WHEREAS, Rheatown grew into a thriving town with the establishment of a post office in 1823 and was officially incorporated in 1856, named in honor of Congressman John Rhea, whose legacy lives on in the community's name; and

WHEREAS, the original Rheatown Church, dating back to 1886, is one of the most recognized landmarks of this historic community. Built with logs and weatherboarding donated by local residents, heating was provided by a large central stove, and lighting came from kerosene lamps. Today, the church remains a beacon of faith and hope, reminding us of the deeper meaning of the season; that peace, goodwill, and compassion for all; like faith is strong and timeless; and

WHEREAS, the annual Rheatown Christmas Tree Lighting, reestablished by the new young entrepreneur and Rheatown Store owner, Avery Armstrong, serves as a joyful kickoff to the holiday season, bringing together families, friends, and neighbors to celebrate with music, lights, and the warmth of community spirit; and

WHEREAS, the contributions of local musicians, artisans, and volunteers during this festive occasion reflect the heart and soul of Rheatown and Greene County, where history and holiday cheer come together in harmony; and

WHEREAS, as we join together beneath the glow of Christmas lights and the spirit of fellowship, we are reminded that this season is not merely a time of celebration, but a sacred opportunity to reflect, to renew, and to rejoice. It is a time to embrace one another with grace, to extend kindness without condition, and to see each other as God sees us, worthy of love; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kevin C. Morrison, Mayor of Greene County, by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim recognition and heartfelt appreciation for the

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, human trafficking occurs when a person is recruited, enticed, harbored, transported, provided, purchased, or obtained through force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose performing labor or providing services (labor trafficking) or engaging in commercial sex acts (sex trafficking); and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately 27.6 million people are trafficked around the world and as many as 2,100 in East Tennessee alone; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking erodes personal safety, dignity, and liberty as well as the health and safety of communities at large; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking does not discriminate based on age, sex, race, color, or national origin, but is, however, grounded in the inequitable conditions of relationships and society and disproportionately affects vulnerable individuals and marginalized communities; and

WHEREAS, the need is great to remove the veil of secrecy that allows human trafficking to thrive, disrupt the systems it depends upon to flourish, and mobilize community support around survivors of human trafficking and help them as they seek to recover and rebuild their lives; and

WHEREAS, a unified response by allied professionals, law enforcement, prosecutors, judges, victims service providers, healthcare professionals, volunteers, and others is needed to provide safety, justice, and healing to survivors, hold offenders accountable, and promote the welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Counter-Trafficking Alliance, through the Community Coalition Against Human Trafficking in East Tennessee, exists to educate Tennesseans about the realities and pervasiveness of human trafficking, foster collaborative intervention and prevention efforts, provide comprehensive, trauma-informed aftercare services to survivors, and advocate for more proactive legislation; and

WHEREAS, during Human Trafficking Prevention Month and throughout the year, Greene County is provided an opportunity to celebrate the collaboration and work that has been done while rededicating ourselves to all that is still left to do, to reflect upon and honor the resilience, perseverance, and courage of survivors, and to urge everyone to recognize that we all have an active part to play in protecting the most vulnerable in our communities and ensuring survivors receive the care, support, and services they need;

A motion to add a resolution to appropriate Funds to the Highway Department Fund #131 in the amount of up to \$130,000 to purchase the Single Axle Dump Truck was made by Commissioner Quillen and seconded by Commissioner Smithson. All were in favor.

Greene County would like to appropriate additional funding to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee in the amount of \$20,000 after December 1, 2025 in the event that the federal government has not appropriated funding for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program. Commissioner Quillen made a motion in the event of continuing the government shutdown of Snap after December 1, 2025, to authorize a contribution to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee in the amount of \$20,000. Commissioner Smithson seconded the motion. All agreed.

The next regular scheduled Budget & Finance Committee meeting will be on Wednesday, December 3rd, 8:30 A.M. Held in the Greene County Annex Conference Room, Greeneville, Tennessee.

Call to Order:

Mayor Morrison called meeting to order in the conference room at the Greene County Annex. Quorum was present.

Minutes:

Motion was made by Commissioner Dabbs and was seconded by County School Director Malone to approve the minutes from September 24, 2025. Motion was approved with no opposition.

Reports:

Clinic – Leslie Jones gave the clinic reports for September 2025. There were 301 patients. Of the 301 visits, there were 146 provider visits and 155 nurse visits. There were 7 no shows and only 2 of those were provider visits. Leslie stated there were 62 biometric physicals. Leslie stated they are seeing a lot of flu patients. Attorney Woolsey asked Leslie if they've had any complaints and she said no.

A motion to approve the clinic reports was made by Attorney Woolsey. Motion was seconded by Danny Lowery, Budget Director. Reports were approved with no opposition.

Financial - Danny Lowery emailed the financial reports for September 2025 to the Insurance Committee on October 17, 2025. Danny stated there was nothing special and seems like workers comp, self-insurance and liability are still holding pretty strong. Danny stated we received the roof repair materials for the transfer station and that work will start tomorrow. Danny stated as far as employee health insurance we are at level for last year as far as cash. Danny stated that claims were extremely high for September.

Discussion:

Danny stated that the SHARx prescription program started on 10-1 and with the government shut down there were some issues but SHARx has been very proactive in letting us know and notifying us that they have been doing some work arounds about getting medications and getting people signed up. Danae Powers with the Baldwin Group also added that with the tariffs and delays they were dealing with at SHARx, none of those affected any Greene County employees which was due to the timing of implementation of the program and SHARx is not expecting any issues with our

employees but it was just a forewarning for people who were implemented earlier on. Leslie stated she has had a number of phone calls asking if the new SHARx prescription program is going to cover the GLP-1's, to which she told them, no. Commissioner Peters asked about all the commercials seen on T.V. with Wegovy, etc., are all of those GLP-1's? Leslie stated yes most of them are. Commissioner Dabbs then asked about a substance that is supposed to be dropped into water and will do the same thing as the GLP-1's but Leslie stated she didn't know anything about that. Commissioner Peters then asked if we offer any of those GLP-1's mentioned and Leslie stated no, not through insurance for weight loss, but they can be prescribed for diabetics, with prior authorization. Leslie stated that the clinic offers GLP-1's but insurance does not pay for it, it is paid by the employee at a discounted rate. Mayor Morrison then mentioned that there is certain criteria that has to be met by the employee to be able to get the GLP-1 through the clinic. Leslie stated that the clinic's criteria is even more strict than the criteria to get it straight from Eli Lilly. Leslie stated that we have 6 or 7 people on the GLP-1's right now. Danny stated that Leslie and others worked extremely hard on finding another supplier for the GLP-1's that the employees buy and they now have that up and going and is about \$300.00 cheaper for each patient. Leslie stated everything is ready for the Greene County Schools physicals, screenings, etc.

A motion to approve the financial reports was made by Sheriff Holt. Motion was seconded by County School Director Malone. Reports were approved with no opposition.

Other Business.

Sheriff Holt talked with the committee about vehicle insurance coverage. Sheriff Holt had to take a rollback to pick up military equipment at Baileyton because currently, they no longer have a police chief that is certified in Tennessee. The State called the Sheriff and advised him that he needed to take possession of that equipment. Sheriff questioned John McInturff whether we would be covered on the equipment being hauled on the rollback. Sheriff said he called Amanda (with MM&B) and she said that equipment would not be covered. John stated liability would be covered however the vehicle itself would not be covered. John stated a lot of that military equipment is not being covered for physical damage anyway because it was free. Sheriff Holt's next question was concerning his purchase of another maintenance truck from a military base and it being in good shape and driving it back, would we be covered and Sheriff stated Amanda, said no, because it is not on the vehicle insurance. John asked how big the truck was and if it was over 26k pounds and Sheriff Holt said yes. John stated we would probably need to insure that one. John told Sheriff Holt when he picked up the truck to send the basic information (take a picture, year, make, model and VIN) to him or Amanda and they would take care of it. The truck will probably need full coverage.

Commissioner Peters asked how things were progressing as far as comparison billing for the clinic? Leslie stated that she received information from medical records and she sent that information to BCBS and got that back and then sent back to medical records and now waiting on them. Leslie stated they are looking at January 1st for completion.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and welcomed attendees.

Approval of Minutes. The Chairman asked if members had received the draft minutes of the September 9, 2025, meeting. A motion was made by Gary Rector, seconded by Edwin Remine, to approve the minutes as written. The motion carried unanimously.

<u>Seaton 6.51 Acre Property Partition</u>. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered approving the Seaton 6.51 Acre Property Partition for five lots totaling 6.51 acres, located at the intersection of Dodd Branch and Cedar Creek Road in the 18th civil district. Staff stated that all signatures had been obtained and, as the plat met all applicable regulations, recommended approval. A motion was made by Lyle Parton, seconded by Edwin Remine, to approve the plat, as it met all applicable regulations. The motion carried unanimously.

Baileyton Road (tax parcel 086-114.11) rezoning request. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered recommending rezoning property located on the east side of Baileyton Road (S.R. 172), from B-1, Neighborhood Business District, to B-2 General Business District. Tim Tweed stated the proposal was to rezone the property to allow for the establishment of a Halloween store and Haunted Hill in the Woods. The vacant site, which adjoined property in the Town of Greeneville zoned B-4, Arterial Business District, was in an area with a mix of industrial and commercial uses, with a single family use adjoining the property. Lyn Ashburn stated that she had a concern about the adequacy of sight distance for the proposed driveway. Keven Swatsell verified that the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) would evaluate sight distance before issuing a driveway permit, as the site would be accessed from a state highway.

The Planning Commission was provided with a memorandum that listed four policies that related to the proposed zoning:

- "Commercial development should be designed so as to minimize potential negative impacts to the existing transportation system." While sight distance was a concern, the traffic network was capable of handling the volume of traffic anticipated to be generated by the proposed use.
- "Clustering of commercial developments should be encouraged, with controlled entrance and exit points." While there were no other commercial uses present at this time, any future commercial development would benefit from clustering with limited access points.
- "Commercial uses which are high intensity traffic generators should be located on major collector or arterial roads." The proposed use would not create a lot of traffic, and it would front on Baileyton Road (arterial road).
- "Commercial developments should be designed so as to minimize negative impacts to residential developments via planted buffers and/or berms in order to enhance the aesthetics and property values of such developments." There was a concern about the potential impact of outdoor activities on the adjoining residential uses. Most of the uses in the immediate area were single family residences, with five homes located in front of, behind, and immediately adjacent to the property. Given the zoning, transportation network, and land uses in the area, however, it was unlikely that this property would be developed for single family use.

The existing zoning designation of B-1, Neighborhood Business District, is appropriate for the property. It allows for commercial development, but of a type of that is not intended to bring traffic into an area. The proposed use of a Halloween store/haunted hills facility will likely draw people from a wide area, resulting in increased traffic over what would likely be seen with a standard B-1 use. While part of the property would be developed traditionally, i.e., a commercial use located within a building, part of the site was intended for outdoor use. It is this use which has the greatest opportunity to impact neighbors, especially after dark.

Lyn Ashburn stated the request had merit, in that the proposed use might not impact adjoining residential uses more than a gas station (permitted in the B-1) would create. Also, the sight distance issue could well be alleviated by removing part of the bank and cutting back trees on the property. In addition, if the property were to be annexed by the Town of Greeneville, it would likely be zoned B-4, Arterial Business District, the most intensive commercial use the Town had. This conclusion was based on the fact that other properties adjoining Baileyton Road that had already been annexed were zoned B-4.

Because of concerns over sight distance and impact to the adjoining residential use, however, Lyn Ashburn recommended that the rezoning request be denied, based on the following rationale:

- 1. Staff did not believe that minimum safe sight distance standards could be met under the existing conditions;
- 2. While the adjoining residential use was zoned B-1, it was still used as a single family home, and the outdoor component of the proposed use (haunted hill/woods), would likely have more of an impact on the residence than a traditional store.
- 3. There were other properties in the area better suited for commercial use, which did not have sight distance concerns.

Laurie Smith, owner of the property proposed to be zoned, stated the closest residential neighbor stated their interest in being part of the "Haunted Hill", and did not oppose the request. They stated that their current store, located in the East Gate Shopping Center, was not large enough to suit their purposes, and that moving would enable them to offer the "Haunted Hill".

Discussion ensued about the potential traffic generation of the proposed use, its impact on surrounding residential uses, the most appropriate use of the property, and verification that TDOT would ensure that adequate sight distance could be provided prior to issuing a driveway permit. A motion was made by Nick Gunter, seconded by Lyle Parton, to recommend rezoning the property based on the discussion (the property would likely be zoned for a high impact commercial use if annexed; TDOT would ensure adequate sight distance before issuing a driveway permit; the closest residential use was not opposed to the rezoning; and the applicable policies of the Greene County Land Use and Transportation Policy Plan could be met. The motion carried unanimously.

Proposed revision to the Greene County Subdivision Regulations Appendix D. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered revising the Greene County Subdivision Regulations, specifically Appendix D. Approval of Subdivision Lots with Existing Septic Systems. Amy Tweed stated a recommendation for Appendix D that was approved at the September 2025 meeting that had been developed using a transcript of the July work session with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDEC). Following the Planning Commission meeting staff provided the TDEC representative with a copy of the adopted changes. At this point the representative stated they had misspoken at the work session, and what was adopted in September 2025 was incorrect.

Amy Tweed provided an updated recommendation, which outlined six situations and the requirements for each. The format of the proposal had been created at the request of surveyors, who wanted examples of how each situation would be handled.

- Situation 1: Combination of two or more lots, with an existing septic system.
- Situation 2: Combination of two or more lots, without an existing septic system.
- Situation 3: Division of Property into 2 or more lots with an existing septic system with a Certificate of Completion (C.O.C.).
- Situation 4: Division of Property into 2 or more lots with an existing septic system but the C.O.C. can't be found or is incomplete.
- Situation 5: The remainder of the property contains less than five (5) acres.
- Situation 6. Adding previously unsubdivided property to an adjoining tract.

Discussion ensued concerning the proposal. Surveyors requested that the Certificate of Verification, which had been used for several years, be resurrected, but staff stated TDEC would no longer accept the certification. After discussion Amy Tweed proposed that situations 2-6 be eliminated, and only Situation 1 be adopted, as follows:

REQUIREMENTS FOR COMBINING LOTS WITH AN EXISTING SEPTIC SYSTEMS Greene County, TN Regional Planning Commission

- 1. Obtain a copy of the Certificate of Completion (C.O.C.) for the existing septic system by:
 - Printing a copy from the website for the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation,
 Water Resources, Division of Groundwater Protection (TDEC): https://tdec.tn.gov/filenetsearch; or
 - Request by phone: 423-854-5400; or
 - Request by email: septicsystem.files@tn.gov

If the C.O.C. cannot be found, or if it doesn't show duplication area for the septic system:

- The property owner hires a soil scientist to perform soil mapping for the duplication area.
- The soil map, along with a Subdivision Evaluation Application, is submitted to TDEC.
- Apply to TDEC for an inspection letter.
- 2. The surveyor shall show a copy of the C.O.C. on the plat. If the C.O.C. is missing or lacks duplication area:
 - A copy of the TDEC inspection letter, existing septic tank and field lines shall be shown on the plat.
 - TDEC's "Certificate of Approval of On-site sewage disposal systems" shall also be added to the plat.

3. Add note:

Notice to Buyer regarding Subsurface Sewage Disposal System (Buyer Beware): The Division of Groundwater Protection has not evaluated Lot #, pursuant this plat review, for subsurface sewage disposal system, and plat approval does not constitute approval of the combination plat. Lots shall be large enough to construct the original subsurface sewage disposal system and to provide an area for duplication of that system. The area for both original and duplicate systems shall meet the Rules & Regulations of the State of Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Division of Groundwater Protection. Evaluation and Lot Design may require an Extra High Intensity Soil Map and/or a percolation test. Additional land may be required if deemed necessary.

The Greene County Regional Planning Commission makes no certification or guarantees as to the viability of the existing septic system, or the location of the field lines.

4. Add certificate:

Certificate of Existing Septic System by Owner(s) – Buyer Beware: I (we), owners of the property, hereby certify that Lot _#_contain(s) an existing working septic system, verify and acknowledge that the septic system is in good working order, and all field lines and duplicate area(s) associated with each system are contained entirely within each lot(s) as described as part of the plan of subdivision. I (we) hereby state that no evaluation, testing, or verification of the functionality of the septic system or adequate area for duplication has been completed by the Division of Groundwater Protection of the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation. I (we) encourage any purchaser of this lot to verify continued viability of the existing septic system for the property prior to purchase.

If the owner chooses to not sign the certificate, a subdivision evaluation by TDEC will be required as follows:

A motion was made by Nick Gunter, seconded by Lyle Parton, to revise Appendix D to reflect that only Situation 1 was adopted. The motion carried unanimously.

Proposed revision to the Greene County Subdivision Regulations Article VI. The Planning Commission reviewed and considered revising the Greene County Subdivision Regulations, specifically Article VI. Boundary Retracements and Land Division Surveys. Lyn Ashburn stated that the initial intent in creating regulations for boundary surveys was to assist both the Register of Deeds office and surveyors, even though Planning Commissions did not have jurisdiction over boundary surveys. As comments had been received opposing the proposal, staff withdrew the proposed changes and recommended that the boundary survey standards that had been approved in March 2025 be deleted from the Subdivision Regulations. A motion was made by Lyle Parton, seconded by Phillip Ottinger, to remove the changes approved in March 2025 from the Subdivision Regulations. The motion carried unanimously.

Meeting Minutes from June 5, 2025

Greene County Courthouse Courtroom, Greeneville, TN

CALL TO ORDER:

Mayor Morrison called the meeting to order at 3:00 pm in the top floor criminal courtroom. The five County Commissioners appointed by the Mayor to serve on the Committee were introduced. Nick Gunter, Brad Peters, Jan Kiker, Tim Smithson and Teddy Lawing attended their first meeting.

Having now formed as a committee, election of a Chairman (Brad Peters), Vice Chair (Nick Gunter) and Secretary (Jan Kiker) was done so by acclimation.

DISCUSSION:

Mayor Kevin Morrison updated the Committee, especially the new members on the history of discussions related to the courthouse since the sewer issue was first noticed eighteen months ago. He said," The purpose of this meeting is just to show exactly what we did, and to brief the five commissioners that we put on this committee with the options number, one with the conditions of this building, and the options that lie before us in trying to solve that issue.

The mayor said, "There is a myriad of options available to us. Many of those are very expensive. Some are less expensive. And then there's always the option to do what's been done in the last 60 years and do nothing. I personally don't feel that that is an option. Our job, our responsibility is to solve problems. And we've known that this has been a problem for a long time."

Four options to the current challenges at the Greene County Courthouse, which include unbearable sewer odors, water pressure that is not optimal throughout the building, asbestos found in the building, and no survey for the property were presented:

- A bank of new restrooms and a modest storage area to be located on side of the existing courthouse- would take about eight months at a cost of somewhere near two million.
- Relocate to a totally new courthouse facility- (For cost comparisons, Sullivan County spend was \$200 million, and Hamblen County spend was \$1.5 million)
- Renovate existing bathrooms at a cost of \$5 to \$6 million with a timeline of 2 years. This
 option of renovating the restrooms would require executive potty trailers around the
 building. The estimated cost for that would be around \$15,000 a month for the expected
 two-year renovation.

Relocate to the building next door- the old First National Bank Building

It was also noted that work can be done safely in the courthouse if we don't disturb the asbestos. Air quality testing that was recently completed showed it the air in the building was completely safe.

Dave Wright said the \$500,000 Courthouse Renovation Grant we were awarded could not specifically be applied to the cost of the bathroom renovation but could be used on other projects within the courthouse.

Teddy Lawing asked if the grant monies could be used to become more ADA compliant. Mayor Morrison is recommending the \$500,000 Courthouse Renovation Grant be spent largely on updates to the main entrance facade, which is in need of structural upgrades.

Mayor Morrison stated the most likely scenario for construction costs would come out of capital projects. Whatever solution we do decide on he says, it needs to be specifically and unequivocally stated will be done so without raising taxes.

Tim Tweed said we would need to do a core sampling on the property around the courthouse to study the composition, structure, and history of a material beneath the surface without disturbing it entirely. A motion was made by Nick Gunter for the mayor to move forward with the core drilling, seconded by Teddy Lawing, and carried unanimously.

Roger Woolsey is to do a title search on the property to assist in identifying the easements, which will need to be done before the core samples can be taken for analysis.

Tim Smithson brought up the option of utilizing the County Government Annex building for the Courthouse. Charles Morelock reminded everyone that security would be so challenging in that facility that it would not be a viable location.

Nick Gunner asked about the numbers of prisoners in the Justice Center. Chief David Beverly said they could not predict the numbers of prisoners over the next few years. The number is growing because we have an influx of people moving here (approx. 5000), which normally translates to more arrests/prisoners.

The next meeting will be held once the core sample analysis is returned to the mayor.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jan Kiker and seconded by Tim Smithson. Meeting adjourned.

Chairman Crawford called the meeting to order.

A motion to approve the minutes from May 8, 2025 was made by Commissioner Quillen and seconded by Council Member Kidwell and were approved unanimously.

I. EMS Staffing

Director Manis discussed the current staffing situation. There are 45 field positions with 39 staffed for the Emergency ALS division and 8 staffed for the convalescent division. Two new positions were added to the convalescent side with the new budget for 2025-2026. Currently, the Emergency division is fully staffed, and there are three open positions with the convalescent division. There are currently three candidates in the prehire process and possibly five other potential employees seeking full time. There are several part-time employees as well.

II. Ambulances Fleet Update

Director Manis noted there are currently 11 ambulances that are licensed and 10 ambulances that are in daily use. He noted again that several of the current fleet of ambulances that have excess mileage and that there are currently 8 ambulances on order. He stated that it was possible to have the ambulance from the May accident in possibly 45 days. He also stated that the three convalescent vans are set to be available soon, and that he is hopeful that the first type A ambulances ordered previously might be here by the end of the year.

III. EMS Budget

Director Manis explained that when the 2025-2026 EMS budget passed it included the two new positions. There are now 4 twelve-hour ambulances that work during the week. Two of these ambulances are staffed with a BLS crew, and two ambulances are staffed with an ALS crew. He noted that the ALS crews have really been helping to take some of the workload off the 24-hour ALS ambulance crews.

IV. Q2 Survey Results

Director Manis noted that Assistant Director Hughes had been working diligently on a quarterly survey with the field staff since assuming his new position. He noted that these results have also been shared with Human Resources and Mayor Morrison.

V. New Pediatric Treatment Bags

Director Manis demonstrated the new pediatric treatment bags that have been purchased, and how they will benefit the community greatly.

VI. EMT Class

The EMT Basic class is set to begin on August 19th and will end tentatively on October 30th. There are currently 6 Basic EMTs that are interested in an Advanced EMT Class.

VII. Other Business

Director Manis also noted that they are still in preliminary phase for the blood, ultrasound, and trauma gel programs. They are also looking for grants to offset the cost of these items.

He also noted that there are currently five employees in the paramedic program and two employees in the advanced program. He noted that the tuition reimbursement is exhausted for this year, and that there is a contract retainer with the tuition reimbursement program.

Manis also noted that the EMS has been heavily engaged in covering different public events and will continue to do so including football season coming up.

VIII. Next Steps for EMS Board

The next scheduled meeting will be Thursday, November 13, 2025 at 3:00 pm at the Greene County Government Offices at 401 Takoma Ave.

Commissioner Quillen made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Council Member Kidwell.

WHEREAS, various departments and agencies of Greene County Government from time to time have personal property that has become surplus, obsolete, or unusable; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to T.C.A.§ 5-14-108, upon request of the office holder or department head to the Greene County Legislative Body to declare specific personal property as surplus, the Legislative Body by resolution at a regularly scheduled meeting, shall if appropriate, declare said property as surplus which in turn authorizes the County Purchasing Director to sell said surplus property by public auction (including internet auction) or by sealed bids.

WHEREAS, the Greene County Road Superintendent has determined that certain property of the Greene County Highway Department is no longer needed by the department, said being surplus, obsolete, or unusable by the Department and has requested that the property attached to this resolution as Exhibit "A" be declared surplus property; and

WHEREAS, after consideration of the request from the department head to have the two items of personal property identified in the attached lists be declared surplus, the Greene County Legislative Body finds that it is in the best interests of the County and its citizens to declare those items of personal property surplus; to be sold by the Purchasing Director as provided in T.C.A. § 5-14-108 and pursuant to the established policies and procedures for the sale and/or disposition of County owned property, the intent being that the Legislative Body will, at a future commission

meeting, in most instances would authorize the proceeds received from the sale of each item of personal property retuned to the department requesting that the items be sold.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 15th day of December, 2025, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that the listed personal property shown on the attached Exhibit, "A", be declared surplus property pursuant to T.C.A. 5-14-108 to be sold by the Greene County Purchasing Director as mandated by statute.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 15th day of December, 2025, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, that the school bus owned by the Greeneville/Greene County EMS is declared surplus.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A LEASE AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE AND THE GREENEVILLE-GREENE COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT (9-1-1)

WHEREAS, the Greene County Building, Zoning, and Planning Department previously occupied a portion of the old Health Department building at 129 Charles Street, Greeneville, Tennessee on a certain parcel of real estate owned by Greene County with the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District occupying the remainder of the building; and

WHEREAS, the Greene County Building, Zoning, and Planning Department has relocated to its new offices in the Greene County Administrative Center; and

WHEREAS, a building addition on the above referenced property was constructed adjoining the existing building, which addition was paid for by the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District (9-1-1); and

WHEREAS, the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District is a separate legal entity from the County, but does receive funding from the County and from all municipalities located in the County; and

WHEREAS, the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District provides invaluable services to the citizens of Greene County and the governmental entities in receiving and dispatching emergency and non-emergency calls for law enforcement, fire, and medical services; and

WHEREAS, it would appear that it would be in the best interests of the citizens and residents of Greene County for a written agreement to be approved by Greene County and the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District that would permit the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communication District to lease and occupy the entire

building above described to better facilitate its continued operations in serving the citizens of Greene County and the other governmental entities it presently serves; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the proposed Lease Agreement (a copy of said Lease Agreement is attached as Exhibit "A" to this Resolution); it would appear to be in the best interests of Greene County and the citizens of Greene County to enter into said Lease Agreement which would permit the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communications District to lease the entire former Health Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Legislative Body meeting in regular session on the 15th day of December, 2025, a quorum being present and a majority voting in the affirmative, to authorize the County Mayor to enter into a Lease Agreement with the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communications District (9-1-1) to allow the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communications District to occupy and utilize the entire old Health Department building for its operations as specified in the proposed Lease Agreement attached Agreement as Exhibit "A".

LEASE AGREEMENT

This lease agreement entered into on this the ______ day of December, 2025, by and between GREENE COUNTY, TENNESSEE, party of the First Part, hereinafter referred to as the "Lessor", and the GREENEVILLE-GREENE COUNTY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS DISTRICT, party of the Second Part, hereinafter referred to as the "Lessee".

WHEREAS, the Lessor owns a certain parcel of real estate located at 129 Charles Street, Greeneville, Greene County, Tennessee, further identified as being Map 098K, Parcel 011.00 upon which a building is situated presently. A portion of the building is presently occupied by the Lessee pursuant to a lease agreement and previously the remainder of the building was occupied by the Greene County Building and Zoning Department. The Greene County Building and Zoning Department has relocated into its new offices at the Greene County Administrative Center and Lessee is desirous of leasing the entire building to utilize same along with the addition that Lessee built that houses the dispatchers.

WHEREAS, Lessee is requesting to lease, and Lessor is willing to lease the abovedescribed premises to the Lessee upon the terms and conditions hereinafter provided.

The initial term of this lease shall be five (5) years, commencing on the 1st of December, 2025, and ending on the 31st day of November, 2030. This Lease shall automatically be renewed for additional terms of five (5) years under the same terms and conditions as the original lease unless written notice is given to the other party of the intent to terminate the lease. The written termination of the lease must be provided at least 180 days before the expiration of the original term or any subsequent term of the lease. Lessee agrees

The said lease payment shall be due on the day of the signing of this lease agreement and each year thereafter. For the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar per year, it is agreed that the Greeneville-Greene County Emergency Communications District, commonly known as 9-1-1, will have the full use of the entire building The above-described leased premises shall be used for the housing of a 9-1-1 emergency response system to serve Greeneville and Greene County, Tennessee, and all governmental entities therein and Lessee warrants and agrees that the leased premises will not be used for any other purpose without the express written consent of the Lessor.

It is further agreed that the Lessee will be responsible for all maintenance and repairs to the leased premises and that same will be maintained in a reasonable state of repair, normal wear and tear, excepted. Further, Lessee shall be solely responsible for all utilities (water, electricity, etc.) for the leased premises and any other expenses (such as pest control, garbage pickup, etc.) that may be incurred related to the utilization of the leased premises by the Lessee.

With regard to the leased premises described above, the Lessee will provide property and casualty insurance coverage for the leased premises including the equipment and furniture. Lessee shall also provide liability insurance for the leased premises with coverage of at least ONE MILLION (\$1,000,000.00) DOLLARS and shall name Greene County as an additional insured under the policy. Lessee further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Lessor from any claim or cause of action arising from its operations and/or its usage of the leased premises.

Resolution of the Greene County Commission Encouraging Federal and State Legislative Action to Expand the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery

WHEREAS, Greene County, Tennessee, is the proud home of the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery, a site of profound historical significance and the final resting place of the 17th President of the United States, Andrew Johnson; and

WHEREAS, the cemetery also serves as a sacred burial ground for veterans who have honorably served in the Armed Forces of the United States, reflecting Greene County's enduring commitment to honoring military service and preserving national heritage; and

WHEREAS, following Andrew Johnson's burial on Signal Hill in 1875, Congress formally designated the site as a United States National Cemetery in 1906. In 1942, the cemetery was incorporated into the Andrew Johnson National Monument, and the National Park Service (NPS) was entrusted with its stewardship, including the maintenance of the grounds and the administration of veterans' burials; and

WHEREAS, the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery has been closed for new burials since 2019, and without expansion, Greene County veterans and their families will continue to be denied burial in this historic and federally maintained site; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of the cemetery would not only ensure continued access for future generations of veterans but also enhance the preservation of Greene County's historical legacy and promote civic pride and tourism; and

WHEREAS, such expansion would require congressional legislation, or Presidential Executive Order to authorize the acquisition of adjacent land and appropriate funding for development and maintenance under the jurisdiction of the National Park Service;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Greene County Commission, meeting in regular session on this 15th day of December, 2025, that:

- 1. The Commission formally urges the United States Congress and the Tennessee General Assembly to support and pass legislation authorizing the expansion of the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery or procure an executive order by the President for same.
- 2. The Commission respectfully requests that Greene County's federal and state representatives sponsor and advocate for such legislation, recognizing the importance of preserving this national treasure and honoring the service of our veterans.
- 3. Copies of this resolution shall be transmitted to the offices of the President of the United States, the Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the National Park Service, the Tennessee Congressional Delegation, and the Tennessee General Assembly.
