On May 25, 2022, Presidential Executive Order (EO) 14074 (Section 12), State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Law Enforcement agencies (LEAs) must:

- 1) Notify their Civilian Governing Body (CGB) (i.e., City Council, County Government or other local governing body) of its intent to request property from Federal sources (to include Federal funds or grants.
- 2) Notify the Local Community of its request for property transfers, purchases from Federal funds, agencies or subcontractors (including existing transfer contracts or grants).

The Greene County Sheriff's Department may request the below controlled property items from the Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO), or other Federal source:

Controlled Property Description

Tents/Portable Shelters, Truck-Cargo, Truck-Tank, Vehicle Repair Parts/Components, Warm Weather Clothing/Shoes.

Regular Meeting

The Greene County Commission Education Committee met at 3:30 PM at the Greene County Schools Central Office for its regular October meeting.

<u>Committee Members in Attendance</u>: Chairman Bill Dabbs, Lloyd Bowers, Larkin Clemmer, Jan Kiker, Kathy Crawford and Paul Burkey. Director David McLain was present as well.

Others in Attendance: Kayla Crawford, Chris Malone

The Committee reviewed the minutes from 6 September meeting. Mr. Bowers made the motion to accept the minutes. Ms. Kathy Crawford seconded. The motion to approve the minutes passed unanimously.

As this was the first committee meeting of the Commission term, the Committee unanimously elected Mr. Dabbs as Chairman and Mr. Burkey as Chairman *pro tempore*. Mr. Burkey was also elected to be Secretary.

Ms. Kayla Crawford presented a resolution to move \$800,000 from the School General Fund balance to Federal Projects Fund 142. Because the State of Tennessee resources Fund 142 on a reimbursable basis, local funds are needed to provide cash flow while reimbursements get processed. This cashflow account already held \$700,000. The \$800,000 will bring the total to \$1.5 million to cover all Federal expenses, particularly the increased Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) expenditures that came as a result of the COVID pandemic. Mr. Bowers made the motion to recommend approval. Ms. Kathy Crawford seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. McLain presented a resolution move \$3.3 million dollars from both ESSER and Capital Funds to the Fund 177 Building Improvements and Architects lines for the purpose of designing and building a new wing at Chuckey-Doak Middle School, as previously approved. David Myers is the General Contractor. Mr. Bowers made the motion to recommend approval. Ms. Kiker seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. McLain then provided some accolades for the Greene County Schools indicating both current excellence and continued improvements. These include

- The Greene County School System (GCS) is one of only 16 schools in the state which achieved Exemplary status last year, the highest assessment level. Of those 16, GCS is one of only two systems, along with Williamson County, that has multiple high schools. Seven others only have one high school in the system (one of them was Greeneville City Schools) and the remainder have no high schools at all.
- GCS is now at the State average for ACT scores for the first time since compulsory ACT testing began.
- 9 of 15 individual schools were named as reward schools (Chuckey Elementary, Doak Elementary, Camp Creek Elementary, all 4 middle schools, Chuckey-Doak High Scholl and South Greene High School)
- GCS is now 64th out of 146 school systems in the State for ELA and Math, up from 110th in 2010.

Meeting adjourned.

The next Education Committee meeting will be at 3:30 PM on Monday, 31 October.

Tim Tweed and Gary Rector stated Building, Planning, Legal, and the Highway Departments approved the proposal. A motion was made by Kristin Girton, seconded by Stevi Misener, to accept the resolution. Discussion ensued regarding what would happen to the plats tabled at the September 2022 meeting that the Road Superintendent would not sign because of how the signature block was worded. Tim Tweed reported that, according to Amy Tweed, surveyors could go ahead and use the proposed wording, although formal adoption following a public hearing would not occur until the December 2022 meeting. This would ensure that the plats tabled at the September 2022 meeting, as well as any new plats containing state routes, could be approved. This would ensure that provisions in state law providing for the automatic approval of plats sixty days after initial consideration, would not be initiated. After finishing discussion, the motion carried unanimously.

Division of the Greeneville Energy Authority Property subdivision. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered approving the Division of the Greeneville Energy Authority Property subdivision for two lots totaling 1.45 acres, located adjacent to Asheville Highway in the 9th civil district. Staff stated the plat had been reviewed at the previous meeting, but action had been postponed pending the development of new wording for the Highway Department signature block. The Planning Commission was informed that a variance was needed to the requirement that a septic system be approved for each new lot, since the power station had no need for sewage disposal. Discussion ensued regarding the approval process for the proposed change to the signature block and the variance process. A motion was made by Lyle Parton, seconded by Gwen Lilley, to approve the plat subject to the addition of a signature for the Highway Department, and approval of the variance request. The motion carried unanimously.

Redivision of Lot A of the William Hall Property. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered granting concept approval to the Redivision of Lot A of the William Hall Property for

two lots totaling 0.78 acres, located adjacent to Kingsport Highway in the 16th civil district. No action was taken on this plat at the September 2022 meeting where it was first discussed, as the Road Superintendent would not sign the plat since the lots fronted on a state route (Kingsport Highway). A motion was made by Kristin Girton, seconded by Gwen Lilley, to approve the plat. The motion carried unanimously.

Jordon Dugger and Seth Dugger Subdivision. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered granting approval to the Jordon Dugger and Seth Dugger Subdivision for one lot totaling 1.049 acres, located adjacent to Whispering Oaks Lane in the 13th civil district. Gary Rector stated that the Highway Department could not sign the plat as the pavement of Whispering Oaks Lane stopped approximately 200 feet short of the property. Tim Tweed stated this was a lot of record, created prior to 1984, and as per previous direction from Roger Woolsey, County Attorney, the degree of nonconformity for a lot of record could not be increased. A motion was made by Kristin Girton, seconded by Lyle Parton, to deny approval to the subdivision, as the Greene County Highway Department stated that while the right-of-way of Whispering Oaks Lane extended to the properties, the pavement did not. The motion to deny carried unanimously. It was stated that the plat could be resubmitted if the question of increasing the degree of nonconformity could be satisfactorily addressed by Mr. Woolsey.

Ronald and Daniella Rednour Subdivision. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered granting concept approval to the Ronald and Daniella Rednour Subdivision for three lots totaling 7.596 acres, located adjacent to Phillippi Road in the 6th civil district. All signatures except that of the Highway Department had been obtained. A motion was made by Gwen Lilley, seconded by Phillip Ottinger, to approve the plat subject to addition of a signature by the Highway Department. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>David Taylor Subdivision</u>. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered granting approval to the David Taylor subdivision for one lot totaling 1.50 acres, located adjacent to Ryan Road in the 17th civil district. Staff stated a corrected plat had not been submitted as required, and a representative for the property owner was not present at the meeting. A motion was made by Gwyn Lilley, seconded by Lyle Parton, to deny approval of the plat, as a corrected plat had not been submitted. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Safety measures for Pritchard Road and Morrison Way (CMH Homes subdivision)</u>. Greg Knight spoke to the Planning Commission about their approval of the CMH Homes subdivision, located adjacent to Pritchard Road and Morrison Way. Mr. Knight stated that Pritchard Rd., before becoming a county road, was a 640 foot long driveway, and that there was a blind hill on Pritchard Rd. at Morrison Way. He asked how the CMH Homes subdivision was approved, as both roads were essentially one-way and too narrow for two-way traffic. Mr. Knight was informed the plat met the applicable requirements of the *Greene County Subdivision Regulations*, and therefore there

was no reason that could be given to deny granting approval. It was verified that, since the plat had been approved subject to the addition of signatures, and all signatures had been obtained, there was nothing the Planning Commission could do to rescind approval. It was stated that the Highway Department had signed the plat because there were no regulations in place that would provide cause for the Road Superintendent to refuse to sign. Edwin Remine stated his concerns over adding traffic to the roads, as well as adding lots to an area served by too small a water line, was why he had voted against approving the plat. He stated that the Planning Commission should look at amending the regulations to address subdividing property on narrow roads. No action was taken on the issue.

Safety concerns of potential solar farms constructed near a general aviation airport. Paul Straub spoke with the Planning Commission about the potential problems associated with locating a solar farm near an active general aviation airport, such as the Greeneville Municipal Airport and the Hensley Air Park. Mr. Straub stated that the main concern about potential negative impact of solar farms on aviation was where a pilot could set down a single engine aircraft in the event of an engine failure. The Planning Commission was informed the majority of engine failure episodes, which were responsible for the majority of accidents for this type of aircraft, took place on take-off. If a solar development was located within the glide range of an aircraft, and a pilot had nowhere else to land, it would be a very difficult accident to survive. In an effort to avoid problems Mr. Straub recommended that the proposed solar farm regulations maintain a minimum one mile setback between solar farm boundaries and the center of an airport. No action was taken on the issue.

<u>Administrative minor subdivisions</u>. The Planning Commission reviewed the list of plats that had been approved administratively since the last meeting.

- Charles Wilkerson Property subdivision, for one lot totaling 0.48 acres, being combined with adjoining property, located off Wilkerson Road in the 23rd civil district.
- Replat of the Richard and Linda Morrison Property, for two lots totaling 3.23 acres, located adjacent to Downey Road and Morrison Road in the 16th civil district.
- Wade and Wilma Crum subdivision, for one lot totaling 0.787 acres, located adjacent to Crum Lane in the 1st civil district.
- Hensley Air Park Phase III B, for one lot totaling 0.0 acres, being combined with adjoining property, located adjacent to Chuckey Pike in the 1st civil district.
- Replat of the Kimery Jones Subdivision Section 2, combining lots 2 and 3, for one lot totaling 1.40 acres, located adjacent to Old Jonesboro Road in the 1st civil district.
- Replat of the David and Darla Bowman subdivision, for wo lots totaling 5.169 acres, located adjacent to Anest Road in the 1st civil district.
- Kyles Gass Property subdivision, for one lot totaling 0.44 acres, located adjacent to Doolittle Road and Lonesome Pine Trail in the 11th civil district.

• Charles and Pauline Monk Property subdivision, for one lot totaling 1.00 acres, located adjacent to Quaker Knob Road in the 14th civil district.

A motion was made by Gwen Lilley, seconded by Phillip Ottinger, to accept the list. The motion carried unanimously.

Monthly activity report for Building/Zoning/Planning Office. Tim Tweed discussed the monthly department activity report. A motion was made by Gary Rector, seconded by Lyle Parton, to accept the report. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Other Business</u>. The Planning Commission was reminded the next meeting would be held on November 7, 2022, instead of November 8, the usual meeting date, because of the election.

Kriston Girton stated a meeting had been held with a company out of Ohio regarding a comprehensive land use plan. The County Commission would be asked to consider approving the proposal and its funding, although Kevin Morrison stated the county grant writer had already been authorized to look for alternative funding sources. Mayor Morrison informed the Planning Commission the company would look at zoning, conduct research, hold public meetings, and conduct public on-line surveys. It would be a 12 month process with an initial fee of \$100,000. Ms. Girton stated that the one year time frame for the study meant the moratorium on solar farms would need to be extended for an additional six months, which would take the agreement of Silicon Ranch, the company impacted by the existing moratorium.

There being no other business, a motion was made by Lyle Parton, seconded by Edwin Remine, to adjourn. The motion carried unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 2:05 p.m.

Greeneville/Greene County Public Library Board of Trustee Meeting Minutes July 25, 2022

Main Library/Big Spring Room

The Greeneville/Greene County Public Library Board of Trustees met for their regularly scheduled quarterly meeting at 5pm on July 25, 2022. Board members in attendance were: Chairperson Barbara Britton, Eleanor G'Fellers, Sangela Blue, Teddy Lawing, Erin Stayton, Kristen Girton, and Susan Brandon. Library Director Erin Evans and Assistant Director Christopher Gose were also in attendance. Friends of the Library was represented by Friends President Diane Strimer. Sarah Egan, representing Holston River Regional Library, was present as well.

Chairperson Barbara Britton called the meeting to order at 5pm. She stated that two sets of meeting minutes required approval: the last quarterly meeting on April 25, 2022, and a called meeting on May 9, 2022. Ms. Britton asked for a motion to accept the April minutes. Sangela Blue made the motion to accept the minutes as presented, with Eleanor G'Fellers seconding. Motion passed unanimously. Ms. Britton then asked for a motion to pass the May 9 minutes. Eleanor G'Fellers made the motion to accept the minutes as presented, with Teddy Lawing seconding. Motion passed unanimously.

Chairperson Britton then asked Director Evans for the Financial Report. Director Evans began by stating the report was unaudited for the period ending June 30, 2022. In Revenue, Director Evans stated that the period of FY2021-22 began with approximately \$24,000 and ended with a little over \$60,000. The library is doing well. She pointed out that the County appropriation was a little over \$1600 short for the library to be in compliance with the State, the total should be \$117,500. She anticipated this being corrected. In Miscellaneous Revenue, the annual Book Sale raised \$48,500 at their 2022 book sale. When the \$2500 Modern Woodman contribution was added, the Book Sale raised a total of \$51,000. In grant revenue, approximately \$6,000 in funds have been spent but not reimbursed yet. This will be recorded on the next fiscal year. In Expenditures, Director Evans stated that approximately \$3,000 of outstanding purchases for the American Rescue Plan Act grant will be added to fiscal year 2021/2022. She noted that salaries were lower due to the library being open shortened hours through 2021 and not being open on Saturdays until April 2022, due to Covid restrictions.

Director Evans promptly moved on to the Directors Report. She stated the Summer Reading Program was a huge success, with an average of 90 children every Tuesday in the months of May and June. She noted that the children logged on for 54,599 minutes of reading, or approximately 910 hours. That is approximately 10 hours of reading per child that participated in the program. New Circulation Clerk Jonathan Cook began last week, replacing LeAnne. He is off to a fine start and knows a lot about technology. The library finished spending the American Rescue Plan Act grant in June by purchasing 3 new computers, Microsoft Office software for staff and public computers, and \$8,000 worth of books for the collection. When reviewing the statistics, Assistant Director Gose pointed out the increase in issuance of library cards this quarter. Kristen Girton asked if the cards were being made for permanent residents only. Gose responded that the majority or cards are for permanent residents, but that the library continues to issue temporary cards for residents in campgrounds and other transient housing.

Assistant Director Gose moved on to the Cox Library report. He stated that summer has brought a boom of patrons. He also thanked the Genealogy Society for donating \$1000. The Wills and Probate Grant has been completed and all grant reports have been submitted. Overall, he stated that the Cox Library is right where it needs to be. He said he would speak on parking lot and chimney repair during the "Old Business" section of the Board's Chair items on the agenda.

Chairperson Britton began Board Chair Items. In Budget Appropriations, she stated that the County Commission was asked to increase the budget for the library by \$20,500. The County Commission approved the increase. The County's annual appropriation is now \$138,000. The city was asked for an additional \$5,000 to be added to their annual appropriation, so the City and County would be the same. The city gave an additional \$17,000 to the appropriation and is now at \$150,000 annually, beginning fiscal year 2022-2023. Ms. Britton then asked Director Evans about notary services at the library. Evans stated that notary services were now in use but some confusion about what to charge was occurring. A fee of \$5 was decided, and Director Evans stated that she would start advertising the service on the library's website and Facebook page.

In Old Business, Chairperson Britton asked Christopher Gose for an update on the chimney repair and parking lot paving at the Cox. He stated that he and Director Evans had spoken to John Darnell at Greeneville Parks and Recreation and had two different ideas on repair for the chimneys. One was to cap the chimneys at the roof line, and the other was to restore the chimneys to their original height. He stated the estimate to restore the chimneys was around \$12,000, which the Board had previously approved. John Darnell is working on getting formal bids for repair. On the paving issue, Director Evans stated that Brad Peters has resigned as Public Works director. She stated that she and Gose will work with the new Public Works director to get the parking lot on the schedule for September 2022. Moving on to the Big Spring Room renovations, Gose stated they are ready to go. He stated that in the next two weeks, the stove and carpeting would be removed. After that, he and Director Evans will paint. John Darnell is getting bids for ADA compliant doors for the exterior, interior, and restroom. Evans stated the cost of these doors and installation will be approximately \$20,000. She stated that Darnell said Parks and Recreation employees can help with the bathroom and kitchen renovations once outside jobs slow down for Parks and Rec due to Fall/Winter weather.

In New Business, Director Evans asked the Board to approve a 3% Cost of Living pay increase for full-time library employees, which is equal to what the Town had approved for other departments. All library employees would get a step increase according to the Town's pay scale. Director Evans stated the fiscal year 2021-2022 budget for salaries was \$184,513. With the pay increase the budget for salaries in fiscal year would be \$202,103, a difference of \$17,590. Ms. Britton asked for a motion to approve the pay increase, with Erin Stayton making the motion and Sangela Blue seconding. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairperson Britton then asked Diane Strimer for a Friends of the Library report. Ms. Strimer stated the Friends has started a new book group. Judy Breckinridge will write a newspaper article highlighting the new group, which will hopefully increase participation. She stated all information is on the library's Facebook page. She stated the Friends of the Library annual meeting will be October 15, 2022 at 2:00 pm at the Main Library.

Ms. Britton then directed Sarah Egan, representing Holston River Regional Library, to begin her report. Ms. Egan presented Trustee Certificates to Sangela Blue and Kristen Girton for completing Trustee

training. This puts the library at 100% compliance. Mrs. Egan thanked Director Evans for completing the Title VI report early. She also stated that the new State Librarian started today, and she was looking forward to working with him. She stated there are two trainings coming up, with a virtual offering for Legal Issues training on August 3. She stated that she would send Director Evans information on this very soon. She also stated a CPR training will be held on September 25, 2022, and the annual Trustee Workshop will be held in Jefferson City on October 19, 2022.

Chairperson Britton thanked M s. Egan and asked if there were any announcements. Director Evans thanked the Board for being so easy to work with.

Chairperson Britton asked for a motion to adjourn, with Sangela Blue making the motion and Teddy Lawing seconding. The motion passed unanimously. The next scheduled meeting will be on October 24, 2022.

Meeting adjourned at 5:38 pm.

AMENDED COVID-19 POLICY

GREENE COUNTY HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES AFFECTED BY A POSITIVE COVID-19 TEST

Greene County Highway Department employees will be required to stay at home for a maximum of five (5) calendar days after receiving a positive test, AND shall produce a copy of a positive test in order to be placed on administrative leave. Based upon current CDC recommendations, it is suggested that positive Covid-19 employees isolate at home as to not infect any other individuals that they might encounter.
