There were 17 Commissioners present and four absent.

DISCUSSION

Mayor Broyles read the resolution requesting that the Governor and other State Officials reconsider their decision to reduce the workforce at Greene Valley Developmental Center. He introduced Dr. Meece, Superintendent of Greene Valley, Ralph Bohannon, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Greene Valley, Steve Love, Chief Financial Officer of Greene Valley and Bernice Jozsa, TSEA (Tennessee State Employees Association) Greene County President. After these individuals spoke there were questions from Commissioners Brown and Greenway which were answered by Mr. Steve Love and a comment from Brenda Grogan.

WHEREAS, There is no objective test for Parkinson's disease and the rate of misdiagnosis can be high; and

WHEREAS, Symptoms of Parkinson's disease vary7 from person to person and include tremor, slowness, difficulty with balance, swallowing, chewing, speaking, rigidity, cognitive problems, dementia, mood disorders, such as depression and anxiety, constipation, skin problems, and sleep disruption; and

WHEREAS, there is no cure, therapy, or drug to slow or halt the progression of Parkinson's disease; and

WHEREAS, increased education and research are needed to help find more effective treatments with fewer side effects and, ultimately, an effective treatment or cure for Parkinson's disease.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Alan D. Broyles, Mayor of Greene County Tennessee, do hereby proclaim April as Parkinson's Awareness Month in Greene County, Tennessee and do urge all citizens to join in learning more about this chronic and devastating disease.

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ANIMAL CONTROL February 24, 2010

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The Animal Control Committee of the Greene County Commission met on February 24, 2010 at the Courthouse Annex. Members present were Betty Alexander, Bill Brown, Margaret Greenway, Fred Malone, and Jan Kiker.

Chairman Jan Kiker called the meeting to order. She asked Eddie Key, Director of Animal Control to give his reports. Key told the committee calls concerning stray, abused, or injured animals almost doubled in 2009, with 4,095 such calls received. He said only 2,329 such cases were handled in all of 2008. Key attributed this major increase in calls in part to more animals being abandoned by families whose homes have been foreclosed on, or who have otherwise been evicted. In such instances, Key said, animal control officers do not necessarily pick up the animal, but try to work with pet owners who have no place to go and leave the animal until they find a place for themselves. However, Key also noted that the increase was due to the county's change in policy allowing persons to relinquish animals that they can no longer care for without paying a fee. Chairman Jan Kiker said this change helps the animal control staff by allowing people to bring pets they can no longer care for to the animal control facility instead of abandoning them.

Key said calls about loose livestock of all kinds also have increased dramatically in 2009. County Commissioner Fred Malone asked Key if perhaps the increase is due to more people turning their horses out to graze on other people's property, because they cannot provide enough grazing or other food. Key said that was the case in some instances.

Key said the Animal Control facility handled 125 animal-bite investigations in 2009, and had 27 of those animals tested for rabies. Of those, nine of the animals that tested positive for rabies were skunks, and one was a raccoon. He said rabies in skunks has been a problem for years, but raccoon rabies is new to Greene County, and something that concerns him. The rabid raccoon was tested in the last quarter of the year. Key said raccoons become aggressive when rabid, and the county is not prepared to counter this problem.

The county's animal control officers picked up a total of 2,988 problem or unwanted animals in 2009, key reported. Of these, 166 were claimed by owners, and 418 were rescued by pet rescue groups. However, 2,404 of those animals were euthanized. Of the euthanized animals, 600 had health problems, and 632 were aggressive, but 1,172 could have been adopted.

After Keys reports, Kiker told the committee that Feral Friends, and animal rescue organization headed by Robin Quillen and Kathy Newton, has asked to be considered as an official pet rescue organization recognized by the county. Key said such an organization has to either have a business license or non-profit status and a checking account. In addition, the organization must have a dedicated phone line, a Web site, and an e-mail address. It must also have a tracking system for animals it places in home, be open for inspection, and provide three

recommendations. Such groups must also allow regular visual inspection of where animals are kept when they are pulled out of the animal control facility.

Kathy Newton of Feral Friends said the Humane Society of Greene County has been rescuing some animals from the county facility, but Bright Hope Animal Rescue is no longer doing so. Newton said that Feral Friends would like to take up where bright Hope left off.

Kiker said she and Key plan to go to Feral Friends' facility next week to inspect it. She asked if anyone was willing to make a motion to make Feral Friends a rescue agency recognized by the county. Committee member Bill Brown said that an inspection should have been done before the committee was asked to act. Kiker said that she has personally visited Feral Friends' location several times. She said the facility, located at Quillen's home off the Kingsport Highway, ahs a heated barn that is very clean and serves as a home for about 200 cats. Another heated building houses 100 more cats. All of the cats are fed and cared for, and all have been spayed or neutered. Brown then made a motion to grant recognition, contingent on Key's approval when he visits. The motion was approved unanimously. The Meeting was adjourned.

Mr. Jim Jordan stated that we have renewal figures from Blue Cross. The original increase was 13.9% with no change except mandated mental health benefit enhancement (eliminated day and visit limits). After Pam Gaut negotiated, the figure is 10%. Pam gave handouts on how Blue Cross arrived at this increase. They will look at the allocation of rate over the three optional plans. Ms. Gaut explained and answered questions. Mr. Jordan recommended that Ms. Gaut go back and negotiate again on 7% flat increase and we would not get competitive quotes. The increase was 7% the first two years with Blue Cross, 3.5% the next year, 3% the next year and 5.9% last year. Pam was asked what effect the new federal health plan might have on our insurance. She said that she feels it will increase the premium over three to five years. Sheriff Burns made a motion to have Ms. Gaut negotiate with Blue Cross on a 7% increase with the agreement that the County will not ask for competitive quotes if we get this rate. Commissioner Justis made a second and the motion was approved. Some benefits could still be adjusted if necessary for funding.

Dan Jackson reviewed his report with the Committee. It was approved upon a motion by Roger Woolsey and Commissioner Waddle.

The meeting adjourned.

DEBRIS COMMITTEE March 17, 2010

The Debris Committee of the Greene County Commission met on March 17, 2010 at 2:00 in the Conference Room Annex. Members present were Bill Brown, Margaret Greenway, and Jan Kiker. Also present were Leon Bird and Tim Tweed of the Building and Zoning Office.

The meeting was called to order and Chairman Jan Kiker turned the meeting over to Leon Bird. Mr. Bird told committee members that some property owners are paying the county to clean their sites multiple times. He said he preferred to close the cases and start again if we have to. Mr. Bird also stated that "we're going to have to get some teeth in it," Referring to the Debris Ordinance. The Committee discussed the need to prevent repeated violations of the debris ordinance, however, no action was taken in the absence of County Attorney Roger Woolsey. Besides getting Woolsey's opinion on any possible changes to the ordinance, County Mayor Alan Broyles said he would seek information from the County Technical Assistance Service (CTAS).

Committee Margaret Greenway said one option could be increasing the county's charge for cleaning the properties. Bird noted that the county recently added six new cases of debris ordinance violators. "I'd like to work with these people if they'll work with me," Bird said. He added approximately 1,000 debris cases in Greene County have resulted in cleanups with the properties then staying clean.

There was no further discussion. The next meeting will be April 12 at 2:00. The meeting was adjourned.

BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE April 8, 2010

The Budget & Finance Committee met on April 8, 2010. The following were present: Alan Broyles, Tom Yancey, Phil King, Hilton Seay, Bill Dabbs, Mary Shelton, Regina Nuckols, and Wanda Riddle. Also attending were Dan Walker, John Waddle, Rebecca English, David Thompson, employees of the Greene County Partnership, Boys and Girls Club and Parks and Recreation Dept.

Mr. Brett Chassin of USAble Insurance Co. made a presentation to the members of the Committee concerning a Flex Spending Account Plan, which can be a part of our 125 Plan. There are two parts available which are Dependent Day Care Expenses and Noncovered Medical Expenses. The employee would put a certain amount in an account with the County to cover these expenses. The county covers the amount and then deducts the amount from the employees pay. The benefit to the employee is in saving taxes because this is a tax deferral. The benefit to the employer is that this saves matching FICA taxes. The risk to the employee is that if all dollars set aside are not used, they are not refunded. The risk to the employer would be if the employee were to use all funds put aside and quit employment before the county has had a chance to deduct the full amount of the employees check, the county cannot take the rest from the employees last check. Each employee would be provided a debit card to use for this plan. There is no cost to participate for the County or the employee.

Minutes of the prior meeting were approved upon a motion by Commissioner King and second by Commissioner Dabbs.

Interbudgetary transfers that have previously been approved by the County Mayor were passed out to the Committee members for their information. Interbudgetary transfer requests that concern salary line items were presented to the Committee for their review and approval. These were approved upon a motion by Commissioner Seay and second by Commissioner Dabbs.

Resolutions were approved as follows:

- 1. A resolution to allocate \$15,000 from the 2009-2010 budget and \$15,000 from the 2010-2011 budget years to the Greene County Partnership to defray the expenses incurred in procuring and hosting the National Amateur Intercollegiate Association's Championship Golf Tournament was approved upon a motion by Commissioner Cox and second by Commission Seay. It was noted that this Tournament being held in Greene County is already drawing attention from other tournaments.
- 2. A resolution to allocate a contribution of seven thousand dollars to each of the fifteen volunteer fire departments serving Greene County, Tennessee was approved upon a motion by Commissioner Cox and second by Commissioner Dabbs.
- 3. A resolution to amend the 2010 Fiscal Year budget for reimbursements received by the Sheriff's Department was approve upon a motion by Commissioner Dabbs and second by Commissioner Cox.
- 4. A resolution to amend the 2010 fiscal year General Fund budget to budget the return of unclaimed property to the lawful owner was presented. A motion was made by Commissioner Cox and seconded by Commissioner Seay to approve this resolution. During discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Seay and seconded by Commissioner Cox to amend the resolution to show that the money is to be paid out of the Chancery Court budget and the Clerk's budget instead of the Commission budget. The motion to amend the budget was approved and the motion to approve the resolution as amended was approved.

Mrs. Tammy Kinser of the Greene County Partnership, spoke briefly telling the Commissioners that signs showing attractions in our County can be purchased from the State. The application fee is \$25 and the sign is \$200 plus \$50 per year for maintenance. There are approximately five signs needed and this could fall under hotel/motel tax funds.

Commissioner Seay asked if we have figures showing the actual fund balance for several past years. Dan Walker noted that as of March 31 the fund balance is over seven million dollars.

The members were given a sheet that showed the fund balances of June 30 for Fund 101 as audited by the Division of County Audit (State) for 2002 through 2009. The form also showed an average 4-year balance. The bottom line for 2002-2005 was \$10,280,000.00 and the bottom line for 2006-2009 was \$21,131,000.00. The audited numbers are the true and final numbers and they show that as audited the undesignated fund balance for fund 101 has doubled

Mayor Broyles said that it should be noted that in the last four years the Budget & Finance Committee has not used the undesignated fund balance to balance the budget. They have used unspent funds that are turned in from individual departments at the end of the year to help balance the budget.

The meeting adjourned.
