WHEREAS, Each year the leaders of Troop 94 and the Scouts provide over 500 hours of volunteer community services; and


WHEREAS, With skillful leadership and expertise from the Scoutmasters, the Scouts of Troup 94 have recorded many achievements and a number of public service projects; and

In accordance with the resolution adopted by the Greene County Commission, which established and created the duties and responsibilities of the Audit Committee, the following report provides an explanation of how the Audit Committee discharged its calendar year 2018 duties:

REPORT OF THE AUDIT COMMITTEE

The Greene County Government Audit Committee is responsible for reporting annually to the Greene County Commission on how the committee discharged its duties with respect to the following matters:

1. The audit committee should carefully review all audit findings included in the annual financial report for Greene County, Tennessee, for the year ended June 30, 2017, and have consultation with the external auditors regarding any irregularities and deficiencies disclosed in the annual audit. The committee should satisfy itself that appropriate and timely corrective action has been taken by County management to remedy any identified The committee should determine what corrective action, if necessary, weaknesses. should be recommended to the County Commission. The audit committee, the Greene County Mayor and Director of Accounts and Budgets, and the external auditors from the Division of Local Government Audit met on April 25, 2018, to review the annual financial report of Greene County, Tennessee, for the year ended June 30, 2017. The auditor's report on the financial statements of Greene County is unmodified, implying a fair presentation in all material respects in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. The audit report of Greene County disclosed two findings along with the external auditor's recommended corrective actions. Greene County management concurred with each finding and provided written corrective action plans which are included in the audit report.

Finding 2017-001, considered to be an instance of noncompliance under <u>Government Auditing Standards</u>, relates to an oversight within the Offices of County Mayor and Director of Accounts and Budgets of not obtaining a current actuarial valuation report for other postemployment benefits before the completion of the governmental-wide financial statements. This information is necessary for the preparation of these financial statements and note disclosures as required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. The data necessary for the measurement and recognition of the most current other postemployment benefits has been estimated using a prior-year actuarial study, the effects of which on the current governmental-wide financial statements were determined not to be material.

Finding 2017-002, regarded as a significant deficiency in internal control under Government Auditing Standards, relates to the Office of Director of Schools in which the

purchasing and payroll computer software used by the central school office did not have adequate application controls. Due to vendor software design, the system permitted users the ability to change employee and vendor names during the check-writing process which would cause the printed check payee names to differ with the payee names appearing on vendor/employee accounting reports.

The audit committee has satisfied itself that appropriate and timely corrective actions have been taken by management to remedy the instance of noncompliance and the significant deficiency in internal control referred to above. Government Auditing Standards require the external auditors to report the status of prior-year financial statement findings. There were no prior-year financial statement findings to report.

2. The audit committee should consider the effectiveness of the internal control system (including information technology security and control); the effectiveness of the system for monitoring compliance with laws and regulations; and review of the process for communicating the County's ethics policies to County personnel and monitoring compliance therewith. The external auditor takes into consideration the County's existing internal control procedures over financial reporting for purposes of planning and performing the audit in order to express an opinion on the County's financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the County's internal control. This limited consideration of internal control is not designed to identify all deficiencies that might be considered a material weakness or a significant deficiency in internal control. As such, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies in internal control may exist which have not been identified. A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the entity's financial statements will not be prevented or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. The audit report did not identify any material weaknesses with regard to deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting. However, the audit report did identify a certain deficiency in internal control identified as Finding 2017-002 which is considered to be a significant deficiency.

The external auditor also performs tests of the County's compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements as part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the County's financial statements are free from material misstatement. However, the external auditor does not express any audit opinion regarding the County's compliance with those provisions. Noncompliance with any of those provisions could have a direct and material effect on the County's financial statements. The audit report disclosed Finding 2017-001 as an instance of noncompliance that is required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards.

The Greene County Ethics Committee formulated and prepared the Revised Ethics Policy for Greene County which was adopted by resolution of the Greene County Commission

on January 19, 2016. The County Clerk was directed to mail a copy of the resolution and the revised policy to each County office and to all boards, committees, and authorities appointed or created by the County and to post a copy of the <u>Revised Ethics Policy</u> on each public bulletin board in the County courthouse.

3. The audit committee should establish a process for handling employees, taxpayers, or other citizens confidential reporting of suspected illegal, improper, wasteful, or fraudulent activity under provisions of <u>TCA</u>, Section 9-3-406. The committee made known the availability of the toll-free fraud hotline (1-800-232-5454) of the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury where the public can report suspected fraud, waste, and abuse of Greene County funds and property. There is a quick resource link to the Comptroller's website from the "Elected Officials-County Mayor" section of the Greene County, Tennessee official website. In addition, the committee recommends management of the need to publish a public notice at least annually in a local newspaper of general circulation to make citizens aware of how to report suspected waste, fraud, or abuse of Greene County funds and property.

The Audit Committee Report has been reviewed and adopted with unanimous consent from all Audit Committee members.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A RESTRICTED FUND TO FINANCE AND/OR PAY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE GREENE COUNTY EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) has issued GASB Statement 54, and the State of Tennessee Comptroller's Office has determined that this new accounting statement is considered Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) applicable to county governments; and

WHEREAS, under GASB Statement 54, Greene County is allowed to restrict funds for specific purposes; and

WHEREAS, beginning July 1, 2018, Greene County wishes to restrict all net income of the Emergency Medical Services Department up to Four Hundred Thousand (\$400,000.00) Dollars after all EMS expenses have been paid. Net income will be calculated and determined as follows: being all funds remaining after deducting actual EMS expenditures and encumbrances, including workers compensation and liability claims from actual patient charges/revenues and other EMS income. The calculation will take place after the end of each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Greene County and the Town of Greeneville will then restrict each dollar up to a total of \$400,000.

WHEREAS, the amount to be restricted is to be calculated at the end of each fiscal year and the restricted balance is not to exceed \$400,000.

WHEREAS, if/when the restricted balance exceeds \$400,000, the funds will then be split between Greene County and the Town of Greeneville with 70% going to Greene County and 30% being owed to the Town of Greeneville; and

WHEREAS, in the event that there is a net loss for the year, up to \$100,000 shall be taken from the restricted fund and transferred to the County General Fund balance to fully offset the previous year's loss; and

WHEREAS, the expenditures from the restricted fund are to be determined and authorized by the EMS Board; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a restricted account as well as the policies and procedure to fund the account and expend funds from the account authorized by this resolution require passage of the same resolution by the Town of Greeneville to become effective; and

Farmers' Market Fresh Program

Promoting fresh fruit and vegetable purchasing at farmers' markets accepting EBT/SNAP as well as creating an environment of health and wellness at the farmers' markets through nutrition education programming. This program is turn-key which means the information needed to do the program is all ready, supplies and equipment are also included.

The Greene County Extension office is participating in a program called Farmers' Market Fresh. Members (program assistant or FCS agent) of the local UT Extension office will have a booth at the market where they will be offering food demonstrations, recipes, and research-based advice on the best ways to select and store some of our favorite summertime items. The best part of the program – each person who stops by the booth will receive a recipe card for the food being demonstrated that day along with some useful giveaways! At the end of the season, consumers could have an entire collection of recipes all featuring items fresh from the farmers' market. Recipes to be featured include: Blueberry Thyme Fruit Salad, Chickpea Dip w/ Fresh veggies, Bruschetta Salad, Kale Caesar Pasta Salad, Creamy Cucumber Tomato Salad, Broccoli Salad, Tomato Pasta Salad, Fresh Apple Salsa and many others!

Summer Assistant Responsibilities

Preparing recipes for Saturday demo either at the Extension office on Friday afternoons or at home (everything needed to prepare recipes will be provided)

Gathering all supplies needed for the market including displays, handouts, and incentive items before Saturday as the Extension office is closed on weekends.

Maintaining a clean casual attire while at the market- No spaghetti straps or short shorts, miniskirts, holey pants, stained shirts, tank tops. Just be appropriate since they are representing UT.

Collecting evaluations from consumers at the final 2 market demos for UT reporting purposes since this is a federally funded program.

Keeping up with how many people visit the booth (a good estimate is fine just try to average how many people you speak to.)

The assistant is responsible for keeping up with their hours and completing their timesheets and turning them in when due.

The assistant is to interact with the public and tell them about health benefits of the food being demonstrated that day along with encouraging them to prepare at home with their children.

There will be two children's challenge activities. These allow children to become familiar with the farmers' market. There are prizes for those that participate. The assistant is responsible for collecting these card and reporting them to the FCS agent.

They are expected to be present at the market the whole time the market is open. If something happens where they need to leave early or cannot be at the market, they need communicate with their supervisor (FCS Agent) ahead of time. We should not have to wonder where they are.

The position allows for one Saturday off, but not anymore than that, in order for the program to be effective we need presence there the whole summer.

What are the job requirements?

This person must be over 18

Having an interest in nutrition and food safety is a plus, but not required.

Must be able to work in summer outdoor weather conditions.

Must be able to come in on Friday afternoons for prep work or other accommodations

Must be able to work directly with the public.

Must be able to work with minimal supervision.

Must be able to communicate effectively with co-workers and immediate supervisor.

The pay would be \$13.50 an hour No benefits.



Site Information:

The area requested to be rezoned consists of three lots located between Highway 11-E, Six Oaks Lane, and Springview Drive. A house is located on the center lot, and is accessed from Six Oaks Lane.

Access for the proposed development would have to be Six Oaks Lane, given the amount of fill needed to bring the site to a level accessible from 11E. The width of Six Oaks Lane at the logical access point is approximately 22 ft. Because the only access for the trailer storage area is also from Six Oaks Lane, it needs to be wide enough to permit a semi- and trailer and a passenger vehicle to pass side by side.

Access from Springview Drive should not be permitted, as it does not directly connect to 11-E, and would route commercial traffic through a residential neighborhood.

Options:

- 1. Recommend rezoning the property to B-3 as requested, as:
 - The property fronts 11-E and is located across the highway from other properties zoned B-3, and therefore is considered an appropriate extension of an existing B-3 district.
 - The property located directly across Six Oaks Lane, the tractor trailer storage yard, is not buffered from the site, and could be considered unsightly for residential purposes.
 - The site could be buffered from adjoining residential uses, both for sound and appearance.
- 2. Deny the request, based on the following rationale:
 - Rezoning is unnecessary, as there are already two large vacant lots and a vacant building already zoned B-3, located across 11-E from the site, and approximately five more acres on the south side of 11-E.
 - The three lots are part of an existing subdivision.
 - The lots are more appropriately part of the subdivision, as opposed to potential commercial use, as the property is not visible from Highway 11-E.

If rezoning is to occur, it should be conditional upon buffering for sound and sight between the proposed use and adjoining residential zones, in order to decrease the impact on residential uses. Access should be limited to Six Oaks Lane, which should be wide enough to permit a semi/trailer to pass beside a passenger vehicle. This is to decrease the potential for a trailer to be stopped with the rear portion on Highway 11-E.



FAQ's - Enhanced Medicaid Reimbursement

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of the Ground Ambulance Assessment Program?

mprove access to EMS in TN by increasing EMS response vehicles on the streets and enhanced pre-hospital cardiac herapy/treatment through increased Medicaid reimbursement payments.

low is the assessment program funded?

The program is funded through a combination of state dollars raised through a broad-based and uniform ambulance tax and ederal matching funds.

low much is the increased reimbursement?

The increased reimbursement is \$140.30 for each paid allowable Medicaid claim during the identified period. Increased eimbursement is for claims "paid" during this period – not date of service. This does not change current and normal payment or claims as this will be in addition to those payments.

low often will we receive payments?

Payments will be issued quarterly. These payments will be based on medicaid transports that occurred each quarter for calendar year 2017 (CY2017). As we move into Fiscal Year 2018-19, payments will be based on quarterly medicaid transport peginning January 1, 2018 (CY2018).

FennCare has directed each MCO to deliver supplemental payments to providers that correspond to their submitted claims recorded during a given quarter. These will be paid out as physical checks from the regional branches of the three MCOs—AmeriGroup, Blue Cross, and UHC.

low much is the assessment and when is it due?

Each qualifying ground ambulance service will be assessed \$9.09 per transport in SFY 2018 – regardless of insurer and/or payment for claims. This encompasses ALL transports as reported to the state Office of EMS during the service's annual audit. The base period for counting transports is CY 2016. Assessment payments to TennCare are due 30 days from date of nvoice. Please direct all payment and assessment inquiries to TennCare. Assessments@tn.gov.

Nhat can we use this money for?

That is up to each ground ambulance provider service. However, the goal of this program is to provide improved access to EMS services throughout TN with increased EMS response vehicles and enhanced pre-hospital cardiac therapy/treatment. This goal has been communicated to the federal Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in our application for this program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 21st day of May, 2018 a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative that the County Mayor for Greene County is authorized to enter into an extension of the lease for the Driver's License Center on Hal Henard Road with the State of Tennessee, Department of Safety as provided in the Lease Extension attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A".

FIRST AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a Lease Agreement that commenced July 1, 2008 (the "Lease"), for the premises located at 1210 Hal Henard Road, Greeneville, Greene County, Tennessee; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants made herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the parties agree to amend the lease as follows:

- 1. <u>Amendment of Lease</u>. Parties intend to amend the Lease as provided in this Amendment. Terms of the Lease not amended or modified by this Amendment shall remain unchanged, except to the extent necessary to give meaning to amendments or modifications contained in this Amendment.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> The parties have (i) acknowledged that the term of the Lease commenced on August 1, 2008 and (i) have agreed to extend the term of the Lease for a period of three (3) years from the current expiration date of July 31, 2018 (The "Extended Term"). Accordingly, the first sentence of Section 3 is hereby deleted and the following is inserted in its place and stead:

"The term of this Lease shall commence on August 1, 2008 and shall end on July 31, 2021, with such rights of termination as are hereinafter expressly set forth".

3. <u>Utilities</u>. Tenant agrees to be responsible for all utility costs. Accordingly, Section 15 of the Lease is hereby deleted and the following is inserted in its place and stead:

"Landlord shall, at Landlord's expense, furnish all utility lines, facilities, and service meters to the premises, including electrical, gas, water, sewer, heat, ventilation, air conditioning, telephone and data services in capacities sufficient for the current use of the premises on a twenty four hours a day, seven days a week basis. Tenant shall be responsible for having utilities placed in its name with utility providers and shall be responsible for payment of monthly usage expenses for gas, electricity, telephone and data services in the premises."

- 4. Ratification. The Lease, as now modified by this Amendment, is ratified in all respects.
- 5. <u>Conflicts</u>. If any conflict exists between the terms of this Amendment and the terms of the Lease, as modified, the terms of this Amendment shall control.
