

ABSENTEE AND EARLY VOTING NOTICE

November 8, 2022, State and Federal General and the City of Tusculum Municipal Election

The Greene County Election Commission is hereby publishing notice of the early voting period for the November 8, 2022, State and Federal General and the City of Tusculum Municipal Election. Any registered voter who is eligible to vote in the November 8, 2022, Election may vote in person during a period beginning twenty (20) days prior to the election and ending five (5) days before the election (T.C.A. 2-6-102 (a)(1)). This period will run from **October 19, 2022, through November 3, 2022.**

EARLY VOTING HOURS AND LOCATION:

To vote in person during early voting, come to the **Election Commission Office located at 311 CCU Blvd, Suite 1, Greeneville, TN 37745.** The hours for early voting are as follows:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday- 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Tuesday and Thursday- 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- Saturdays (October 22, 2022, and October 29, 2022)- 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 Noon.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

The last day to register to vote in person or by postmark for the November 8, 2022, Election is October 11, 2022.

PHOTO ID REQUIREMENTS FOR VOTERS:

If you are voting in person during early voting or on Election Day, a Federal or State of Tennessee Government issued photo ID is required for voting, unless an exception applies. PROCEDURES FOR VOTING ABSENTEE:

If a voter wishes to vote by mail, you must request a ballot in writing over your signature. The first day to receive a request for the November 8, 2022, Election was August 10, 2022, and the **last day to receive a request is November 1, 2022.** For more information on absentee by mail eligibility, contact the Greene County Election Commission Office or visit the Tennessee Division of Elections website at www.GoVoteTN.gov.

A voter may make the request or submit an application to vote by mail, facsimile transmission, or email with an attached document which includes a scanned signature.

The voter's request can serve as the application for ballot if it contains the following information:

1. The voter's name;
2. The voter's address of residence;
3. The voter's social security number;
4. The voter's date of birth;
5. The address to mail the ballot to;
6. The election in which the voter wishes to participate;
7. The reason the voter is requesting to vote absentee; and
8. The voter's signature.

If the request does not contain all the information listed above, the Election Commission shall send the voter an application for an absentee ballot in order to obtain the needed information.
