- Mayor Crum read a proclamation designating October 2014 as Domestic
 Violence Awareness Month
- Judy Sexton, Buckingham Road, spoke on taxes and the need to cut back on spending; also spoke on Director of Schools and assistants salary
- Commissioner Quillen asked Dr. Kirk about teacher salaries.
- Commissioner Jennings asked Dr. Kirk about population of students and busses
- Commissioner Hensley nominated David Crum for Chairman of the County
 Commission. Commissioner Quillen made the second. Commissioner Jennings
 nominated Commissioner Hensley as Chairman. Commissioner Hensley declined.

A RESOLUTION TO REQUIRE THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENT HEADS WITHIN THE GREENE COUNTY GOVERNMENT, TO INCLUDE THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, TO ESTABLISH A COST SAVINGS INCENTIVIZATION PLAN FOR THE MANY NON-ELECTED EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNTY

WHEREAS, due to ongoing difficulties in funding the various operations of the Greene County Government during the current economic slowdown, the Governing Body is looking for innovative ways we might realize savings at every level while potentially reducing the overall size of the operating budget; and

WHEREAS, the utilization of an Employee Incentivization Plan has been found to be highly effective in private industry; and

WHEREAS, this Body wishes to require that this type program be implemented by the various Department Heads and our Director of Schools, for purposes of finding even the smallest of savings by stimulating each and every employee working within our government to begin actively thinking of ways to save the system money and operate more efficiently while maintaining the current or better level of service; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of Greene County, Tennessee, as follows:

That all Department heads and/or their appointed supervisor follow the general plan as outlined here, or as may be adjusted in the future for improvements as necessary:

- 1) That the Mayor appoint a newly formed sub-committee under the Budget and Finance Committee for purposes of developing submission forms, the receiving and evaluation of cost-savings ideas, the monitoring of potential savings generated from the submission, and the authority to recommend to the appropriate Department Head the payment of the savings bonus to the employee responsible for generating the savings idea.
- 2) That these submission forms be made available to all County Employees with proper notification as to the purpose of such forms.
- 3) That an employee with a cost-saving idea will submit on the special form and receive a dated copy from the receiving clerk with the new sub-committee,
- 4) That once evaluated by the sub-committee, that valid ideas for savings will be instituted and monitored for one year,
- 5) That once savings are verified, the employee will be paid a one-time bonus of 10% of the first years savings as a reward, and
- 6) That the balance of the savings is to then be returned to the Fund Balance from the Department from which it was saved.

A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2014 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2015

WHEREAS, Section 5-9-109, *Tennessee Code Annotated*, authorizes the Greene County Legislative Body to make appropriations to various nonprofit organizations; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body recognizes the various nonprofit organizations located in Greene County have great need of funds to carry on their nonprofit charitable work.

- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Greene County, on this the 15th day of September, 2014:
- SECTION 1. That \$84,500 be appropriated to the Library to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 2. That \$102,448 be appropriated to the Volunteer Fire Departments to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 3. That \$34,200 be appropriated to the Greeneville Parks and Recreation Dept. to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 4. That \$5,000 be appropriated to Kinser Park to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 5. That \$120,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County 9-1-1 Agency to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 6. That \$4,900 be appropriated to the Greeneville Emergency & Rescue Squad to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 7. That \$167,262 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to be distributed one-half for Economic Development and one-half for Tourism to promote the public welfare of Greene County, which is comprised of the amount of Hotel/Motel tax received by the County less the Trustee's Commission.
- SECTION 8. That \$10,000 be appropriated to the Niswonger Performing Arts to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 9. That \$800 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to promote maintenance of certain designated directional signs within Greene County.



- SECTION 10. That \$7,500 be appropriated to the Dickson-Williams Historical to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 11. That \$7,350 be appropriated to the Nathanael Greene Museum to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 12. That \$1,960 be appropriated to the Central Ballet Theatre to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 13. That \$5,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership National Amateur Intercollegiate Association's Golf Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 14. That \$5,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership Tusculm College Soccer Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 15. That \$3,000 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County Partnership Landair Ladies Classic Basketball Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all appropriations enumerated above are subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That the nonprofit organizations to which funds are appropriated shall file with the County Clerk and the disbursing officials a copy of any annual report of its business affairs and transactions and the proposed use of the county's funds in accordance with rules promulgated by the Comptroller of the Treasury, Chapter 0380-2-7. Such annual report shall be prepared and certified by the chief financial officer of such nonprofit organization in accordance with Section 5-9-109©. Tennessee Code Annotated.
- 2. That said funds must only be used by the named nonprofit charitable organizations in furtherance of their nonprofit charitable purposes benefiting the general welfare of the residents of Greene County.
- 3. That it is the expressed interest of the county commission of Greene County in providing these funds to the above named nonprofit charitable organizations to be fully in compliance with Chapter 0380-2-7 of the Rules of the Comptroller of the Treasury, and Section 5-9-109, Tennessee Code Annotated, and any and all other laws which may apply to county appropriations to nonprofit organizations and so this appropriation is made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws and regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in special called session on the 15th day of September, 2014, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative do hereby approve the above stated contributions to other agencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budgets approved for separate projects within the fund by the Greene County Board of Education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, <u>T.C.A.</u>, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, <u>T.C.A.</u>, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, <u>T.C.A.</u> One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015. The aggregate expenditures for any tem of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER REOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2014-2015 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal later than June 30, 2015.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2013 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2015 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2014. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 2015.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners, which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2014. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

E. A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE VARIOUS FUNDS, DEPARTMENTS, INSTITUTIONS, OFFICES, AND AGENCIES OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2014 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2015

A motion was made by Commissioner White and seconded by Commissioner Jennings, to approve a resolution making appropriations for the various funds, departments, institutions, offices, and agencies of Greene County, Tennessee for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015.

Commissioner Patterson explained the cuts from each department and suggested a survey be done on EMS in other counties to see how they operate. EMS Director Robert Sayne explained the EMS shifts and pay rate, and how he had to make a decision to either cut employees or cut benefits for EMS employees. Solid Waste Department was also discussed. Department heads were commended for the cuts they had made.

Mayor Crum called on the Commissioners to vote on their keypads. The following vote was taken: Commissioners Carpenter, Clemmer, Cobble, Collins, Hensley, Jennings, McAmis, Miller, Parton, Patterson, Peters, Shelton, Tucker, and White voted yes. RESOLUTION TO REALLOCATE A PORTION THE PRIVILEGE TAX ON THE OCCUPANCY OF HOTELS AND MOTELS FOR BUDGET YEAR 2014-2015 ONLY

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body on the 19th day of April, 2004 approved Private Chapter 101 House Bill 3571, substituted for Senate Bill 3484 which in part provided for the allocation of the proceeds received from the Hotel/Motel tax received by the County and which further provided that all proceeds and revenues so allocated may be reallocated by the Greene County Legislative Body by a 2/3 vote of the membership as necessitated or warranted under the circumstances then existing; and

WHEREAS, the current allocation of funds received by the County from the Hotel/Motel tax has been in existence for a number of years, but because of current budgetary issues it appears that the County Legislative Body seeks to reallocate a portion of the funds received from the 1% portion allocated to support and/or promote the performing arts, which in the past was utilized in part to fund the annual payment for the capital outlay note for the construction of the band rooms at North Greene and South Greene High Schools (a part of the education debt service); and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Board of Education as part of the agreement to fund the construction of the Chuckey-Doak High School agreed that in order to provide sufficient revenue to fund the education debt service that it would commit such funds from its BEP funding as would be necessary to maintain a one million dollar fund balance in the education debt service fund; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration and negotiation the Greene County Board of Education along with the Greene County Legislative Body has agreed as follows:

- 1. That the balance to be maintained in the education debt service fund shall be set at the minimum level of \$970,000.00 as opposed to the current minimum level of \$1,000,000.00; thereby requiring the Greene County Board of Education in the future to only contribute up to \$250,000.00 from the Board's BEP funds to maintain a balance in the education debt service fund of \$970,000.00 at the end of each budget year.
- 2. That \$30,637.00 in revenues generated from that portion of the Hotel/Motel tax allocated to support or promote the performing arts that historically went to the education debt service fund to satisfy the debt on the band rooms for North Greene High School and South Greene High School shall for budget year 2014-2015 only be reallocated to the General Fund
- 3. That in future years unless reallocated by the Greene County Legislative Body by a 2/3 majority vote, that the allocation of funds received by Greene County pursuant to or derived from the Hotel/Motel tax shall be as specified in the Resolution approving the Private Act dated April 19, 2004.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 25th day of September, 2014, a quorum being present and two-thirds of the members voting in the affirmative (1) that the minimum fund balance required by the agreement of the Greene County Board of Education and the Greene County Legislative Body shall be reduced from \$1,000,000.00 to \$970,000.00. (2) that the Greene County Board of Education shall be responsible for providing such additional funding from its BEP monies up to \$250,000.00 to maintain the education debt service fund at \$970,000.00 at the end of each

RESOLUTION TO FUND THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT OPERATIONS PURSUANT TO T.C.A §8-20-120

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body is facing critical issues as it relates to setting a budget for the 2014-2015 budgetary year; and,

WHEREAS, the County Legislative Body recognizes the funding requirements mandated by T.C.A. §8-20-120 which requires that county governing bodies shall fund the operations of the county sheriff's department and further that no county governing body shall adopt a budget absent the consent of the sheriff which reduces below current levels the salaries and number of employees in the sheriff's department; and

WHEREAS, because of the critical shortage of funds necessary to provide adequate funding for the various departments of county government, all county department heads have been asked to review their budgets for the budgetary savings as it relates to the expenditures for their departments; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature Body recognizes that the Sheriff's Department was approved for a specified number of positions and salaries for the 2013-2014 budget year but acknowledges that some of those positions in the sheriff's department were not filled; and

WHEREAS, Pat Hankins, the Sheriff for Greene County has committed to maintaining the certification of the Greene County Jail as well as the Greene County Workhouse but he believes that he will ultimately have to fill those open positions to provide the staffing necessary to operate his department and to keep both the Jail and Workhouse certified; and

WHEREAS, nevertheless, in an attempt to reduce his expenditures for this year Sheriff Hankins has agreed to reduce his salary line item by \$140,943.00 for one year only and will consent

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pursuant to T.C.A. §8-20-120 to reduce his budget for the budgetary year of 2014-2015 below current levels that had been set for his budget in 2013-2014, but only provided that the County Commission agrees that for the purposes of T.C.A. §8-20-120, that his salaries and number of employees shall be at least at the same levels as 2013-2014 budget for all future budgets; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission has agreed that if the Sheriff consents to reduce his budget for 2014-2015 in the salary line item by \$140,943.00 the Commission agree that it will restore all funding for salaries and positions to at least the same level as 2013-2014 budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 25th day of September, 2014, a quorum being present and majority voting in the affirmative that based on the Sheriff's consent to reduce his salaries for the 2014-2015 budget year by \$140,943.00 for one year only, that the County Legislative Body agrees that for purposes of complying with T.C.A. §8-20-120, the Commission will restore and include in future budgets funding to maintain the salaries and the number of employees in the Sheriff's Department at the same level as the 2013-2014 budget.
