GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY Monday, September 17, 2012

The Greene County Legislative Body met in regular session on Monday, September 17, 2012 at the Greene County Courthouse.

Mayor Broyles called the meeting to order to transact business that is to lawfully come before this Honorable Body. Commissioner Seay led the Pledge to the Flag, followed by Prayer led by Commissioner Rollins. The Commissioners signed in on their key pads and the following Commissioners were present: Commissioners Bird; Bowers, Carter, Crum, Greenway, Hensley, Holt, Hopson, Kiker, King, Malone, McAmis, Moss, Quillen, Rollins, Sams, Sauceman, Seay, Waddle and White. There were 20 Commissioners present and one absent.

PUBLIC HEARING

Commissioner Seay nominated Alan Broyles for Chairman of the County

Commission. Commissioner Bowers made the second. Commissioner Sams made a

motion for nominations to cease. This motion was second by Commissioner Holt.

Mayor Alan Broyles was elected Chairman by voice vote.

Commissioner Hopson nominated Commissioner Robert Bird for Chairman Pro-Tem of the County Commission. This was seconded by Commissioner Hensley.

Commissioner Holt nominated Commissioner David Crum for Chairman Pro-Tem and this was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. A roll call vote was taken and the result was as follows: Commissioners Bird, Bowers, Carter, Greenway, Hensley, Hopson, Moss, McAmis, Rollins, Sams, and Seay voted for Commissioner Bird. Commissioners Holt, Kiker, Malone, Moss, Quillen, Sauceman, Waddle, and White voted for Commissioner Crum. Commissioner Crum abstained. The vote was as follows:

Commissioner Bird 11 votes; Commissioner Crum 8 votes; 1 - abstained; 1- absent.

Commissioner Bird was elected as Chairman Pro-Tem.

Mayor Broyles called on Mary Shelton, Budget Director, to speak about the Debt Policy for the County.

Mayor Broyles recognized two South Greene students attending the meeting for a government class.

Ms. Judy Sexton spoke about the action taken by the County Commission at the August 2012 meeting. Commissioner Quillen and Commissioner Malone responded to Ms. Sexton.

Commissioner Bowers called on Larry Parman who spoke concerning the tax increase.

Mayor Broyles read a proclamation concerning Domestic Violence Awareness month and a proclamation concerning World Alzheimer's Awareness Day.

Commissioner Seay called on Ronnie Lintz of Glen Renner Lane in Greeneville who spoke concerning the tax relief and tax freeze programs. Commissioner Seay called on Dan Walker, County Trustee, to respond and explain the tax relief program.

GREENE COUNTY TENNESSEE FORM CT-0253 Question #17

- The purpose of this debt issuance was to finance the purchase of six (6) seventy-eight passenger school buses. (Debt Management II. Goals and Objectives)
- The capital outlay note was approved by the Greene County Commission by resolution on April 16, 2012 after which approval was granted by the State Office of State and Local Finance. (Debt Management III. Procedures for Issuance of Debt)
- The capital outlay note was issued as tax-exempt debt. (Debt Management VII Debt Types)
- The estimated costs related to the Debt were disclosed to the Greene County Commission in memo form at the regular meeting on July 16, 2012. (Debt Management III. Procedures for Issuance of Debt 2. c)
- The revised costs related to the Debt were disclosed to the Greene County Commission in memo form at the regular meeting on September 17, 2012. The revised costs resulted in the original low bidder requiring a bond counsel opinion on the short term debt. Bond counsel opinion would have cost an estimated \$4,000 more in attorney fees than other bidders. After being unable to negotiate a lower fee, it was determined in the best interest of the County to award the note to the next lowest bidder. The successful bidder did not require a bond counsel opinion (Debt Management III. Procedures for Issuance of Debt 2. C and V. Affordability)
- The term of the debt is 6 months from date of issue. (Debt Management VI, Debt Structure 1 Term)
- The debt has one payment in 6 months which makes existing overall debt service level the income stream. The education debt is funded by property taxes and local option sales tax. Property taxes generally will be received before the payment is due. (Debt Management VI, Debt Structure, 3 Debt Service Structure)
- There are no call provisions or OID or OIP associated with the note. (Debt Management VI, Debt Structure, 4. Call Provisions and 5. OID/P)
- The debt is a short term capital outlay note issued to obtain a favorable interest rate (Debt Management VI, Debt Type 2. Duration b. iv, 5 Other Short-Term Debt)
- The capital outlay note was issued as fixed interest rate notes (Debt Management VII Debt Types 3. Interest Rate Modes
- The note was sold through a negotiated sale process (Debt Management IX, Methods of Issuance 2. Negotiated Sale)

Proclamation

WHEREAS, October, 2012 has been designated as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month in an effort to prevent and punish the perpetrators of this crime and to bring hope and healing to those affected by it; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence is the largest single cause of injury among women seen at hospital emergency rooms, more common than auto accidents, muggings, and rapes combined. It traumatizes victims, harms families, threatens communities, and children subjected to it often grow up to inflict violence on others, creating a cycle of violence that must be stopped; and

WHEREAS, nonprofit and faith based programs and their volunteers work closely with law enforcement, medical and legal services in an effort to offer critical assistance and support to those in need and the recent increased commitment by the federal government has made it possible for local communities to strengthen their response to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking; and

WHEREAS, Greene County wishes to join with other communities across the country in this month long effort to raise public awareness about how to prevent, recognize and stop domestic violence.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Alan Broyles, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of Greene County, Tennessee, do hereby proclaim the month of October, 2012 as

"DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH"

in Greene County, Tennessee, and urge all citizens to recognize those who dedicate their lives to battling this crime and to work together to find solutions to this problem in our community.

Whereas, Alzheimer's disease is a progressive, degenerative disorder that attacks the brain and results in impaired memory, thinking and behavior, ultimately leaving its victims totally incapable of caring for themselves, is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States; and

Whereas, currently there are over 5.4 million individuals in the United States with Alzheimer's disease and nearly 15 million Americans care for someone with dementia and

Whereas, many encouraging research studies are being conducted and several drug treatments have been introduced which delay the onset of disease symptoms, improving the quality of life for those afflicted and reducing the strain on caregivers.

Now therefore, I, Alan Broyles, Mayor of Greene County, do hereby proclaim September 21, 2012 as World Alzheimer's Awareness Day in Greene County, Tennessee.
