A RESOLUTION TO SET A SPEED LIMIT ON WEST SEVEN SPRINGS ROAD (Second Reading)

WHEREAS, West Seven Springs Road is located in the 19th Civil District of Greene County and is .57 miles in length beginning at McDonald Road and dead ends.

WHEREAS, residents and property owners on West Seven Springs Road have forwarded a petition to County Commissioner Margaret Greenway stating that West Seven Springs Road cannot be traversed at any speeds approaching 55 miles per hour safely and have requested the establishment of a 20 mile per hour speed limit for said road; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated §55-8-153(d) authorizes the Greene County Legislative Body to set speed limits on county roads; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable to attempt to minimize the chances of accidents by establishing a speed limit of 20 miles per hour for West Seven Springs Road.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting in regular session on the 16th day of August, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that, pursuant to, *Tennessee Code Annotated §55-8-153(d)*, the speed limit for West Seven Springs Road shall be set at 20 miles per hour.

WHEREAS, it is desirable to attempt to minimize the chances of accidents by establishing a speed limit of 40 miles per hour for Ottway Road.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting in regular session on the 16th day of August 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that, pursuant to, *Tennessee Code Annotated §55-8-153(d)*, the speed limit for Ottway Road shall be set at 40 miles per hour.

SECTION 1. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budgets approved for separate projects within the fund by the Greene County Board of Education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collecting taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register of Deeds, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101, <u>T.C.A.</u>, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, <u>T.C.A.</u>, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendment to the budget shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407, <u>T.C.A.</u> One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution, which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department of the County in excess of the appropriation made herein for such office, agency, institution, division or department of the County. Such appropriation shall constitute the limit to the expenditures of any office, agency, institution, division or department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2011. The aggregate expenditures for any tem of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the fiscal year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by Section 9-21-403, Tennessee Code Annotated.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER REOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the fiscal year 2010-2011 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, <u>Tennessee Code Annotated</u>. Said notes shall be signed by the County Mayor and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal later than June 30, 2011.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2009 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2011 shall be apportioned to the various County funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2009. The Clerk and Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the fiscal year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the fiscal year at June 30, 2011.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners, which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2010. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

A RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS OF GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2011

- WHEREAS, Section 5-9-109, T.C.A. authorizes the County Legislative Body to make appropriations to non-profit organizations; and
- WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body recognizes the various non-profit organizations located in Greene County have great need of funds to carry on their non-profit charitable and civic work.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of Greene County, on this the 16^{th} day of August, 2010:
 - SECTION 1. That \$84,500 be appropriated to the Library to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
 - SECTION 2. That \$19,600 be appropriated to Roby Center to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 3. That \$31,850 be appropriated to the Tennessee Vocational Training Center to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 4. That \$87,812 be appropriated to the Volunteer Fire Departments to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 5. That \$29,400 be appropriated to the Greeneville Parks and Recreation Dept. to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
 - SECTION 6. That \$29,400 be appropriated to Kinser Park to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 7. That \$3,920 be appropriated to the Retired Senior Volunteer Program to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 8. That \$9800 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Family Ministries Food Bank to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 9. That \$22,942 be appropriated to Frontier Health (Nolichuckey Mental Health) to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
 - SECTION 10. That \$30,380 be appropriated to the Airport to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
 - SECTION 11. That \$1,470 be appropriated to the Forestry Dept. to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
 - SECTION 12. That \$12,250 be appropriated to the Boys and Girls Club to promote the public welfare of Greene County;
- SECTION 13. That \$7,350 be appropriated to the Nathaniel Greene Museum to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 14. That \$11,760 be appropriated to the First Tennessee Human Resource Agency to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 15. That \$94,683 be appropriated to the Greeneville/Greene County 9-1-1 Agency to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 16. That \$4,900 be appropriated to the Greeneville Emergency & Rescue Squad to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 17. That \$980 be appropriated to the Middle Nolichuckey Watershed Alliance to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
- SECTION 18. That \$4,900 be appropriated to the Second Harvest Food Bank to promote the public welfare of Greene County.
 - SECTION 19. That \$980 be appropriated to the Child Advocacy Center to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 20. That \$3,430 be appropriated to Keep Greene Beautiful to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 21. That \$167,262 be appropriated to the Greeneville-Greene County Partnership to be distributed one-half for Economic Development and one-half for Tourism to promote the public welfare of Greene County, which is comprised of the amount of Hotel/Motel tax received by the County less the Trustee's Commission.

SECTION 22. That \$2,450 be appropriated to the Volunteer Center to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 23. That \$1,960 be appropriated to the Central Ballet to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 24. That \$10,000 be appropriated to the Niswonger Performing Arts to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

SECTION 23. That \$15,000 be appropriated to the Greene County Partnership's Golf Tournament to promote the public welfare of Greene County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in reconvened session on the 16th day of August, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative do hereby approve the above stated contributions to other agencies.

A RESOLUTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY FIXING THE TAX LEVY IN GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED that the Greene County Commissioners of Greene County, Tennessee, in regular session on this 16th day of August, 2010, that the combined property tax rate for Greene County Tennessee for the year beginning July 1, 2010, shall be \$1.3137 (inside) and \$1.5069 (outside), on each \$100.00 of taxable property, which is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies:

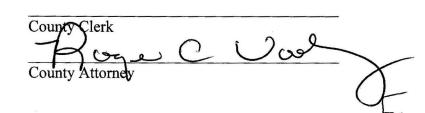

RESOLUTION OF GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY TO REORGANIZE THE KINSER PARK BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Valley Authority, hereinafter referred to as TVA, has granted an easement of property along the Davy Crockett Lake to the citizens of Greeneville and Greene County which is known as Kinser Park; and

WHEREAS, the Mayors of Greeneville and Greene County have accepted the easement and agreed to the conditions thereto; and

WHEREAS, the respective legislative bodies of Greeneville and Greene County have formed the Kinser Park Commission hereinafter referred to as the Commission, to hold, operate, and maintain the property in accordance with the terms of the easement; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is an extension of the legislative bodies of Greeneville and Greene County and is not empowered to act as a separate and distinct entity without oversight by these legislative bodies; and

WHEREAS, the latest legislative action to reorganize the Commission was May 18, 1998 which stipulated that the Mayors of Greeneville and Greene County would each appoint two (2) representatives of their respective legislative bodies with five (5) more citizens at large selected by the other Park Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, the result is that the majority of the Commission members are not accountable to either of the legislative bodies and thus to the citizens of Greeneville and Greene County; and

WHEREAS, the latest legislative action does not provide prerequisites for membership on the Commission, nor establish term limits; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the requirements of TVA's easement may result in the termination of the easement and inconvenience many Greeneville and Greene County citizens:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on August 16, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative establishes the following guidelines for membership on the Kinser Park Commission:

- (1) The Mayors of Greeneville and Greene County will each appoint four (4) members to the Commission, one of which must be a member of their legislative body.
- (2) The legislative bodies of Greeneville and Greene County must approve all appointments to the Commission.



- (3) Members appointed to or serving on the Commission may not have a monetary interest in the operation of Kinser Park or otherwise have a conflict of interest while serving.
- (4) No member shall be appointed to the Commission who has served more than 4 cumulative years on the Commission except persons who have not served on the commission during the previous four (4) years.
- (5) The Commission will not enter into a contract with others until the legislative bodies of Greeneville and Greene County have approved the contract provisions.

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RESOLUTION OF GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY TO REQUIRE BUILDING OFFICIALS MEET TENNESSEE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR BUILDING INSPECTORS

WHEREAS, Greene County adopted the International Building Code effective January 1, 2009 requiring the appointment of a building official; and

WHEREAS, Greene County is now required to perform as many as four (4) inspections per building permit issued; and

WHEREAS, Greene County encompasses a very large area with long distances between borders consuming significant amounts of travel time to building sites to perform inspections; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Greene County are entitled to building inspections conducted on a timely basis and builders cannot afford to cease work while waiting for a required inspection; and

WHEREAS, one building inspector cannot be expected to perform building inspections in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, citizens and builders are subjected to fines and penalties for performing certain work before inspector authorization; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated TCA § 68-120-113 requires all employed building officials meet certification requirements before authorization to perform building inspections and provides penalties for performing building inspections without certification;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on August 16, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative that Tim Tweed is appointed Building Official for the purposes of performing building inspections and other duties as required pursuant to T.C.A. § 68-120-113.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Leon Bird, the County Building Commissioner as provided for in T.C.A. § 13-7-110 shall likewise be designated as a "Deputy Building Official/Insepctor" and that both the Building Official and Deputy Building Official above appointed shall meet Tennessee certification requirements to perform their duties on or before January 1, 2011 or be removed from their position.

WHEREAS, these veterans or their survivors need help in gaining access to the many VA benefits they are entitled to; and

WHEREAS, veterans or their survivors need maximum access to competent and caring assistance; and

WHEREAS, a military veteran has the background and experience to understand military life, military lingo, and a myriad of ACRONYMS; and

WHEREAS, Greene County has established a Veterans Service Office and generously provided resources to staff the office;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on August 16, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative declare that the Veterans Service Officer must be a military veteran who has demonstrated competency and caring for veterans and must work a full-time schedule or be removed from the position;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor will appoint a committee of five (5) members at large to screen applications for any vacant or part-time Veterans Service Officer position; that within 45 days of being formed, this committee will recommend three (3) applicants, ranked by preference, to the Mayor who will select one applicant for hire upon approval of the County Commission; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this policy will become effective no later than January 1, 2011.

BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE July 14, 2010

The Budget & Finance Committee met on July 14, 2010. The following were present: Alan Broyles, Tom Yancey, Phil King, Hilton Seay, John Cox, Bill Dabbs, Mary Shelton, Regina Nuckols, and Wanda Riddle. Also attending were Robert Bird, Robert Sayne, Steve Burns and Margaret, Gail Jeffers, Eddie Key, and David Thompson.

The Committee reviewed the Jail Budget requests with Sheriff Burns.

The Committee reviewed the Animal Control budget requests with Director, Eddie Key. The Director of Purchasing, Diane Swatzell, explained vehicle purchasing procedures and options.

The Committee reviewed the Circuit Court Clerk budget requests with Gail Jeffers, Clerk.

The Committee reviewed the Planning Department budget requests with Amy Tweed, County Planner.

The Committee reviewed the GIS program budget requests with Chuck Jeffers.

After a quick review of bottom line expenditures, Mary Shelton showed the Committee the projected bottom line fund balance for 2010-2011 would be \$5,048,776 including revenues coming from the Sheriff's Dept. and EMS and including non-profit requests at last year's actual contribution amount. The figure also uses budgetary savings from 2009-2010 to help balance the budget. It is a matter of cutting over 1.8 million from the expenditures or funding in this manner and still having a fund balance of over five million dollars. All agreed that this would be a good way to balance the budget and retain the needed fund balance.

The Committee made a quick review of non-profit agency requests for contributions and left them all at the amount they were funded last year. They will discuss them further at the next meeting. They asked that Mr. Mel Seaton bring an actual figure for VFD insurance for 2009-2010 so that they could compare it to what the County appropriated for insurance.

It was decided that the next meeting would be Thursday, July 15 at 1:00 p.m.

The meeting adjourned.

BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE July 15, 2010

The Budget & Finance Committee met on July 15, 2010. The following were present: Alan Broyles, Amy Rose, Phil King, Hilton Seay, John Cox, Bill Dabbs, Mary Shelton, Regina Nuckols, and Wanda Riddle. Also attending were Robert Bird, Robert Sayne, David Thompson and Mel Seaton.

Mr. Mel Seaton gave the Committee members the total dollar amount that the Volunteer Fire Department paid out on truck, building, liability and workers compensation insurance for 2009-2010 which was \$96,565.00. \$7,671 was paid out of the treasury of the VFD Association. He noted that he VFD Association will be starting out behind in needed funds for insurance this year even with the contribution that the County is giving. A motion was made by Commissioner Seay and seconded by Commissioner Dabbs to fund the Volunteer Fire Departments at the same amount as last year and that the difference in that amount and what is needed to pay their insurance for the year be made up by asking Tusculum, Mosheim, and Baileyton to pay a portion based on pro-rata by annual local sales tax. The Association should go to these entities and ask for this percentage. The motion was approved. Mr. Seaton said he would pass this information on to the present Association President, Ryan Holt. Commissioner Seay said he would work with Mr. Holt to help him in getting the percentages figured since he had taught mathematics.

Mr. Seaton also asked if the Association contribution could be removed from the non-profit list and put in a category such as Emergency Services because they are different than a social service. He was told that this would make no difference.

All of the Committee members agreed to the scenario presented to balance the general fund budget using funds carried over from 2009-2010, and unanticipated revenues from the Sheriff and EMS. We will have a fund balance of approximately \$5,098,776. The entire budget will be printed with all adjustments and then looked at once again.

The Committee addressed the previously discussed matter of funding a vehicle for Animal Control. \$25,600 was added back to that budget for a vehicle.

The Committee addressed the previously discussed matter of funding an increase in salary for the County's only certified inspector. Commissioner Cox made the motion that a salary adjustment based on the law in the amount of \$4,000 be made in the line item for the Building Inspector's Assistant who is the only certified inspector at this time. Commissioner King seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

The Committee addressed the previously discussed matter of funding an increase in salary for the Veterans' Service Officer's Assistant who will be taking on additional responsibility as the Officer is going to be working only part time in the future. A motion was made by Commissioner Seay to take \$4,007 from the Service Officer's salary line item and make a salary supplement line item to put that amount in. The Assistant will be paid this supplement until a full-time Service Officer is hired in the future. A second was made by Commissioner Cox and the motion was approved. It was also decided to leave \$26,081 in the Supervisors Salary line item to be there if needed when hiring someone full time in the future and to pay the part time Officer up to \$12,000 from that line.

Minutes of the 7/7/10 and 7/14/10 budget meetings were approved upon a motion by Commissioner Seay and second by Commissioner Cox.

It was decided that the next meeting would be Friday, July 16 at 1:00 p.m.

The meeting adjourned.

A resolution fixing a tax levy in Greene County, TN for the year beginning July 1, 2010 was approved upon a motion by commissioner Seay and second by Commissioner Dabbs.

A resolution making appropriations to non-profit organizations of Greene County, TN for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011 was approved upon a motion by Commissioner Dabbs and second by commissioner Seay.

A resolution making appropriations for the various funds, departments, institutions, offices and agencies of Greene County, Tennessee, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011 was approved upon a motion by Commissioner Cox and second by Commissioner Seay.

Mr. Daryl Bryan explained where the appropriation from the County to NPAC is used. He noted that band programs and choral programs are performed by all schools at no cost; the annual Youth Summit is held for all 8th graders; and they subsidize tickets for students at no cost or no more than \$5.00 per ticket for several performances. Approximately 15,000 students use the facility annually and near 50,000 attend performances annually. NPAC is a non-profit organization and NPAC leases the building from the School Dept. The city made a large contribution (approximately \$700,000) for the parking area and other costs and do not contribute annually. The school system pays about ½ the costs.

Commissioner Cox asked what the gross receipt tax is that is mentioned in the tax levy resolution. It was explained that it is a tax levied by law on the seller of goods and services instead of the consumer. It is not sales tax.

Ms. Shelton reviewed some changes that have occurred in the budget since it appeared in the paper last week and noted that the Commissioners will receive these changes in their package. She also said that she does not have the revenues posted that have come in as of July from June.

The meeting adjourned.

LAURA MCAMIS, RONNIE MCAMIS'S WIFE, WAS AT THE MEETING TO DISCUSS CONNELL ROAD ALONG WITH SOME MORE PROPERTY OWNERS ON CONNELL ROAD. CONNELL ROAD IS IN THE 22ND DISTRICT, OFF RAMBO RD. RONNIE MCAMIS SAID THAT CONNELL ROAD USED TO BE A COUNTY MAINTAINED ROAD.

LAURA MCAMIS TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT THEIR LAND WAS SURVEYED IN 2002. THEIR ADDRESS IS ACTUALLY BISHOP LOOP. THEY ALWAYS THOUGHT THAT CONNELL ROAD WAS COUNTY MAINTAINED UNTIL AN AUCTION PAPER CAME OUT STATING THAT IT WAS NOT.

ROGER WOOLSEY ASKED THE MCAMIS'S IF THEY WERE GIVEN A BUILDING PERMIT. THEY STATED THEY WERE GIVEN A BUILDING PERMIT IN 1987.

DENNIS CONOVER HAD BOUGHT A HOUSE AND LAND AT AN AUCTION RECENTLY AND STATED THAT HE HAD ROAD FRONTAGE ON BISHOP LOOP BUT NONE ON CONNELL ROAD.

LAURA MCAMIS PRESENTED THE COMMITTEE WITH A PROPOSAL THAT THE PROPERTY OWNERS WOULD MAINTAIN THE ROAD AND TAKE CARE OF ALL THE UP KEEP TO CONNELL ROAD IF THE COUNTY WOULD MAKE IT A DEAD END ROAD.

ROGER WOOLSEY TOLD THE MCAMIS'S THAT THE SURVEYS SHOWED THEIR PROPERTY GOING TO SOMEONE ELSES PROPERTY. ROGER WOOLSEY ALSO SAID THAT THE ATTORNEY OR THE SURVEYOR SHOULD HAVE BEEN MORE RESPONSIBLE. ROGER ADVISED THE MCAMIS'S TO USE THEIR THINKING CAPS AND TRY TO GET SOME DATES AND INFORMATION ON WHEN THE COUNTY MAINTAINED CONNELL ROAD.

LAURA MCAMIS TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT THE PROPERTY OWNERS ON CONNELL ROAD WOULD BE WILLING TO GIVE 25' RIGHT OF WAY TO THE GREENE COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT AND THAT THE ROAD IS IN DECENT SHAPE. LAURA MCAMIS ALSO TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT THE COUNTY HAD PUT ROCK ON CONNELL ROAD AND HAS PUT TILE IN.

HILTON SEAY ASKED THE PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE THE MAILBOXES ARE. THE PROPERTY OWNERS TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT THE MAILBOXES ARE ON BISHOP LOOP IN A CURVE.

TIM WHITE SAID THE COMMITTEE COULD NOT DO ANYTHING WITHOUT SIGNATURES NO MATTER WHAT AND THAT THE ROAD DEPARTMENT COULD NOT AFFORD TO TAKE ON ANY MORE ROADS.

LAURA MCAMIS ASKED WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF SHE WANTED TO SALE HER LAND.

ROGER WOOLSEY TOLD LAURA MCAMIS THAT SHE WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO GET A LOAN.

LAURA MCAMIS TOLD ROGER WOOLSEY AND THE COMMITTEE THAT SHE GOT A LOAN 5 YEARS AGO. RONNIE MACAMIS ALSO TOLD THE COMMITTEE THAT THEY GOT A BUILDING PERMIT FOR INA MCAMIS ONLY 2 YEARS AGO.

ROGER WOOLSEY ADVISED RONNIE AND LAURA MCAMIS TO FIND THEIR BUILDING PERMITS AND TO FIND DATES OF WHEN THE COUNTY WORKED ON THE ROAD.

KEVIN MORRISON ADVISED MR AND MRS MCAMIS TO GET RIGHT OF WAY PETITION WITH SIGNATURES GIVING THE COUNTY 25' RIGHT OF WAY.

DAVID WEEMS EXPLAINED THAT IF THE TILE WAS INSTALLED BEFORE 1987 THAT THERE WAS NO ROAD LIST OR WORK ORDERS AT THAT TIME.

HILTON SEAY ASKED THE PROPERTY OWNERS IF THE ROAD WAS IN GOOD SHAPE AND IF THERE WAS ROCK ON IT.

INA MCAMIS SAID SHE HAS BEEN PUTTING ROCK ON IT SINCE BEFORE 1998 AND HAS RECENTLY DONE SO.

MARGARET GREENWAY SUGGESTED THAT DAVID WEEMS AND ROGER WOOLSEY PULL DEEDS AND LOOK MORE INTO THE SITUATION AND CHECK INTO IT AT A LATER DATE.

NO ACTION WAS TAKEN.

KEVIN MORRISON ASKED IF THERE WAS ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

THERE WAS NO OTHER BUSINESS.

KEVIN MORRISON ADJOURNED THE MEETING.
