes; Commissioner Crum 6 votes; Commissioner Holt 3 votes; 4 – abstained. A second roll call vote was taken to vote between Commissioner Bird and Commissioner Crum. The result was as follows: Commissioners Bowers, Carter, Greenway, Hensley, Hopson, King, McAmis, Rollins, Sauceman, and Seay voted for Commissioner Bird. Commissioners Dabbs, Holt, Kiker, Malone, Moss, Quillen, Waddle, and White voted for Commissioner Crum. Commissioners Bird, Crum, and Sams abstained. The vote was as follows: Commissioner Bird 10 votes; Commissioner Crum 8 votes; 3 – abstained. After the second vote, a five minute recess was taken for Mayor Broyles and Attorney Woolsey to confer and check Roberts Rules of Order. Commissioner Crum then withdrew his name. A third vote was then taken for Commissioner Bird only as Pro-Tem. A roll call vote was taken and the results are as follows: Commissioner McAmis, Malone, White, Carter, Hopson, Hensley, Bowers, King, Rollins, Sauceman, Seay, Greenway, Holt, Waddle, Moss, Dabbs, Crum, and Sams voted yes. Commissioners Kiker and Quillen voted no. Commissioner Bird abstained. The vote was 18 - yes, 2 - no; 1 - abstained. Commissioner Bird was elected as Chairman Pro-Tem of the County Commission.

#### APPROVAL OF PRIOR MINUTES

A motion was made by Commissioner Sauceman and seconded by Commissioner Greenway to approve prior minutes. Mayor Broyles called for the Commissioners to vote on their keypads on the motion. The following vote was taken: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Greenway, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle, and White voted yes. The vote was 21 - aye; 0 - nay. The Commissioners voted in favor of the motion to approve the prior minutes.

## REPORTS

There were reports from the Solid Waste Dept. and Committee minutes in the package. Department end of year 2013 Financial Reports were spread on the minutes.

## OLD BUSINESS

### A MOTION TO APPROVE NOTARIES

Mayor Broyles asked the Clerk to read a list of names requesting to be notaries to the Commission. Clerk, David Thompson, read the list. A motion was made by Commissioner Bowers and seconded by Commissioner Dabbs to approve the list. Mayor Broyles called for the Commissioners to vote on their keypads. The following vote was taken: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Carter, Crum, Dabbs, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle, and White voted yes. Commissioners Greenway abstained. The vote was 20 - aye; 0 - nay; 1 - abstained. The Commissioners voted in favor of the motion to approve the notaries.
