RESOLUTIONS:

- A. A resolution to amend the 2024-2025 fiscal year Greene County Schools General Purpose budget for Sparc Grant. Motion was made to approve by Commissioner Quillen and was seconded by Commissioner Burkey. Motion carried.
- B. A resolution authorizing expenditure of funds from the Animal Control Vaccination Restricted fund to purchase one truck and corresponding equipment for the Animal Control Department not to exceed \$65,000 for the FYE June 30, 2025. Motion was made to approve by Commissioner Quillen and was seconded by Commissioner Peters. Motion carried.
- C. A resolution authorizing the appropriation of \$ 69,710 in Opioid Settlement funds Restricted for the use as set forth by the Opioid Abatement Council for the for the FYE June 30, 2025. Motion was made to approve by Commissioner Smithson and was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. Motion carried.
- A resolution to appropriate up to \$58,000 for the purchase of a billing and charting system for Emergency Medical Services for the FYE June 30, 2025. Motion was made to approve by Commissioner Quillen and was seconded by Commissioner Burkey. Motion carried.
- E. A Resolution to appropriate the current year's Opioid settlement proceeds resulting from the 2021 Opioid Abatement Council Act. Motion was made to approve by Commissioner Peters and was seconded by Commissioner Quillen, Motion carried.

DISCUSSIONS:

LeAnne Spradlin, the Operations Manager for Strong Futures announced as of September 3rd, the Strong Future residents have moved out of the fourth floor of Takoma. The furniture and artwork will be completely out by the 13th. The badge readers have been disabled and the IT closet have been removed. Currently the residents have moved to Locust Springs facility. The current purchased property cannot be used now because of the bridge needing to be widened for Fire trucks to be able to turn around on. This upgrade could be quiet of an expense. No total has been set yet. The proposed round of funding from the Opioid Abatement settlement for 2024 had been appropriated to Strong Futures back in March of 2024. It was to be issued to them once they vacant the fourth floor and to continue their program in Greene County. The abatement amount is \$330,064.50. It was suggested by Commissioner Peters that the previous resolution be amended. A motion was made by Commissioner Peters to sponsor an amended resolution to change the date to September 30th for funding. It was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. The Budget & Finance agreed to forward the amended resolution on to this month's September 16th County Commission to be voted on. The funds will allow them to assist in its efforts to combat drug addiction and to retain Strong Futures in Greene County.

Sheriff Wesley Holt, Treasure of the Volunteer Fire departments, reported on the Cedar Creek Volunteer Association Fire Department that were not noncompliant. They were written up due to lack of receipts. They were given 6 months. A new report shows credit cards were used to pay dental bills and food purchases and an Asbury Church ad. They are many problems within the Fire Department. Lot of deposits did not have slips to identify them to know where they came from. All deposits were sent to Chiefs home. Memberships are down to 3 or 4. He asks the committee if he needs to withhold funds because of the deficiencies. The committee says absolutely. They were given six months. They do not meet the Fire Association requirements. The ISO requirements would have to be a minimum of a 9 and a clean audit. Commissioner Peters made a motion to not give them any allocations until they apply and get a rating up to a 9 and clean up their audit. It was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. No retroactive moneys are to be paid out. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Trustee Nathan Holt and Partnership Director Jeff Taylor were present to fill in information on the TIF agreement resolution that has been proposed and approved by the IDB for the development of the stoplight that contains the Texas Roadhouse. Mayor Morrison said that he has had significant feedback from members of the Commission and concerns and issues from business people and leaders on this. Nathan said that we would be paying more into this TIF than Greeneville would. Greeneville would get to keep their 29% where that we would only retain 6 or 7%. Nathan says that between the Town and the School system they would get roughly 65% of the sales revenue. No action was taken.

NEXT MEETING:

The next regular scheduled Budget & Finance Committee meeting will be on Wednesday, October 2rd, 8:30 A.M. held in the Greene County Annex Conference Room, Greeneville, Tennessee.

Commissioner Peters called meeting to order in the conference room at the Greene County Annex. Quorum was present.

Minutes:

Motion was made by Commissioner Crawford and was seconded by Commissioner Dabbs to approve the minutes from August 28, 2024. Motion was approved with no opposition.

Reports:

Clinic – Leslie Jones gave the clinic reports for August 2024. There were 339 patients, which was 34 more than last year in August. There were 16 no shows (10 nurse visits and 6 provider visits). Leslie stated that most of the no show provider visits were spouses or dependents but a few were employees and she sent those out to the department heads. Leslie stated the clinic has started conducting the DOT physicals and the random drug screens for the county. Leslie also stated the clinic saw 30 patients on Monday which is the most they have seen in one day since they have been open. Attorney Woolsey asked Leslie if they have started the new hours of Monday -Thursday 7:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. and if that was working well and if all departments knew about the time change? Leslie stated yes and it is working out well. She went on to say they can get the biometric blood draw appointments earlier which means employees do not have to fast as long. Attorney Woolsey asked if employees had to have appointments for blood work? Leslie stated it was helpful if they did but if people came in for blood work and had been fasting she would not turn them away. Sheriff Holt stated that department heads need to stay on top of the no shows. A motion to approve the clinic reports was made by Attorney Roger Woolsey. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Dabbs. Reports were approved with no opposition.

Financial - Danny Lowery emailed the financial reports for August, 2024 to the Insurance Committee on September 19, 2024. Danny asked if there were any questions concerning the report. Danny said things were trending in the right direction. Danny stated that he hasn't had a chance to follow up with Chris Poynter and his crew with some of the things they have been talking about as far as medication costs, etc. Danny stated that enrollment and covered lives are improving, so nothing really out of the ordinary. Other Business.

April Humphreys, manager at the Greeneville City Employees Credit Union (GCECU), addressed the committee. A letter from April concerning certain facts about the GCECU was included in each committee members' packet. April stated that GCECU is a closed membership and only for Greeneville City and Greene County employees and their immediate families. GCECU also serves GEA, 911, Water Commission and Cross Anchor Utilities. April stated there are 3 full time employees at GCECU and with such a small number it is difficult to get medical insurance. The Board of Directors for GCECU has instructed April to inquire with the Greene County Insurance Committee to see if the county could or would add the 3 full-time employees to the county's medical insurance plan? The Board would reimburse the county completely. This would only be for the employee, not spouses or dependents. April stated that Commissioner Peters tried explaining to her about self-insurance. April went on to say again that she was under the direction of her Board in asking about the possibility of joining the county's medical insurance plan. Attorney Woolsey inquired with Budget Director Danny Lowery about how 911's insurance is handled and Danny informed Roger that 911 pays their premiums to the county and at the same rate as county employees. Attorney Woolsey then asked Jennifer Smallwood of The Baldwin Group what are the advantages and disadvantages of adding GCECU employees to our medical insurance? Jennifer stated that this would be a little different than 911, because GCECU doesn't have any actual affiliation with the county. Jennifer went on to say that she would have to check and get back with us to see if this is even possible. Attorney Woolsey would like to hear back from Chris and Jennifer before the county decides how to proceed. Sheriff Holt also raised the question about if we did this, would places like Glen Hills and Cross Anchor utility districts also ask to join? Attorney Woolsey stated that at one time Cross Anchor reached out to the county about joining our insurance plan but then never got back to us. Attorney Woolsey asked that the committee table this discussion until the next meeting and until we get feedback from Chris and Jennifer.

Jennifer Smallwood with The Baldwin Group then introduced Danae Powers, who will be taking Jennifer's position as she will be taking a new role within The Baldwin Group. Danae will now be the primary point of contact for Greene County.

Motion to adjourn and go into closed session was made by Sheriff Holt. Motion was seconded by Budget Director Danny Lowery. There was no opposition.

Minutes of the Greene County Board of Zoning Appeals

A meeting of the Greene County Board of Zoning Appeals was held on Tuesday, May 28, 2024.

The Chairman called the meeting to order and welcomed attendees.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>. The Chairman asked if members had received the draft minutes of the April 30, 2024 meeting. A motion was made by Bill Dabbs, seconded by Robert Wilhoit, to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Swearing in of witnesses</u>. Chairman Crawford swore in Webster Booze and Building Commissioner Tim Tweed.

12 Rehobeth Road. The Board considered a request to grant a variance decreasing the required front yard setback for a home to be located at 12 Rehobeth Road (tax parcel 173-039.18), from 55 feet to 46 fee). David Crum asked if 811 had been contacted, stating he thought 811 should be contacted before variances are granted. Tim Tweed stated that there were no regulations or guidelines requiring the County to contact 811. After discussion it was agreed that the BZA application would be revised to add a question asking if 811 had been contacted, and to require the owner/applicant to contact them prior to the BZA meeting.

Tim Tweed stated the lot had several issues which limited use of the property.

- 1. It was a corner lot, so the side yard setback along Houston Valley Road had to be increased from the standard twelve feet to eighteen (18) feet.
- 2. As could be noted on the attached survey, the front lot line formed an acute angle along Rehobeth Church Lane, decreasing potential building area.
- 3. The lot line along Houston Valley Road was greatly impacted by an unusual amount of right-of-way,

- 4. Any structure built on the site had to set back at least ten (10) feet from the overhead power line that crossed the property at an angle.
- 5. There was a drainage way that also crossed the property at an angle. The buildable area of the property was limited by this because field lines had to be at least twenty-five (25) feet from drainage areas.
- 6. The perk holes approved for the septic system were located in the rear of the property, so the house couldn't be placed to the rear of the lot.

Tim Tweed stated a variance would not be needed if the home was placed perpendicular to Houston Valley Road, but this would involve disturbing soil on the property in an area where it would negatively impact the septic system. If a variance was not granted, the property would be virtually unbuildable.

David Crum asked if the driveway would be constructed from Rehobeth Road, and if it would impede the line of sight at the access point. The Board was informed access would be from Rehobeth Road, which had very little traffic, and should not impede the line of sight.

Tim Tweed stated he thought the request met the requirements for approval, as listed in the memo:

- 1. The lot had extraordinary or exceptional situations or conditions that would result in exceptional practical difficulties to or exceptional and undue hardship upon the owner of such property; and
- 2. Relief could be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent and purpose of the zoning resolution; and
- 3. Special circumstances were attached to the property which did not generally apply to other property in the neighborhood.

The Chairman asked if anyone wished to speak either for or against the request. There being no one, a motion was made by Robert Wilhoit, seconded by Bill Dabbs, to grant the variance as it met the requirements of the *Greene County Zoning Resolution* (listed as Items 1-3 on the variance request memo). The motion carried unanimously.

590 North Mohawk Road (J&J Warehousing and Storage). The Board considered a request to grant a variance decreasing the required front yard setback for J&J Warehousing and Storage, located at 590 N. Mohawk Road (tax parcel 070-45.03), from 50 feet to 18 feet. Tim Tweed stated the property owner proposed to add employees and office space to the existing structure. This situation was unique, in that the proposed expansion could only be placed on the front of the building. This was due to the presence of loading bays on the back of the building, and the driveway encircling the structure, none of which could be blocked or relocated. Holly Brooks asked about traffic on N. Mohawk Road and whether the addition would impede sight distance. Tim Tweed stated it shouldn't be an issue, and David Crum stated that drivers had a good line of sight in the area.

Webster Booze of SRK stated that they leased the building from J&J, and needed to add office area to accommodate staff being moved from another site.

Tim Tweed stated that Items 1-3 of the variance memo listed the grounds for approving the variance;

- 1. The presence of the existing trucking bays and travel lanes presented extraordinary or exceptional situations or conditions that would result in exceptional practical difficulties to or exceptional and undue hardship upon the owner of such property; and
- 2. Relief could be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent and purpose of the zoning resolution; and
- 3. There were special circumstances attached to the property which did not generally apply to other property in the neighborhood.

The Chairman asked if anyone wished to speak either for or against the request. There being no one, a motion was made by Bill Dabbs, seconded by Holly Brooks, to grant the variance as it met all the requirements for approval as listed in the Greene County zoning resolution (Items 1-3 on the variance memo). The motion carried unanimously.

David Crum stated that, typically, a record of the variance approval was made as an attachment to the deed. Tim Tweed stated Roger Woolsey did this so that if the property were ever sold, there would be a record of the variance.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Bill Dabbs, seconded by Jason Smith, to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Kevin Morrison called the meeting to order at 8:35 a.m.

Member Davis made a motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting as written. Member Peurifoy seconded the motion, and it passed with all members in agreement.

Old Business:

-Update on the roof by Roger Woolsey, who told the board the case is set for a hearing.

Woolsey also told the board that he contacted Mountain Motor Sports about donating two side-by-side ATVs as a sponsorship project. He met with their representative shortly after the last meeting. They expressed interest in sponsoring the range in this manner, but he has not been able to make contact with the representative due to scheduling conflicts.

- -There were no updates on the broadband project.
- -Mayor Morrison informed the board that he received information from Tim Churchill from TWRA to hold off on any new grant requests for a while. There was some discussion about the reasons why and it was decided that Member Whitehead would look into the issue.

New Business

- -Frank Waddell informed the board that the new road for the sporting clays range had some damage due to storms. Mayor Morrison is going to contact David Weems to look at the damage and get it repaired.
- -Waddell also informed the board that the 3-D archery targets had been destroyed by what they believed to be a bear. Mayor Morrison says that the insurance will replace the targets. The range staff is looking into ways to deter the bear from destroying the new targets when they are replaced.

Waddell told the board that a newer vehicle is needed for the range staff to service the range. He also explained that they need another trustee to help with day-to-day operations at the range. Sherrif Holt is going to check with his correction staff about getting them more help, but they are not getting people who want to do trustee work. Waddell also mentioned that they are still having issues with people coming to the range before they are open for business. He asked about getting a webpage set up. The board let him know there is already a webpage, on which the range's hours of operation are clearly listed. Mayor Morrison is going to contact the Greene County Partnership about developing a flyer about the range for distribution.

Captain Kevin Kimbrough and Lt. Brian Moore of the Tennessee Highway Patrol addressed the board about a fundraising project they would like to see implemented at the range. Captain Kimbrough showed the board a similar project done in the Knoxville region. The project is

hosted by Iron Mountain Sporting Clays in Kodak, Tennessee, and benefits the East Tennessee Children's Hospital. Captain Kimbrough would like to see a similar project at the range to benefit needy children's projects in the Upper East Tennessee Region. The board agreed with Captain Kimbrough and will look into the process for further action.

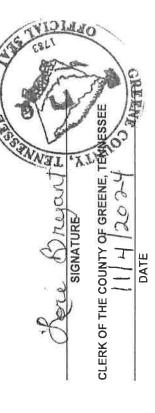

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between Greene County Commission and Greene County Mayor

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between Greene County Commission ("Commission") and the Greene County Mayor ("Mayor"), hereinafter the Parties. In consideration of those mutual undertakings, the Parties agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the Commission, is designated to accept and administer funds from the federal American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"), sections 602 and 603 of the Social Security Act as added by section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (the "Act"), Pub. L. No. 117-2 (Mar. 11, 2021); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor is tasked with overseeing the day to day operations of Greene County ("County"); and

WHEREAS, the Commission must approve the County's budget, and the Mayor executes the County's expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this MOU to memorialize their understanding of the mutual advantages of this cooperative relationship.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree to the terms and conditions set forth below:

I. Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to memorialize an agreement to obligate the County's ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds ("Funds") for those purposes set forth in the Subaward Agreement between County and the Tennessee Department of Health ("TDH"), TDH Agreement No. (34360-90423) set forth in Attachment "A", hereby adopted and incorporated by reference herein, along with any current and future modifications thereto ("TDH Subaward Agreement").

II. Conditions and Scope

The Commission agrees to provide, and the Mayor agrees to expend, Funds to perform the scope of work for the project as set forth in Attachment A, specifically in the "Scope of Work" and "Project" portions of Section A of the TDH Subaward Agreement.



III. Amount

The Commission agrees to provide and obligate the Funds in an amount not to exceed the funds set forth in Attachment 1 of the TDH Subaward Agreement and the Mayor agrees to expend the Funds in such amount.

IV. Term

The MOU shall be effective from the date executed below and shall expire on January 1, 2027.

V. Binding Effect

The MOU shall be binding upon the Parties hereto and upon any respective successors and assigns of the Parties.

VI. Obligation of the Parties

The Parties agree to the following obligations under this MOU:

- a. The Commission agrees to provide the Mayor the Funds in an amount not to exceed the allocation amount of \$1,000,000.00 as which is included in the amounts set forth in Attachment 1 of the TDH Subaward Agreement.
- b. The Mayor shall expend the Funds in an amount not to exceed the amount set forth in Attachment 1 of the TDH Subaward Agreement to pay for the cost of the Scope of Work necessary to implement the Project, as set forth in the TDH Subaward Agreement.
- c. The Mayor shall follow federal and state procurement and expenditure requirements as required by and set forth in the TDH Subaward Agreement.
- d. The Mayor shall ensure a complete procurement file for each contract necessary to perform the Scope of Work in the TDH Subaward Agreement is submitted to TDH with reimbursement requests in accordance therewith.

RESOLUTION OF THE GREENE COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY TO ACCEPT AND CONSENT TO THE TRANSFER OF ALL ASSETS, LIABILITIES, MANAGEMENT, AND OPERATIONS OF NORTH GREENE UTILITIES, INC. SUBJECT TO APPROVAL BY THE NECESSARY REGULATORY AGENCIES

WHEREAS, North Greene Utilities Inc., a nonprofit corporation was chartered in the State of Tennessee in 1970 with its mission to provide clean drinking water to the residents and businesses in northern and western Greene County; and

WHEREAS, North Greene Utilities Inc. (the utility district) has operated for more than 54 years always striving to accomplish that purpose of providing clean drinking water to the geographic areas served at the lowest cost possible; and

WHEREAS, North Greene Utilities Inc.'s unique position in Greene County, being some distance from a favorable water source has hindered operations; North Greene Utilities Inc. has utilized Lick Creek as its primary water source since its inception; and

WHEREAS, because of the turbidity in Lick Creek increasing the cost to treat water to make it safe for consumption and use, North Greene Utilities Inc. has incurred larger expenses to treat water than its surrounding neighboring utilities (all of whom purchase water) and has been forced to purchase water from neighboring utility districts to meet its customers' needs, sometimes at inflated prices; and

WHEREAS, North Greene Utilities Inc. has an aging water supply system that constantly needs upgrades in order to continue to provide drinking water to all of its members in its geographic area; and

WHEREAS, with a poorly designed and aging water treatment plant, financial pressures have increased, making it extremely difficult for North Greene Utilities Inc. to continue to operate; and

WHEREAS, after much thought and consideration, it would appear that the only option available and in the best interest of North Greene Utilities Inc. and its many members is to request that Greene County accept and North Greene Utilities Inc. transfer all financial assets, liabilities, management, and operations of North Greene Utilities Inc. to Greene County Government which is in a stronger financial position to make possible changes and improvements in operations and upgrade the water treatment plant and the water delivery system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting at its regular session, on the 18th day of November, 2024, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, to accept and approve the transfer of all financial assets, liabilities, management, and operations of North Greene Utilities Inc. from the Board of Directors and members of North Greene Utilities Inc., effective upon the approval of the transfer by the regulatory agencies.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor is authorized to execute such contracts, agreements, and documents necessary to effect the transfer described above and to allow the utility district to continue to operate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of the membership of North Greene Utilities Inc. to transfer all assets, liabilities, management and operations of North Greene Utilities Inc. to Greene County, Tennessee and the acceptance by Greene County, Greene County will assume the management and operations of the utility district upon approval of the regulatory agencies overseeing the water utility district.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that until the transfer is approved by all necessary parties, that the Board of Directors and employees of North Greene Utilities Inc. will continue to operate the water treatment plant and water delivery service to the best of their ability.

SUBJECT: Notification to Civilian Governing Body and Local Community

On May 25, 2022, Presidential Executive Order (EO) 14074 "Advancing Effective, Accountable Policing and Criminal Justice Practices to Enhance Public Trust and Public Safety" was signed.

In accordance with EO 14074 (Section 12), State, Tribal, local, and Territorial Law Enforcement agencies (LEAs) must:

- 1) Notify their Civilian Governing Body (CGB) (i.e., City Council, County Government or other local governing body) of its intent to request property from Federal sources (to include Federal funds or grants.
