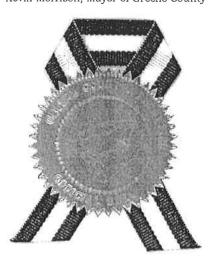

- Frank and Nancy Gioeni Seeking Hardship Easement

Frank Gioenic spoke to the Commission in regards to the 58 acre property of which he and his wife, Nancy Gioeni had purchased the property that had been illegally subdivided several years prior without their knowledge, and although the parcel has a legal right of way it does not have 50 feet of frontage on a county road. Therefore, a building permit cannot be issued to construct a home on the property.

The Commissioners were in discussion on how they could help Frank and Nancy Gioeni with this issue. After several discussions, the Commission moved to create a Committee to study solving road frontage requirement issues for some landlocked parcels in Greene County. ## **CALL TO ORDER:**

Mayor Kevin Morrison called the Budget and Finance committee meeting to order on Wednesday, October 1st, 2025 at 8:30 AM in the Greene County Annex Conference Room. A quorum was present.

## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Motion to approve the Budget & Finance minutes for the September 3rd, 2025 meeting, was made by Commissioner Quillen and was seconded by Commissioner Burkey. Motion was approved with no opposition.

## **BUDGET AMENDMENTS:**

For their review, the Committee received budget requests that had already been previously approved by Mayor Morrison.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

- A. A resolution to declare County owned property surplus, obsolete, or unusable pursuant to T.C.A. § 5-14-108, Sheriff's Department. Motion was made to approve resolution A by Commissioner Quillen and was seconded by Commissioner Burkey. Motion carried.
- B. A resolution of the Greene County Legislative Body to appropriate funds to the Sheriff's Department in the amount of \$60,000 for the annual allocation of the THSO Traffic Safety, THSO Network Coordinator Grants for the FYE June 30, 2026. Motion was made to approve resolution B by Commissioner Smithson and was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. Motion carried.
- C. A resolution of the Greene County Legislative Body to appropriate funds to the Jail in the amount of \$48,155 for the Mental Health Transportation Grant FYE June 30, 2026. Motion was made to approve resolution C by Commissioner Burkey and was seconded by Commissioner Quillen. Motion carried.

## **DISCUSSIONS:**

Regards to North Greene Utilities, Old Knox, County Commission passed to assist utilities infrastructure as related with flood and growing population. We sat aside funding inside County to give each Utility, if they so needed \$300,000 for that purpose. Construction of resolution, the utility could draw more funding if they needed more funding as long another utility agreed and requested use of those funds. North Greene requested to use the funds from Old Knox. They would be responsible to repay. Mayor was notified by State that we would get more HEAL funding, primary for the Greeneville Water Commission. Governor set aside 100 million dollars for debris removal and water sewer infrastructure. Greene County requested 17.6 million and was fully funded, arrived, and put into an escrow account for disbursals for entities that requested it. 14.1 million was requested by Greeneville Water Commission,

Link Hills Utility requested about 525 thousand, Chuckey Utility 1.3 million and Greene County about 2 million in debris management funds.

The agencies agree to pay back over ten-year period reimbursement loan. As they get reimbursed from TEMA and FEMA, they must bring receipt to Danny comes within 7 days. Around 35 million left over from Government. Greene County was notified that an additional 5.6 million remaining was leftover. That would be applied to Greeneville Water contribution from flood. Has not been received yet. No action to be taken from County, to be used for current repair and construction. Just informing everyone what is going on. Greeneville Water Commission is aware funds are coming. 14.4 million up to 19.7 million. Everyone has signed for this and sent into State. Old Knox has agreed permitting North Greene to use their funding subject to the approval by Budget & Finance Committee.

Subject to Old Knox executing the agreement transferring those funds, Commissioner Quillen has made a motion for the \$300,000 funds that were allocated to Old Knox to be allocated to North Greene subject to signatures. Commissioner Burkey seconded the motion. All agreed.

Mayor signed paperwork with TEMA, Highway utilized about \$600,000 State Aide bridge & road money to repair Birds Bridge. That will not be reimbursed. We had requested that they not do that. Should have been better applied to other roads and bridges in the County being that the State and Federal Government were going to pay for the damaged bridge, but that was not what was decided. Total project was about 3.6. Birds Bridge still being repaired. Overall funds. FEMA pays 75% for project; State lowered threshold for locals to meet for 5%, State picks up 20% and Federal would pick up 75%. The two Bridges are the Birds Bridge and the Easterly Bridge which still lays in river, Mayor says that the bridge constrictions will be done. Hopely, Birds Bridge will be opened by Halloween. State waved all requirements for Kinser Bridge but not doing that for our local bridges. Easterly Bridge is not going to be reconstructed in 8 months; a process of several studies and designs of engineer phases must be done which will take a long time. Same way for Conway Bridge, which is in Cocke County it will be rebuilt.

Takoma Hospital update. Building & Zoning are largely moving and will take place tomorrow. Building & Zoning will open on Monday in Suite 102. County Clerk is scheduled to move 16<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup>, and open for business on Monday 20<sup>th</sup>. Later that evening, the County Commission will have their first County Commission meeting. Computer hardware will need to be changed for voting system. Information will come out in County Commission package. There will be 140 parking spaces available in front parking lot, 14 will be handicapped spaces. Sheriff and Mayor have talked about security for meetings, thinking about putting in walk thru metal detectors for permanent security. First meeting, Sheriff is going to have security wand devices for metal detection, and then more permanent, there is room to scan everyone whom comes in room.

Core drilling going on for the Courthouse testing, repairs, projects need to be done.

The next regular scheduled Budget & Finance Committee meeting will be on Wednesday, November 5th, 8:30 A.M. Held in the Greene County Annex Conference Room, Greeneville, Tennessee.

Commissioner Peters asked Attorney Woolsey to clarify what this was for and Attorney Woolsey stated this is for doing particular services (physicals, drug screens, etc.) at the clinic for the county school system employees. Dr. Malone stated the old provider (Industri Care) for these services went out of business. Woolsey stated that the county schools are required to do physicals for Pre-Kteachers and aides every 5 years and they have about 30. Woolsey went on to include Hepatitis vaccines, drug and alcohol testing for DOT purposes and reasonable suspicions and random on bus drivers. Woolsev stated that Leslie thinks they have the staff to accommodate these additional services. Woolsey stated that they have come up with a price to make us a little money and will save the schools a little money and there is a contract (sent out by email to all insurance committee members by me) and all are in agreement with the contract. Woolsey asked if the committee members had any questions about the contract? Sheriff Holt stated his only worry would be if this could overload the clinic. Leslie was confident that this would not affect our employees and would not overload the staff at the clinic. Woolsey stated the plan is to try this and see if it works for everyone and if it doesn't that's okay too. Dr. Malone understands our first obligation is our employees. Woolsey stated this is a yearly contract but it can be terminated in 90 days. Attorney Woolsey is recommending we sign the contract to try this and see how it works and Leslie will be our eyes and ears and will let us know of any issues. Woolsey stated the contract becomes effective as soon as it's signed. Woolsey reminded Leslie and Dr. Malone to advise the committee of any issue that may arise. Motion was made by Commissioner Dabbs to sign the Service Agreement with the Greene County Schools. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Crawford. Motion was approved with no opposition.

### Other Business.

Danny Lowery stated Chris Poynter was on a TEAMS call and just wanted to remind everyone about the SHARx prescription program going into effect 10-1-25. Chris stated that the high-end and specialty drugs will be carved out of our plan and SHARx will now procure alternate sourcing for them either through foundations where we will try to get those drugs for free or through other sources for much cheaper but in any event the employee will not be left without that drug. Bill Dabbs, acting as Chairman, called the meeting to order and welcomed attendees.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>. The Acting Chairman asked if members had received the draft minutes of the May 27, 2025, meeting. A motion was made by Holly Brooks, seconded by David Crum, to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Swearing in of witnesses</u>. The Acting Chairman swore in Adolfo Torres, Roy Morelock, and Building Commissioner Tim Tweed.

549 C.M. Jones Road. The Board reviewed and considered a request to decrease the side yard setback for a home to be located at 549 C. M. Jones Road (tax parcel 112-005.03) from twelve (12) feet to five (5) feet. Adolfo Torres, property owner, stated he was building a house and carport in the same location as a previous house and carport. Mr. Torres stated the previous carport was not attached to the house but wanted to attach the new carport to eliminate an existing drainage issue. Tim Tweed stated the existing carport was permitted five feet from the side lot line because, being unattached, it was considered an accessory structure. Attaching the carport to the house made it part of the principal structure, and principal structures had a side yard setback requirement of twelve (12) feet. After discussion a motion was made by Holly Brooks, seconded by David Crum, to grant a variance decreasing the side yard setback requirement from twelve (12) feet to five (5) feet, as the request met the requirements of Sections 1004.3.2 through 1004.3.5 (i.e., the structure was being built in the same location as a previous structure, the carport would not be any closer to the lot line than the existing carport, connecting the carport to the house would eliminate drainage problems, granting the variance would not be a detriment to the area, and not granting the variance would create a hardship for the property owner). The motion carried unanimously.

655 Sanders Road. The Board reviewed and considered a request to decrease the side yard setback for an accessory structure from five (5) feet to three (3) feet, for 655 Sanders Road. Roy Morelock, property owner, explained that the property contained one house and two outbuildings, which were located near the front of the property. He wanted to subdivide the house and outbuildings from the 38.53 acres located

behind the house. The shape of the property meant that the only way to access the vacant area was to create a pipestem lot, which had to maintain a width of at least fifty (50) feet for the entire length of the "stem". Maintaining the fifty (50) foot-wide stem would place one of the outbuildings three (3) feet from the side lot line instead of the required five (5) feet. It would also decrease the width of the house lot at the building setback line from the required one hundred (100) feet to eighty (80) feet. Roger Woolsey, when asked to speak to the requests, stated the house was pre-existing (constructed in 1948) and that granting the variances should not adversely impact the neighbors. After discussion a motion was made by Holly Brooks, seconded by David Crum, to grant the variances as they met Sections 1004.3.2 through 1004.3.5 of the Zoning Resolution. The motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Holly Brooks, seconded by David Crum, to adjourn the meeting. The meeting adjourned at 8:55 a.m.

# Greeneville/Greene County Public Library Board of Trustees Meeting Minutes Monday, July 28, 2025 Main Library, Big Spring Room

The Greeneville/Greene County Library Board of Trustees met for their regularly scheduled quarterly meeting on Monday, July 28, 2025 at 5 PM in the Big Spring Room of the Greeneville/Greene County Public Library. Members in attendance were: Erin Stayton, Nancy Southerland, Mia Hyde, Carla Bewley, Tim Ward, Pat DeCicco, library director Erin Evans, and assistant director Christopher Gose. The Holston River Regional Library was represented by Sarah Egan and Lisa Livesay, and the Friends of the Library was represented by Carla Bewley.

### Welcome and Call to Order-Erin Stayton

Vice-chair Tim Ward called the meeting to order at 5 PM and introductions of the board took place.

### **Public Comments**

Nancy Laughlin asked to speak. She is concerned about the cost of making copies at the library. She states that the library already receives funds to pay for copies, and she does not feel that homeless persons should have to pay for copies. She asks us to consider that we adjust our policy on copies, especially for those who are unable to pay. She requested a copy of the minutes of this meeting. She will need to do a records request for those. Vice-chair, Tim Ward, stated that this will be addressed at our next meeting since it is not on our agenda for today.

### Approval of Minutes-April 28, 2025

Mr. Ward asked for the approval of minutes from the April meeting. He asked if anyone noted any corrections to the minutes and none were offered. With that, a motion to approve the April minutes was made by Nancy Southerland and seconded by Pat DeCicco. The motion passed unanimously.

### Financial Report - Erin Evans

Director Evans reviewed the financial statement. She provided an update on the budget for 2025-26. The town has increased its contribution by \$13,500. There was no increase from the county. In lieu of increasing the contribution, the count will be paying up to \$25,000 for sewer repairs at the Main Library. This keeps the county contribution at \$138,000. The total annual budget for FY 2025/26 is \$351,500. Nancy Southerland asked about what is included in contracts. It includes the library portion of the town audit, the library management software, and recurring services (i.e. pest control, copier lease, etc.). A motion was made by Pat DeCicco to accept the financial report and a second was made by Nancy Southerland. The motion was passed unanimously.

### Library Director's Report - Erin Evans

Director Evans provided an update on circulation and programming. We have a few more library card requests this quarter and reflects a large increase in patrons for the year. There were 43 events in the last quarter. The programs served 1210 children, 26 teens, and over 289 adults. 209 volunteer hours were logged. Four field trips were hosted this year. Pat DeCicco asked about children on field trips receiving library cards. Erin stated that information is sent home with the children.

Next, Director Evans provided an update on the sewer repair. Midway Construction will do the work. A date to begin the work has not been given. Public Works is supplying backfill rock and will repave the parking lot. The library will need to be closed while the work is being done. The county will pay for the Midway Construction work as well as the cost of rock and asphalt that Public Works uses.

The Book Sale was very successful this year and it brought in just under \$33,000. There were many volunteers and many members of the board assisted. The library received an extension for moving out of Greene Valley until September 30, 2025. The library will be storing books and fixtures at George Clem School in the bus shop area. The library is planning another community give away day in August while packing up the books.

The Summer Reading program was a success. The last program day was Tuesday, July 1, 2025. The library received \$5,000 in funding for the summer reading program. The money was given from Friends of the Library (\$1,000), Fox Foundation grant (\$1,000), Greeneville Woman's Club

(\$1,000), Buell and Mildred Brooks Bequest/Trinity UMC (\$2,000), and Andrew Johnson Woman's Club (\$150). The library spent just over \$4000 on supplies, snacks, decorations, as well as free books for the children. Parents provided good feedback on the event. There were over 250 participants this year.

Next, Director Evans shared that there are several grants that were applied for. These include the TOP Grant for Adult Technology Training, and they received \$1,250. As well as a Tech Grant, where the library requested \$7,540 for desktops, printers, and kids' computers.

New programming will start in August. These include: Storytime every Tuesday morning at 10:30; the block party on the 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday afternoon and 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday morning; and Crafternoon will begin again in September. In addition, there will be some new programs to be offered. These include: Stay and Play for mothers and preschoolers and Family Game night.

### Cox Report - Christopher Gose

Assistant Director Gose reported that the T. Elmer Cox library was closed on Juneteenth and Independence Day. The library was open by appointment for four groups. The Genealogical Society meeting was held on June 12, 2025, and a DNA program regarding the Melungcon heritage of East Tennessee and the southeast. The bookstore was removed from the website due to third party involvement with monetary transactions. Traffic/road closures created some issues with attendance. They hosted an Open House on May 31 and a Community Scan Day on June 14 with good community turnout.

The "20 Seconds Take on History" videos are boosting online traffic across all social media platforms. They are planning some interactive online giveaways for social media and Greeneville trivia. Two events are planned. Archiving on a Budget will be held on September 20, 2025 from 10am-1pm and Ancestry and Family Search 101 will be held on November 8, 2025, from 10am-1pm.

Further, Gose said they are applying for two grants. One is the TSLA Grant for James N. Hardin Collection and the other is the America 250 Grant, Category 1 Collection Development.

### **Board Chair Items-Erin Stayton**

### Old Business - Erin Stayton

The library building opened on Nov. 9, 1975. This year is the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The celebration will be in coordination with the annual Friends of the Library meeting with an open house/50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration on Friday, October 24 during library hours 10-4. The Friends of the Library annual meeting will be from 12:00-1:00 and an invitation will be sent to all Friends members. The event will be open to everyone in the community. There will be activities for children and the community.

### **New Business-Erin Stayton**

The first item is the removal of the rain barrel watering system. It is not working, and it has not been working for 10 years. Erin Evans asks permission to remove it. A patron asked if he/she could have it. Parks and Recreation said that it could be removed and given to the patron. Parks and Recreation will do the garden repairs. Erin Stayton asked for any comments or questions. Erin asked for a motion to remove the rain barrel and donate to a patron. A motion was made by Tim Ward to allow removal of the rain barrels and a second was made by Nancy Southerland. The motion was passed unanimously.

This item does not need any approval. The Emergency Procedures Manual needs to be updated. It was created in 2019. The updates will be ready at our next meeting. Erin Evans asks a board member to be the editor/proofreader. Erin Staten will provide this service.

Director Evans stated that the library board must approve a cost-of-living increase for the FY 2025-26 for library employees. Evans asked the \$13,500 from the city be used to provide a 4% cost of living increase for all library employees. Erin and Christopher then left the meeting. Erin Stayton said that new hires should be paid the same as current employees. The part-time employees should be paid \$15 an hour. Nancy Southerland suggested that we estimate the cost of increasing to \$15. We should look at the cost and gather the numbers for our next meeting. A motion was made for a 4% cost of living raise to all library staff. A motion was made by Tim Ward and a second was made by Pat Decicco, All in favor and the motion carries. A second

motion was made to do a cost analysis on bringing existing part time employees up to base salary of city base for part time employees. Tim Ward was the first and Nancy Southerland was the second. The motion carries.

### Friends of the library - Carla Bewley

Carla Bewley again invited everyone to attend the anniversary celebration. The Friends will do a cost analysis on the funds available to see if more funds can be given to support the library efforts.

### Holston River Regional Library report - Sarah Egan and Lisa Livesay

Mia Hyde has completed her Trustee training and received a certificate. Title VI training has been completed. Additional Trustee training will take place on September 24, 2025, from 9:00-3:30 in Jefferson City at the public library. One board member needs to attend. Additional trainings and information included in the newsletter.

# A RESOLUTION TO FIX THE COMPENSATION FOR COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS FOR ATTENDING MEETINGS OF THE SCHOOL BOARD BODY AND DULY AUTHORIZED COMMITTEES

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body is authorized to fix the compensation of school board members attending sessions of the school board meetings and duly authorized committees pursuant to *Tennessee Code Annotated §49-2-202; State v. Smith, 158 Tenn. 26; Smith V. Sells, 156 Tenn. 539* as long as the compensation for members of the county board of education does not exceed the compensation fixed for members of the county legislative body; and

WHEREAS, the time and knowledge necessary to serve effectively as a school board member and the number of complex and controversial issues facing the county schools has increased dramatically over the last decade; and

WHEREAS, in order to encourage good citizens to serve on the school board and to partially compensate members of the school board for the time and effort each board member expends in serving on the Greene County Board of Education, it would appear that the compensation for school board members should be set at \$300.00 for each regular or special board meeting that a board member attends and that the compensation for school board members should be set at \$150.00 for each committee meeting that a school board member attends

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Greene County Legislative Body, meeting in regular session on the 17th day of November 2025, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that, pursuant to, *Tennessee Code Annotated §49-2-202)*, the compensation fixed to pay board of education members for attending each regular or special meeting of the Greene County Board of Education shall be \$300.00; that is, a school board member is entitled to be compensated in the amount of \$300.00 for each school board meeting that the member actually attends.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that school board members shall be paid \$150.00 for attending each duly authorized committee meeting; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the increase in compensation for members of the Greene County School Board shall take effect immediately upon passage in that the funds to satisfy this increase have been appropriated by the Greene County Legislative Body in the 2025-2026 budget.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FUNDING TO THE SECOND HARVEST FOOD BANK OF NORTHEAST TENNESSEE RELATED TO THE LOSS OF SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (SNAP) BENEFITS BY GREENE COUNTY RESIDENTS

WHEREAS, over 7,000 Greene County residents regularly depend on Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits appropriated by the federal government to meet their basic needs for food, and

WHEREAS, because of the inability of the federal government to appropriate funding for SNAP benefit as a consequence of Congress's inability to pass a government funding bill resulting in the federal government shutdown, individuals and families did not receive SNAP benefits beginning November 1, 2025, and,

WHEREAS, the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee provides food assistance to those SNAP recipients who are not receiving benefits and has set up food distributions in the eight counties served by the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, on November 5, 2025, the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee with the assistance of Greene County Government and other related agencies held a food distribution at the Greene County Fairgrounds distributing over 3000 boxes of food commodities to 1000 families who are SNAP recipients at a cost of approximately \$40,000.00; and

WHEREAS, as part of the budgetary appropriations process, Greene County Government in the 2025-2026 Budget allocated \$28,000.00 to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast



Tennessee to provide food assistance to Greene County residents and the surrounding counties; and

WHEREAS, because of the emergency in the discontinuation of SNAP benefits by the federal government and lack of available food resources, there is a continuing need for funding by Greene County to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee if the federal government shutdown continues and SNAP recipients do not receive SNAP benefits; and

WHEREAS, it would appear that an additional allocation of up to \$20,000.00 to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee would be appropriate if SNAP benefits have not been reinstated to the SNAP recipients in Greene County by December 1, 2025; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session this 17<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2025, a quorum being present and majority voting in the affirmative, to appropriate additional funding to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee in the amount up to \$20,000.00 after December 1, 2025 in the event that the federal government has not appropriated funding for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this appropriation to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee will only take effect if in fact the federal government fails to make appropriations to fund the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program to provide food assistance to the SNAP recipients of Greene County by December 1, 2025.

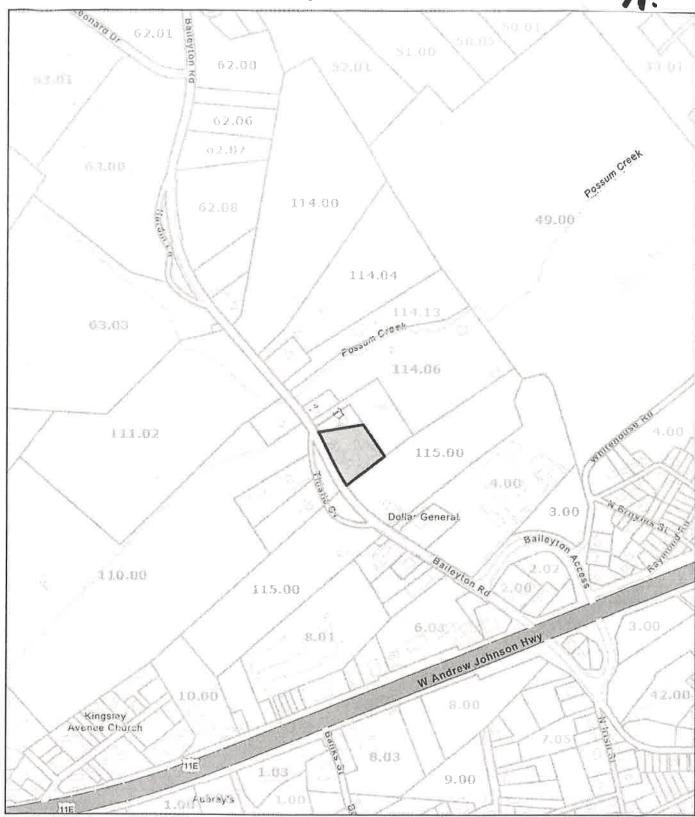

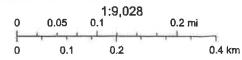

## A RESOLUTION TO ABOLISH THE OFFICE OF CONSTABLE IN GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE (2<sup>nd</sup> Reading)

WHEREAS, the office of Constable was originally established to provide assistance and support to the Sheriff's Office personnel; in particular, in the more rural counties in the State of Tennessee and in situations where officers did not have sufficient resources for backup support when needed; and

WHEREAS, with the overall improvements in the capability, training, staffing, professionalism, and efficiency of the office of Sheriff in Greene County regarding patrol and law enforcement generally, the office of Constable is no longer a necessary component of law enforcement in Greene County; and

WHEREAS, while some of the individuals, both past and present, who hold or have held the position of Constable have performed admirably, the required training to hold the elective office of Constable as well as the physical demands of the office has not kept pace with the initial and continuing training now required of post certified officers with the Greene County Sheriff's Department, which in many instances may pose an increased risk of liability for Greene County; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee through the enactment of Chapter 344 of the Public Acts of 1997, codified at *Tennessee Code Annotated*, Section 8-10-101(a)(3) authorized the county legislative body to abolish the office of Constable at the end of the term of current officeholders upon two-thirds (2/3) majority vote in two (2) consecutive meetings; and

WHEREAS, many counties in the State of Tennessee have either abolished the office of Constable or in the alternative removed their law enforcement powers in an attempt to limit the liability risks associated with the persons who hold that office; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Legislative Body on October 20, 2025, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority voted on first reading to abolish the office of Constable in Greene County at the end of the term of current officeholders.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session (being the next consecutive session of the legislative body) on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2025, a quorum being present and a two-thirds (2/3) majority voting in the affirmative that the office of Constable in Greene County, Tennessee is hereby abolished effective at the end of the current term of office of the current holders of the office of Constable in Greene County, Tennessee.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the County Clerk shall send a copy of this resolution to the current holders of the office of Constable and to the County Election Commission for Greene County.
