**A RESOLUTION TO REQUEST THE STATE OF TENNESSEE THROUGH
LEGISLATIVE AND LEGAL ACTION TO REAFFIRM THE STATE OF
TENNESSEE'S AUTHORITY TO REGULATE DOMESTIC RELATIONS
INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE TRADITIONAL CONCEPT OF
MARRIAGE AS BETWEEN ONE MAN AND ONE WOMAN**

WHEREAS, the individual states in the United States since this country's founding have regulated and defined marriage without interference from the federal government or its courts; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee and most other states pursuant to the inherent rights of the individual states and its people continue to define marriage as the legal obligations, rights and responsibilities associated with the marital union between one man and one woman; and

WHEREAS, in 2006 the citizens of the State of Tennessee by legislatively referred popular vote determined that a legal marriage/union in the State of Tennessee is to be recognized only if said marriage is between one man and one woman which amendment was ratified and is now Section 18 to Article XI of the Tennessee State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in the case of United States v. Windsor, recognized the State's authority "to regulate the subject of domestic relations with respect to the protection of offspring, property interest, and the enforcement of marital responsibilities"; and

WHEREAS, further the United States Supreme Court in the United States vs. Windsor declined to intervene, decide or determine whether the right to marry by same sex participants was a legal right protected by the United States Constitution and in fact the United States Supreme Court in the majority opinion written by Justice Kennedy, affirmed that "the definition of marriage is the foundation of the State's broader authority to

regulate the subject of domestic relations with respect to the protection of offspring, property interest, and the enforcement of marital responsibilities"; in effect the Supreme Court reserved for the states that determination of whether to recognize and/or legalize same sex marriages in the same fashion as the traditional marriage between one man and one woman; and

WHEREAS, both the General Assembly as well as the State Attorney General evidently believed that the State of Tennessee's Constitutional Amendment which in effect bans same sex marriage was constitutional and fully enforceable in the State of Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, in June 2015 the Supreme Court of the United States (in a five to four decision) in the case of "Obergefell, et al vs. Hodges, et al" has now determined that any legislation, law, or voter approved constitutional amendment in any state in the United States prohibiting same sex marriages is unconstitutional under the fourteenth amendment; in effect legislating for the individual states and its citizens the legality of same sex marriage with the corresponding responsibilities, rights and obligations; and

WHEREAS, it appears that it would be prudent, wise and necessary for the State of Tennessee to challenge the right of the United States Supreme Court to "make laws" that infringe upon the individual rights of the states and its citizens to govern and to legislate on those issues that are properly reserved by the individual states; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body by this Resolution is requesting that those State Legislators, Senator Steve Southerland, Representative Jeremy Faison and Representative David Hawk, be proactive and introduce legislation to defend the right of the State of Tennessee to determine the validity and sanctity of marriage in the State of

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Tennessee and to recognize the State of Tennessee's right to define marriage as a union between one man and one woman; further to allow County Court Clerks to honor their oath of office and refuse to issue marriage licenses to "same sex" couples and to utilize the resources of the State of Tennessee to challenge the unconstitutional decision rendered by the Supreme Court in Obergefell et al. v. Hodges.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislative Body of Greene County, Tennessee meeting in regular session on the 21st day of September, 2015 a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative:

1. That a request be forwarded to Senator Steve Southerland, Representative Jeremy Faison and Representative David Hawk asking our legislators to introduce legislation and take such other action as is necessary to support the mandates under our State Constitution and the Constitutional Amendment as well as the opinion of our citizens defining marriage as a union between one man and one woman.
2. To request that our State Attorney General acting on behalf of the citizens of Greene County and the citizens of the State of Tennessee take such legal action as is necessary to further challenge the authority of the United States Supreme Court to legislate and dictate to and take away from the basic rights of the State of Tennessee and its citizens to determine that a marriage is a union between one man and one woman and to continue the long standing tradition of the Volunteer State in taking a stand against laws, acts or decisions that violate the conscience of man.
3. To direct that the County Court Clerk forward a copy of this Resolution to other county governments in the State of Tennessee


urging each county through its legislative body to adopt a similar Resolution requesting action from the State of Tennessee to defend the right of the State of Tennessee to determine what persons may marry and which marriages are legally recognized by the State of Tennessee.

4. To affirm and go on record that Greene County is vehemently opposed to the Supreme Court's decision in Obergefell et al v. Hodges and supports the decision of any elected/appointed official challenging that unconstitutional decision.

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**RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM GENERAL PURPOSE SCHOOL FUND TO
THE FOOD SERVICE FUND
FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2016**

WHEREAS, the cash balance for the Food Service Fund is inadequate to maintain the budget for that fund on the statutorily required balanced cash basis for fiscal year 2016,

WHEREAS, all County funds require an adequate amount of cash for working capital to be well-managed and to meet the requirements of T.C.A. §§ 9-1-116 and 9-21-403,

WHEREAS, Greene County School District desires to operate in compliance with the statutory requirements to maintain a cash-basis balanced budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Greene County School District, a school district in Tennessee, having met in regular session on the 27th day of August 2015, and by the County Commission of Greene County, a county in Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this 21st day of September 2015,

SECTION 1. That, the General Purpose School Fund shall make a permanent transfer of \$208,000 to the Food Service Fund on September 21, 2015, from fund balance.

SECTION 2. That, the County Commission commits the \$208,000 transfer amount be used only for the purposes of the Food Service Fund.

SECTION 3. This resolution will take effect on September 21, 2015. The Secretary of the Board of Education shall include this resolution in the minutes of the Greene County School District. The County Clerk shall include this Resolution in the minutes of Greene County.



**RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER FUNDS FROM GENERAL PURPOSE SCHOOL FUNDS TO
THE SCHOOL FOOD SERVICE FUND FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2016**

WHEREAS, the Food Service Fund does not have enough funds to meet appropriation for the 2015-2016 School Year,

WHEREAS, Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) consider a cash deficit in any fund to be a significant deficiency in internal controls; and,

WHEREAS, Greene County School District does not desire to operate any fund with a cash deficit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Greene County School District, a school district in Tennessee, meeting in regular session on this 27th day of August, 2015, and by the County Commission of Greene County, a county in Tennessee, meeting in called session on this 21st day of September, 2015.

SECTION 1. The General Purpose School Fund shall make a permanent loan of \$208,000 to the School Service Fund on September 21, 2015.

SECTION 2. The \$208,000 transfer shall remain in the Food Service Fund as a designated fund balance from the General Purpose School Fund.

SECTION 3. This resolution will take effect on September 21, 2015. The Secretary of the Board of Education shall include this resolution in the minutes of the Greene County School District. The County Clerk shall include this Resolution in the minutes of Greene County.

WHEREAS, the Greeneville Greene County Airport Authority is a jointly owned venture between the Town of Greeneville and Greene County that provide a valuable service to the citizens and businesses of Greene County across the communities in Greene County, Tennessee and the Greeneville area. Not only does the Airport provide commercial transportation but also provides services to the air ambulances serving the communities in the area. The Airport also aids the recruitment of new industry to the area; and

WHEREAS, the Greeneville Greene County Airport Authority has not received a contribution from Greene County Government since the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. The Airport is currently experiencing cash flow problems and request that the Greene County Commission allocate a contribution of \$30,380 to the Greeneville Greene County Airport; and

WHEREAS, after careful consideration of all the factors above stated it would be appropriate for the Greene County Legislative Body and in the best interest of Greene County to make a \$30,380, contribution to the Greeneville Greene County Airport Authority; and
