## ANIMAL CONTROL COMMITTEE OCTOBER 13, 2010

The Animal Control Committee of the Greene County Commission met on Wed., Oct. 13, 2010 in the Courthouse Annex Conference Room. Members attending were Lloyd Bowers, Robert Bird, Brenda Grogan, Margaret Greenway, Fred Malone, and Jan Kiker. Those members not present were Rennie Hopson and Anthony Sauceman.

Committee Chairman Jan Kiker welcomed new members Lloyd Bowers and Robert Bird. The first order of business was to elect a chairman. Bowers suggested leaving Kiker in as chairman and secretary. His motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Kiker then asked Eddie Key, Director of Animal Control, to give his quarterly report for July, August, and September 2010. He noted that during those three months the Animal Control Facility and its three full-time employees (including himself) answered 1,186 animal calls, conducted 33 dog-bite investigations, sent 11 animals to the state lab for rabies tests, with two skunks recorded as having rabies.

Of the 970 animals picked up by animal control officers, Key said 115 were rescued by various organizations seeking to find homes for them, and 809 were euthanized. The rest are still being held at the facility. Of those euthanized, he said 120 had health problems and 170 were aggressive, but 519 were considered adoptable. Key said many animals continue to be abandoned near the Greene-Hawkins county line and the Greene-Cocke County line, since neither of those counties do full-time animal control pick-ups.

Kiker said her highest concern continues to be the large number of pets that could be adopted but that are instead euthanized. Key said the problem with animal control as a county department is that it has no revenue source. He said the current animal control facility was intended to be twice as large as it is, but had to be reduced because of costs. He also said that in order to be able to control out-breaks of animal diseases at the facility, it should only be operated at 75 percent of its capacity most of the time, but, Key said, "we're over 100 percent every day." At some point, he said, an addition has to be considered, and if the volume of calls continues to increase, the county needs to either consider adding another officer or cutting services. Since he has been director, Key said, the call volume has increased by 1,000 over the course of a year, with the same staff. "You can't do it" indefinitely, he said. Asked for specific numbers, Key referred to his notebook and found that the office fielded 1,186 calls this quarter, compared with 649 calls in the first quarter of 2007.

Committee member Brenda Grogan asked how the county animal-control facility handles adoption. Key said if someone asks about adopting a dog or cat, the animal is transferred to the Humane Society of Greene County, which is nearby. He said that arrangement is the result of a contract set up by this committee years ago. #### **RESOLUTIONS:**

A. A RESOLUTION TO AMEND APPROPIATE FUNDS FOR THE GREENE COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM FOR THE 2011 FISCAL YEAR.

Commissioner Seay suggested that the sponsor name be changed from the Greene County Education committee to the Budget & Finance committee.

A motion was made to approve this resolution by Commissioner Seay and second by Commissioner Rollins and the motion was approved.

B. A RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS TO THE GREENE COUNTY PARTNERSHIP TO PURCHASE TWO TOURIST-ORIENTED DIRECTIONAL SIGNS FOR THE GALAXY SOCCER PARK ON HIGHWAY 172.

Tom Ferguson, president of the Greene County Partnership stressed the importance of having the signs for tourists and visitors to locate the soccer park on highway 172. An e-mail was also presented to the committee that had a maintenance fee of 50.00 for each sign.

A motion was made by Commissioner Seay for the resolution be amended adding the maintenance fee of 100.00 bringing the total cost to 500.00. Commissioner Bird seconded the motion was approved.

C. A RESOLUTION TO BUDGET FOR THE REMOUNT OF TWO AMBULANCES. EMS Director Robert Sayne explained that the best use of available resources is to have the units remounted at a cost of 160,000 rather than the purchase of two new vehicles. Commissioner Seay made a motion that the amount of 50,000 be taken from the General Capital Project Fund instead of the General Fund balance. Commissioner Bird second and it was approved.

## ANIMAL CONTROL COMMITTEE OCTOBER 13, 2010

The Animal Control Committee of the Greene County Commission met on Wed., Oct. 13, 2010 in the Courthouse Annex Conference Room. Members attending were Lloyd Bowers, Robert Bird, Brenda Grogan, Margaret Greenway, Fred Malone, and Jan Kiker. Those members not present were Rennie Hopson and Anthony Sauceman.

Committee Chairman Jan Kiker welcomed new members Lloyd Bowers and Robert Bird. The first order of business was to elect a chairman. Bowers suggested leaving Kiker in as chairman and secretary. His motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Kiker then asked Eddie Key, Director of Animal Control, to give his quarterly report for July, August, and September 2010. He noted that during those three months the Animal Control Facility and its three full-time employees (including himself) answered 1,186 animal calls, conducted 33 dog-bite investigations, sent 11 animals to the state lab for rabies tests, with two skunks recorded as having rabies.

Of the 970 animals picked up by animal control officers, Key said 115 were rescued by various organizations seeking to find homes for them, and 809 were euthanized. The rest are still being held at the facility. Of those euthanized, he said 120 had health problems and 170 were aggressive, but 519 were considered adoptable. Key said many animals continue to be abandoned near the Greene-Hawkins county line and the Greene-Cocke County line, since neither of those counties do full-time animal control pick-ups.

Kiker said her highest concern continues to be the large number of pets that could be adopted but that are instead euthanized. Key said the problem with animal control as a county department is that it has no revenue source. He said the current animal control facility was intended to be twice as large as it is, but had to be reduced because of costs. He also said that in order to be able to control out-breaks of animal diseases at the facility, it should only be operated at 75 percent of its capacity most of the time, but, Key said, "we're over 100 percent every day." At some point, he said, an addition has to be considered, and if the volume of calls continues to increase, the county needs to either consider adding another officer or cutting services. Since he has been director, Key said, the call volume has increased by 1,000 over the course of a year, with the same staff. "You can't do it" indefinitely, he said. Asked for specific numbers, Key referred to his notebook and found that the office fielded 1,186 calls this quarter, compared with 649 calls in the first quarter of 2007.

Committee member Brenda Grogan asked how the county animal-control facility handles adoption. Key said if someone asks about adopting a dog or cat, the animal is transferred to the Humane Society of Greene County, which is nearby. He said that arrangement is the result of a contract set up by this committee years ago. The Humane Society allows animals to be adopted if they are first spayed or neutered, get rabies shots and have an identification microchip implanted. This is all done for an \$85 fee, which he said is much cheaper than taking the animal to a vet for the same services. He said state law says that animals that are adopted have to be spayed or neutered unless the person adopting them pays an additional \$25 fee.

Key invited any committee member to spend a day or an afternoon or even an hour riding with one of his officers to get an idea of the workload. Kiker said she believes that Key "does the best he can with what he has to work with" in terms of facility and funding.

Grogan asked if any grant money is available. Key said he has applied for various grants and will continue to apply, but very little grant money is available.

Robin Quillen, who is a County Commissioner, said that Feral Friends is working with pharmaceutical companies seeking donations of supplies that would be used for reduced-cost spay-neuter clinics. She said she hopes to get some veterinarians to volunteer their time. "We hope to charge \$10" for the procedure, she said.

There was no other discussion. The next meeting will be Jan. 12, 2011. The meeting was adjourned.

WHEREAS, unless otherwise posted, the speed limit on all highways and roads within the State of Tennessee is 65 miles per hour except on controlled access highways with four or more lanes (interstate highways) where the speed limit is 70 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, from time to time the Greene County Legislative Body has exercised its jurisdiction in establishing speed limits on various county roads within Greene County; and

WHEREAS, after further consideration and in an attempt to provide some uniformity and consistency in establishing speed limits on county roads and to increase public safety, the Road Committee for the Greene County Legislative Body has determined that it would be advantageous to establish a maximum speed limit on all county roads that is within the jurisdiction of the Greene County Legislative Body; and

WHEREAS, after further study and deliberation the Road Committee is recommending that the speed limits be set on all marked county roads (marked being defined as a county road with the centerline marked or identified) of 45 miles per hour and all unmarked county roads shall have a speed limit of 30 miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, the speed limits above designated, that is 45 miles per hour for marked county roads and 30 miles per hour for unmarked county roads shall be established for all county roads except those county roads or portions thereof that are clearly marked with a lower speed limit than above stated (for instances a at school zone, dangerous intersection, or curve.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting in regular session on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2010, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that, pursuant to, *Tennessee Code Annotated §*55-8-152(d)(1)(A), the speed limits for all county roads that are marked with a center dividing line or lines be 45 miles per hour and that all unmarked county roads be 30 miles per hour with the exception that any posted speed limits denoting a lower speed limit such as for school zones, dangerous intersections, etc. shall remain as established and posted.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the effective date of this Resolution shall be January 1, 2011.
