ABSENTEE & EARLY VOTING NOTICE

March 5, 2024, Presidential Preference Primary, County Primary, & the Town of Greeneville City School Board Primary Election

The Greene County Election Commission is hereby publishing notice of the early voting period for March 5, 2024, Presidential Preference Primary, County Primary, and the Town of Greeneville City School Board Primary Election. Any registered voter who is eligible to vote in the March 5, 2024, Election may vote in person during a period beginning twenty (20) days prior to the election and ending seven (7) days before the election (T.C.A. 2-6-102 (c)). This period will run from **February 14, 2024, through February 27, 2024.**

EARLY VOTING HOURS AND LOCATION:

To vote in person during early voting, come to the Election Commission Office located at 311 CCU Blvd, Suite 1, Greeneville, TN 37745. The hours for early voting are as follows:

- Monday, Wednesday, and Friday- 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Tuesday and Thursday- 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- Saturdays (February 17, 2024, and February 24, 2024)- 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 Noon.

The Greene County Election Commission will be closed on Monday, February 19, 2024, in observance of President's Day; therefore, there will be no early voting on February 19, 2024.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE:

The last day to register to vote in person or by postmark for the March 5, 2024, Election is February 5, 2024.

PHOTO ID REQUIREMENTS FOR VOTERS:

If you are voting in person during early voting or on Election Day, a Federal or State of Tennessee Government issued photo ID is required for voting, unless an exception applies. PROCEDURES FOR VOTING ABSENTEE:

If a voter wishes to vote by mail, you must request a ballot in writing over your signature. The first day to receive a request for the March 5, 2024, Election was December 6, 2023, and the **last day to receive a request is February 27, 2024.** For more information on absentee by mail eligibility, contact the Greene County Election Commission Office or visit the Tennessee Division of Elections website at www.GoVoteTN.gov.

A voter may make the request or submit an application to vote by mail, facsimile transmission, or email with an attached document which includes a scanned signature.

The voter's request can serve as the application for ballot if it contains the following information:

- 1. The voter's name:
- 2. The voter's address of residence;
- 3. The voter's social security number;
- 4. The voter's date of birth;
- 5. The address to mail the ballot to;
- 6. The election in which the voter wishes to participate;
- 7. The reason the voter is requesting to vote absentee; and
- 8. The voter's signature.

If the request does not contain all the information listed above, the Election Commission shall send the voter an application for an absentee ballot in order to obtain the needed information.
