The Greene County Legislative Body met at the Greene County Courthouse on Monday, December 21, 2020 beginning at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was available for a limited number of in person attendees (50 or less total) with alive Facebook feed broadcast through WGRV and also via ZOOM virtual meeting application for those that could not attend.

Mayor Morrison called the meeting to order to transact business that has lawfully come before the Honorable Body. Commissioner Paul Burkey gave the innovation.

Commissioner Pam Carpenter led the Pledge to the Flag.

Mayor Morrison announced to the Commissioners that he had received a letter of resignation from Butch Patterson, the 7th District as County Commissioner due to the fact that he had recently sold is house and now residing outside of the 7th District.

Voting was conducted by individual voice vote. Mayor Morrison called each Commissioner by name in alphabetical order, and each Commissioner stated their name and stated they were present. Greene County Clerk Lori Bryant recorded and checked off each Commissioner present and those who were absent.

Mayor Morrison read the letter of resignation from Butch Patterson, Commissioner of the 7TH District seat.

Mayor Morrison declared the vacancy of the 7th District County Commissioner seat. He stated the vacancy will be on the Greene County Website and published in the Greeneville Sun. he said applicants may apply and submit a resume to the County Mayor's Office no later than January, 11, 2021 by the close of the business day, and a duplicate copy of their application will also need to be submitted to the Election's Administrator. The applicants will be consider on the vacancy for the Commissioner of the 7th District at the next County Commissioner meeting. Nominations can be made by any County Commissioner at the County Commissioner Meeting on January 19, 2021.

PUBLIC HEARING

Maria P. McPeck, owner of property along with her husband George McPeck, asked to speak for Resolution A in which she stated they owned a septic tank company and manufacture septic tanks.

She stated that the case with the County is ongoing.

Crystal Jessee also stated that there is broad settlement negotiations, which means no one has ever came forward and said how much would be coming to Greene County.

She said, "We would like to sat down and discuss trial strategies in close session."

Many Attorney Generals want to settle for the whole state and all entities in the state.

She urged for the Commission to talk to their State Representative's before the State's

Legislation session and tell them that Greene County's money and Greene County case stays here.

If by some chance it moves forward, I want to bring a resolution proposing a 5% pay raise for county employees to be approved by the budget and finance committee;" and

WHEREAS, Greene County has jointly and individually operated Kinser Park in southern Greene County on property owned by the County and property leased from the Tennessee Valley Authority for more than forty years providing campsites and recreational opportunities for the citizens of Greene County as well as citizens from surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, Kinser Park presently has 138 seasonal campsites and 23 weekend campsites serviced by a series of septic systems that are antiquated and deteriorating which can no longer handle the volume of discharge generated at the campsites; and

WHEREAS, because of the intrinsic value of Kinser Park to the citizens of Greene County, it would appear to be in the best interests of the citizens of Greene County and of Greene County Government to renovate the sewage systems for Kinser Park; and

WHEREAS, the Kinser Park Oversite Committee requested the assistance of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC) to analyze and study the needed renovations and repairs to be performed to all septic systems that would service Kinser Park for many years to come; and

WHEREAS, Eric Ball with TDEC, after intensive study of the needs of the Park, has designed a system of septic tanks and drainage fields to accommodate the discharge from the campsites at Kinser Park; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the next logical step is to authorize the County Mayor with the assistance of the Purchasing Department to take bids for the installation of the septic systems as designed by the Department of Environment and Conservation to allow the County Commission to consider the actual cost in making the improvements as described above to Kinser Park.

A RESOLUTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY CREATING A BUDGET CALENDAR

WHEREAS, in accordance with §T.C.A. 5-12-105, the Greene County Legislative Body wishes to establish a budget calendar to comply with State guidelines to have an approved operating budget in place by July 1st and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with §T.C.A. 5-12-109, if no budget has been passed by July 1st, the operating budget for the prior year will continue by operation of law without any further action by the Greene County Legislative Body required. During this time, each department is allowed to spend one twelfth (1/12) of their total budget each month. The budget may be amended just like the final operating budget.

WHEREAS, this continuing budget may remain in effect for July and August. It can only extend through September 30th with the written approval from the Office of the Comptroller.

WHEREAS, if the Greene County Legislative Body and Greene County School Board fail to agree on an education budget by August 31st, then the education budget will go into effect by operation of law. The budget will be equal to the minimum budget required to comply with the local match and maintenance of effort provisions in the BEP.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the county legislative body of Greene County, meeting in regular session this 19th day of January, 2021, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that the attached budget calendar be adopted:
