Our local farm families along with other farmers across this great nation provide for and feed not only our country but the world, and Greene County is the second largest county in the number of century farms and is home to the oldest farm in Tennessee; and

Morrison, Mayor of Greene County, do hereby proclaim the week of March 21, 2022 as Agriculture Week with March 22, 2022 as Agriculture Day in Greene County, Tennessee and ask that all citizens of Greene County join with me in thankfulness and congratulate all farmers and farm families for a job well done for their contributions along with other farmers across this great nation in feeding not only our country but the world, and for providing jobs and strengthening our local economy through agriculture production and its supporting industries and providing a lifestyle for growing families that makes Greene County a great place to live and work.

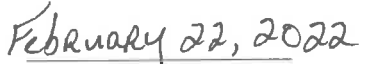

Josh Arrowood made a motion to approve resolution. Hoot Bowers Seconded motion. The motion was approved.

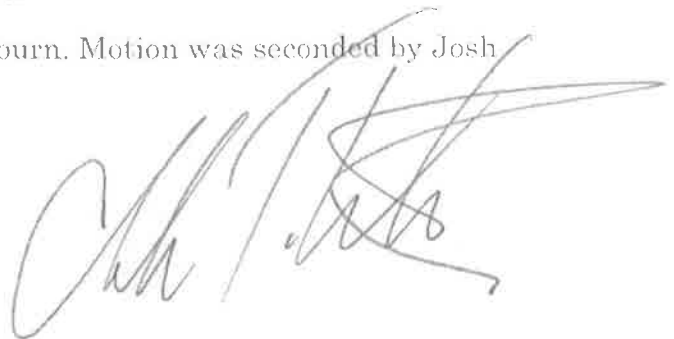
Next on the agenda was placing of FEMA money totaling 53,009.35.

The rapid Antigen tests would only be accurate if tested less than five days of symptoms and are not as accurate as the PCR test. PCR test takes 24 to 48 hours for results, rapid you can have results in 15 minutes. Megan will contact Dr. Lewis to see about doing the Antigen testing at the clinic. Megan and Erwin will be having biweekly meetings starting in January, Erin will be notified of any protocol changes. Occ Med does not see anyone with covid symptoms. Urgent Care has both testing available. Mayor Morrison called for a December 30, 2021 meeting with Ballard and committee members on the rapid testing.

Motion was made by Commissioner Tucker and was seconded by Danny Lowery to go into closed session. Motion was approved with no opposition.

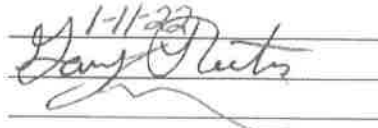

Board of Trustees Meeting Minutes

October 25, 2021

The Greenville/Greene County Public Library Board of Directors met for their regularly scheduled meeting on October 25, 2021, at 5:00 pm in the Big Spring Room at the Greenville/Greene County Public Library. Board members in attendance were: Chairwoman Barbara Britton, Eleanor G'Fellers, Susan Brandon, Sangela Blue, Erin Stayton, Teddy Lawing, and Kristin Girton. Judy Breckinridge represented the Friends of the Library, and Sarah Egan represented the Holston River Regional Library. Library Director Erin Evans and Assistant Director Christopher Gose were also in attendance. One member of the public attended.

Chairwoman Barbara Britton called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm and called for a motion to approve the minutes from the July meeting. Teddy Lawing made the motion to accept, with Eleanor G'Fellers seconding. The motion passed unanimously.

Director Evans presented the Financial Report. The first item she pointed out was the line item date for "Funds Available" was incorrect. The statement read, "Funds Available 07/01/2022", but the correct date is October 1, 2021. As of that date, the funds available for the Greenville/Greene County Library was \$122,462.56. The Library showed revenue of \$174,763.17, but Director Evans noted that there was still some outstanding revenue not listed on the statement. The Library received a \$3,900 gift from the Bartlett-Patterson Corporation and \$3,000 from the Friends of the Library.

Director Evans then presented the Director's Report. She stated that checkouts are way up due to people getting back out into the community. READS stats stayed approximately the same because those are online, and COVID did not affect those checkouts. Tuesday morning story time attendance steadily grew as patrons were able to attend more outings. Director Evans is considering doing an afternoon story time for school aged children. The Library will participate in Halloween Happenings on Friday, October 29, from 4-6pm. Friends of the Library donated the candy for this event. The Library received two grants this past quarter. The first is a Technology grant that was combined with the American Rescue Plan Act. The grant was for the amount of \$11,312.00, with local matching fund requirement of \$2828. The library plans to use these funds to purchase four new computers, conferencing equipment, and Microsoft Office software. The grant also provides eight thousand dollars to purchase library materials. The second grant is from the Tennessee Historical Records Advisory Board for \$2,137 to scan and catalog wills from 1783 through 1830 for the T. Elmer Cox Library database. More on this in the Cox Report. Director Evans also stated that Christopher Gose is redesigning the library's website.

Assistant Director Gose then gave the Cox Report. He stated that scheduling Tuesdays as a staff workday at the Cox Library has been a huge relief. The staff is able to work uninterrupted by the public, so they can focus more on helping patrons during library hours. The \$2,137 in grant money to scan wills will be

well used. The Cox Library has original wills dating back to the 1700s that will be scanned, linked to other data, and put on the website. Director Evans took this time to point out that the State was so impressed with Gose's archival index format that it is being duplicated by other libraries around the state. Impressive. Great job, Asst. Director Gose!

Gose then went on to report the installation of the front windows is complete at the Cox. The next focus will be on the chimneys. They have several cracks and do not appear to be stable. Assistant Director Gose is going to reach out to the Parks and Rec department and see if it is something they can fix. He stated that this will have to go before the Historic Zoning Commission before any work can be done. Parking continues to be an issue. More on this under Old Business.

Chairwoman Barbara Britton presented the Board Chair's Items. She stated that Director Evans is working on the notebooks for new Board members. Currently, Eleanor G'Fellers and Susan Brandon are the only Board members with a notebook. She also noted that there are a couple Board members that have not received their Certification or completed the Trustee Workshop. The completion of these by all Board members provides grant incentive, so she encouraged all members to please complete these.

Chairwoman Britton moved on to Board Officers. She stated that there is nothing in the bylaws to designate terms of officers. She wanted the Board's input as to whether to elect new officers or wait a few months to let the Regional Office get settled to decide. The Board decided to wait on the Regional Office and leave the Officers as-is. This motion was made by Erin Stayton and seconded by Sangela Blue. Motion carried unanimously.

Moving on to Old Business, Director Evans stated that once again the Book Sale was postponed due to COVID resurgence. There has been no sale in 2020 or 2021, which the Library depends on for revenue. It is tentatively rescheduled for the end of April/first of May, 2022. It will still be at the former Greene Valley Developmental Center, which is overrun with donations. Evans stated that Tracy Gass has offered a storage container and Police Chief Tim Ward has offered space in the impound lot for storage of donations. With that said, the Library is still generating approximately \$100 a week in book sales at the Library.

The parking situation at the Cox Library was next on the agenda. Director Evans stated that she, Christopher Gose, and Barbara Britton met with Brad Peters at the Cox. They decided the city's Public Works department will pave the Cox lot with the Library paying for all the materials. Peters will try and get it done before the asphalt plant closes in November. Peters also suggested removing the support columns to the back porch and cantilevering it to the building. That would free up some space for cars to navigate the tiny lot. John Jacobs is going to meet with Evans, Gose, and Britton on October 29, 2021 to discuss this.

Evans moved on to the status of the Big Spring Room renovations. She stated that she, Gose, and a few Parks and Rec employees are going to begin smaller tasks such as ripping up carpet, painting, and removing kitchen cabinetry very soon. The larger tasks, such as replacing doors, addressing bathrooms, and kitchen appliances and cabinets, will be dealt with after the first of the year.

In New Business, Director Evans stated that the Library's hours are now 10am-4pm, Monday through Friday. She asked for the Board's input on expanding those hours. The Board discussed, and decided to keep these hours through the end of the year. In January, Director Evans will consider reinstating the hours to 8 am-6 pm, as in the past. Evans asked the Board's opinion on closing the Library for four days between the Christmas and New Year's holidays.

Judy Breckinridge then gave the Friends of the Library report. She stated that the Friends will continue their Book Club Group after Christmas. Christopher Gose requested a list of books they will be reading for the website. Breckinridge stated she would get him the list once it was decided. She asked about putting up a marquee-type sign in front of the Library to advertise Library events. Kristin Girton stated she would check with the Historic Zoning Committee regarding a marquee. She texted Mr. Young during the meeting and he advised that a marquee in front of the Library would not be allowed as the Main Library is part of the Historic District in downtown Greeneville.

Sarah Egan then gave the Holston River Regional Library report. She stated that the Regional Director's position has yet to be filled, with interviews taking place in two days. Sarah passed out certificates to Teddy Lawing and Erin Stayton for completing Certification. She then gave Director Evans the information needed for the Summer Reading Program.

At the end of Egan's report, Chairwoman Britton asked if there were any questions or announcements before adjournment. Eleanor G'Fellers asked about scheduling a reception for former Chairwoman Ginny Kidwell. It was decided that it will be further discussed at the January meeting, with the event tentatively being scheduled for April. With that, Erin Stayton made a motion to adjourn, with Sangela Blue seconding. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:05pm.

Next meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 24, 2022, Big Spring Room.

General Card Requirements

A patron registering for a library card must supply the following documentation and information: (1) Driver's license, state identification card, or other valid form of photo identification and (2) written proof of current physical address. Any proof of address must have a current date within 3 months. Examples of acceptable forms of proof of address are:

- Utility receipt
- Official rent receipt
- Recent voter registration card
- Recent electronic mail or receipts with name and address

Other forms of proof may be considered if circumstances warrant.

Not acceptable as proof are:

- Library cards
- Social Security cards
- Personal business cards

The following information is required on each library cardholder's account: name (including middle name or initial), home address, mailing address, phone number, driver's license number or similar identification number (if available), and date of birth. An e-mail address and alternate phone number will be added whenever possible.

The applicant must sign the application acknowledging that all information is correct and that he or she accepts responsibility for all use made of the card. The applicant's signature on the application is a promise to abide by all library policies and to notify the library of any change of status (name, address, etc.) or the loss or theft of the card.

Cards for Minors

Children under the age of 5 are ineligible to receive a library card. If the applicant is 5 to 17 years old, the application must be signed by a parent or guardian. In signing, the parent or guardian assumes responsibility for the use of the card issued to the minor. The minor must be present to receive a library card.

Organizational Cards

The library may issue cards to organizations such as nursing homes or group homes, provided a representative of the organization is willing to assume responsibility for use of the card. Representatives of the organization may not use these cards to check out items for personal use or to use the library's computers. Family members of the representatives of the organization may not use these cards to check out items for personal use or to use the library's computers.

Applications for an organizational card must be made by letter on letterhead signed by the individual who will assume financial responsibility for any materials checked out on the card. The application must state that the individual who signs the letter will assume financial responsibility for library materials checked out on the card, including overdue fines.

The card must be kept by the organization and must be presented when materials are checked out.

Temporary Cards

Temporary cards may be issued to individuals who plan to reside in Greene County for a short period of time, provided adequate identification and proof of physical address are provided, as described above. Temporary cards will expire in 1 to 6 months, depending on circumstances pertaining to the period of residency. The expiration date will be determined administratively.

Only 1 item at any given time may be checked out on a temporary card. A temporary card may be used to access the library's computers.

Expiration and Invalidation of Library Cards

All library cards, except temporary ones, are valid for 1 year from date of issue. Non-resident cards are valid for 1 year from date of payment, regardless of the date of issue.

A library card may be invalidated by Greeneville-Greene County Public Library at any time if the patron does not return overdue materials, does not pay outstanding fines, does not abide by library policies, or habitually abuses library policies. The library reserves the right to suspend or revoke card privileges for any reason.

Lost Cards

The library assesses a fee of \$3.00 for replacement of a lost card.

CIRCULATION OF MATERIALS

General Circulation Guidelines

Patrons are required to present their card at the circulation desk at the time of checkout. Items limited to in-house use, such as reference books, microforms, newspapers, bound periodicals, current issue periodicals, and local history branch materials, do not circulate.

A maximum of 10 items may be checked out on a library account at one time. This maximum includes a limit of 3 New Books, 5 interlibrary loan books, 5 CDs, 3 DVDs.

All materials, except for items on hold, may be renewed once for the same period as initial checkout. After 1 renewal, items must be returned to the circulation desk for verification of

Dear County Mayor,

The State's Financial Stimulus Accountability Group (FSAG) recently approved almost \$130M in American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) funding to enhance the statewide public health infrastructure through capital investments in local health departments.

As you know, many local health departments are in need of updates, renovations, and potentially replacement. Through an internal assessment, the department has highlighted projects that are believed to be of the highest priority to enhancing services in your communities.

The department will establish reimbursable capital investment grants with each county government to deliver funds to support construction and renovation projects at county-owned health department facilities. These capital investment grants will require a local financial match for the proposed projects.

Local matching funds may come from the county's direct allocation of ARPA funds. The department encourages this practice as this would lessen the burden on local general fund obligations and align with the intent of the FSAG-approved capital investment program. Each capital investment grant will require a 25% match of the project's total cost not to exceed 10% of the county's ARPA direct allocation.

The department will take the next few weeks to establish infrastructure to administer this program, create guidance documents for the program, and finalize the estimated costs of projects. Once these tasks are close to completion the department will issue further guidance.

Your local health department and regional health directors will serve as your primary points of contact for these projects. They will follow up with further information over the next several weeks.

As always, I appreciate your partnership in delivering crucial services to the people of Tennessee.
